portion of the program disappears when the program is run! I have tried every combination of HIMEM and LOMEM settings. The program has only 267 lines, and still has 27k of memory left on loading. I have written much larger programs without this problem occurring.

If programmers can get together we could write many worthwhile programs, and as our contribution to the club they could be copyright of APPLE-Q Inc. and distributed at a nominal fee to swell the coffers.

I live too far away to be of much use as a committee member, and I cannot attend every month. Maybe I can be more useful when I can afford a modem. Our committee does a wonderful job and deserves our vote of thanks.

APPLE-Q Inc. has purchased such a warranty for its computer, as a guarantee against further break-downs. The BBS has suffered 8. few mishaps, motherboard decided to quit a few months ago, and just last month the power-supply decided to give up the time we Well this ghost. Applecare, when the trouble started (again). So we sent it back, this time knowing that it would not cost the club a single cent for the repairs. It turned out to be the motherboard again, as well as the power-supply. Do you know how much an exchange ? It's around motherboard costs \$260.00 these days. A power-supply about \$180.00. For that initial \$96.00 we were able to take it back without the horrible thought of a massive repair bill, which would have had to come out of club funds.

[Problem Corner]

At the last meeting, some members complained that their clock cards were displaying the wrong day of the week with most of their software. It would appear that most software calculates the day of the week, instead of reading the day from the appropriate memory location. This was particularly noticeable in Appleworks. I tried many other programs that utilize clocks, and found that they all had the same problem of determining the correct date. It would appear that 1988 is going to cause some people a lot of headaches, especially with regards to clock routines for their computers.

I have two clocks in my Apple //e. The first one is not truly ProDOS compatible, and a special clock driver needs to be installed before it will ProDOS. I recently under purchased a 'No-slot Clock', which plugs in under the F8 ROM, and therefore does not take up a valuable slot. I don't know about you, but I have all my slots full in my Apple, and a card that uses one of these valuable slots. simply takes valuable space, and I need all my slots. The no-slot clock works very well with all my software, both DOS 3.3 and ProDOS. ProDOS requires a patch before it will recognize the clock, and the disk that comes with it, has the utilities necessary to put it to good use.

Here at Apple-Q Inc., we will be selling these nifty little clocks for a mere \$120 plus P&P. We will not be carrying any stocks of these clocks, but we will order them in for anyone who wants one. We have one running in the club's computer on the BBS, and I also have one in my Apple //e, and I recommend them for a person who needs a clock, and doesn't what to use up a valuable slot. Also, they are less than a third of the price of a regular clock card.

If you want to develop your own software and use the clock, you will find it extremely easy to use. I include the clock routines in all my own software, with ease. Under ProDOS, of course, it automatically date stamps your files on the disks.
