

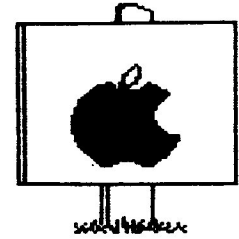

Hi! My name is Darrell Robertson. I'm presently teaching 2nd grade at Middle Grove Elementary School in Salem with 27 students. We have about 165 kids from Kindergarten to 3rd grade. Four Apple II's make up our inventory of computer equipment.

There is a fresh excitement at my school this year. We are one of the recipients of Oregon House Bill 2020 which guarantees special funds for staff development / school improvement with an emphasis on computer training. We have been awarded \$1000 per teacher- a total of \$9800.

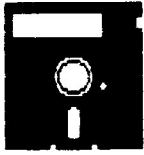

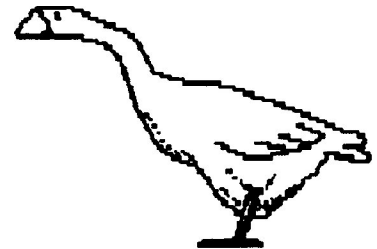

I hope to see quite a few of you at the next meeting as several interesting and important matters will be taken care of.

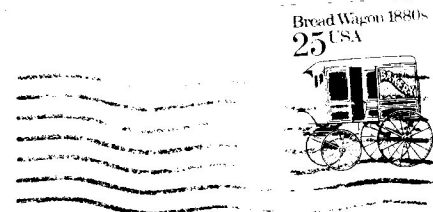
