#### **Editors Notes**

Several things can be done to increase the pleasure of using your computer.

The sound that comes from your standard speaker that is build into the IIGS computer leaves alot to be desired. In order to buy a pair of Boise speakers I would have to mortgage the computer.

I settled for a pair of LABTECH speakers that I found at G. I. Joe for \$18.99. (also available at Target). These speakers have their own amplifier build in, each of the speakers has it's own volume control which is very helpful and each side has a pseudo power boost. The speakers are battery operated, however, they have a provision for a 6-volt adaptor.

I happened to have one laying around and am free from having to buy batteries.

Sure, the sound is not as good as that of the Boise system, but then it's not several hundred dollars.

I also purchased (some time ago) a re-inkable ribbon (brand name Falcon).

I found the cartridge to be of very poor quality and when I tried to re-ink the ribbon it tore. Needless to say, I was very dissapointed with the whole thing. I decided to use the rest of the ink they supplied and re-ink my standard Apple ribbons.

You can use a reversible drill to do this.


Get some re-inking ink, put a phillips head screw driver in your drill, reverse it and slowly have someone put ink on the ribbon as you start the VS drill and hold the ribbon firmly.

Don't over ink as you will get it all over your plastic shield on the Imagewriter, and subsequently on the printhead and your paper.

At first you will have a little uneven print (some dark and some light) but in a while it looks nice and dark as if you just installed a new ribbon.

When I received this disk from Softdisk, I called them immediately to find out if they would make disks with just this kind of clip art. (the picture of the car)

They replied that I would have to purchase thier standard disks. I have seen some of those disks and

#### Who's Who

Rose Schutte Salem, Oregon

Hi, I am Rose Schutte. I teach in the computer lab at St. Joseph School in downtown Salem with 300 + students coming down during the week..

Each child, kindergarten through sixth grade, comes once a week for 20 to 30 minutes. Seventh and Eighth Grade have a longer time for class (approximately 45 to 50 minutes).

In the past Seventh Grade studied some of the history of computers and worked on Basic programming and the Eight Grade worked on Basic programming all year.

During the summer I took a class through PSU, called Making a Computer Application Course for Middle School/Jr. High. I will use that program this year, which will be dealing with Keyboarding, word processing, Data Bases, programming in low and high resolution graphics, turtle graphics, and paint programs such as Print Magic.

The Kindergarten through Sixth Grade classes work with prepared programs covering subject areas such as Math, Reading, and Social Studies. During the last quarter, I usually have the students work on Keyboarding and Basic Programming. I may change some of that program.

We have many different kinds of computers that the students can experience, which include Texas Instruments, IBM, Radio Shack, Atari 1200 XL, Apple IIE, and MacIntosh (students locate states on a U.S. map). Wild West Math for the Apple IIE (it covers grades three through five, but the program can be changed for second and sixth grade to use), MECC disks (I received many new ones during the summer that I haven't had a chance to go through yet).

The students love to use MacPaint to create pictures. They have used MacWrite to type in stories especially at Christmas time. The Kindergarten students have used MacWrite to write the alphabet, their names and words they have learned to spell. They work in pairs so they end up with their partner's name and words along with theirs when their work is printed. The students are excited when they leave the room with their printed copy. The first Grade have Journals that they take turns bringing down to use with MacWrite.

They type in their names and sentences and words that they take from their Journals. They, also, work with partners so that when they have their printed copy they have both their work and their partner's work.

The week before school started I was involved with inservice meetings and getting the computers and printers ready for the students. I have some studying to do to figure out the Word Processor for the IBM's. AS usual, I'll be learning right along with the students as they find new ways to accomplish. I love working along with the smaller groups that we have established ((7-14 students at a time.) I also work with Special Reading.

This last week I found out that there is a new program being developed that will go along with Hypercard and the MacIntosh for students that are having a hard time reading. I am really excited to see the program in a couple of weeks. It sounds like it will go along with my Special Reading classes.
