Message from Maggie

DESKTOP PUBLISHING

Every year a special subject sparks the imagination of the computer industry. This year a major focus is on desktop publishing, which is a significant new way to use microcomputer hardware and software.

Desktop publishing refers to the use of personal computers, page printers, and page-layout software to produce typeset-quality documents at a small fraction of the cost of traditional typesetting.

Until recently, most companies and publishers created typeset documents by employing outside services for typesetting, page layout, and pasteup. Although this process is effective in producing high-quality materials, it is also expensive and time-consuming. The single most important factor in changing the way typeset materials are produced is the advent of laser printing, and the introduction of Apple Computer's LaserWriter in 1985 started the desktop-publishing revolution, even though other laser printers were already available. The LaserWriter was the first low-cost laser printer that contained a powerful built-in computer that used the PostScript page-description language to control the creation of typefaces in a wide variety of styles and fonts. With the power of laser typography accessible to personal computers, suddenly the private domain of typeset-quality publishing opened up to anybody with access to a personal computer, a laser printer, and the appropriate software.

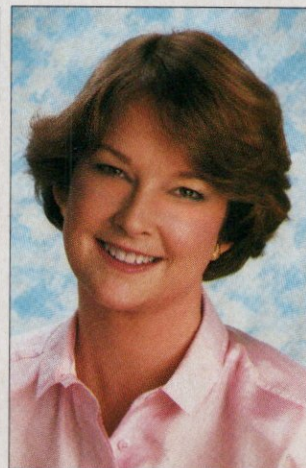
At this point, you may be thinking that there is one large problem with this rosy scenario of publishing becoming the province of personal computers—the Apple II isn't in the picture, because the LaserWriter was built for the Macintosh. Well, we have a pleasant surprise for Apple II owners: The LaserWriter works quite well with the

Apple II series; you just have to know how to tap the hidden resources of PostScript contained inside the LaserWriter.

Keeping up with this desktop-publishing revolution is the subject of this month's cover story. We are proud to bring you the details of how to make your Apple II control the LaserWriter to produce professional-looking typeset materials.

To help prove the validity of using an Apple II and the LaserWriter as a desktop-publishing solution, we had our cover illustrator create this month's cover art with an Apple IIe, a LaserWriter, and the Apple Writer II word-processing program. The cover artist, Don Lancaster, is a pioneer in the computer industry, as well as a champion of the Apple II. Lancaster feels the Apple II should definitely not be overlooked by the desktop-publishing market. As a matter of fact, he ardently believes the Apple II can take better advantage of the LaserWriter than the Macintosh can, since the Macintosh does not make full use of PostScript. You can use the Apple II to program the LaserWriter's powerful built-in PostScript controller and achieve special effects that Macintosh applications don't offer. Don's package of LaserWriter utilities for Apple Writer II proves this point, and Steve Rosenthal includes this software in our cover story.

Since so many Apple IIs are in use in small and medium-size businesses, where desktop publishing will flourish, we predict increasing interest in using the Apple II as part of desktop publishing. This month's article is the first of several we will provide to keep you, your Apple II, and your business up to date in this promising area. +

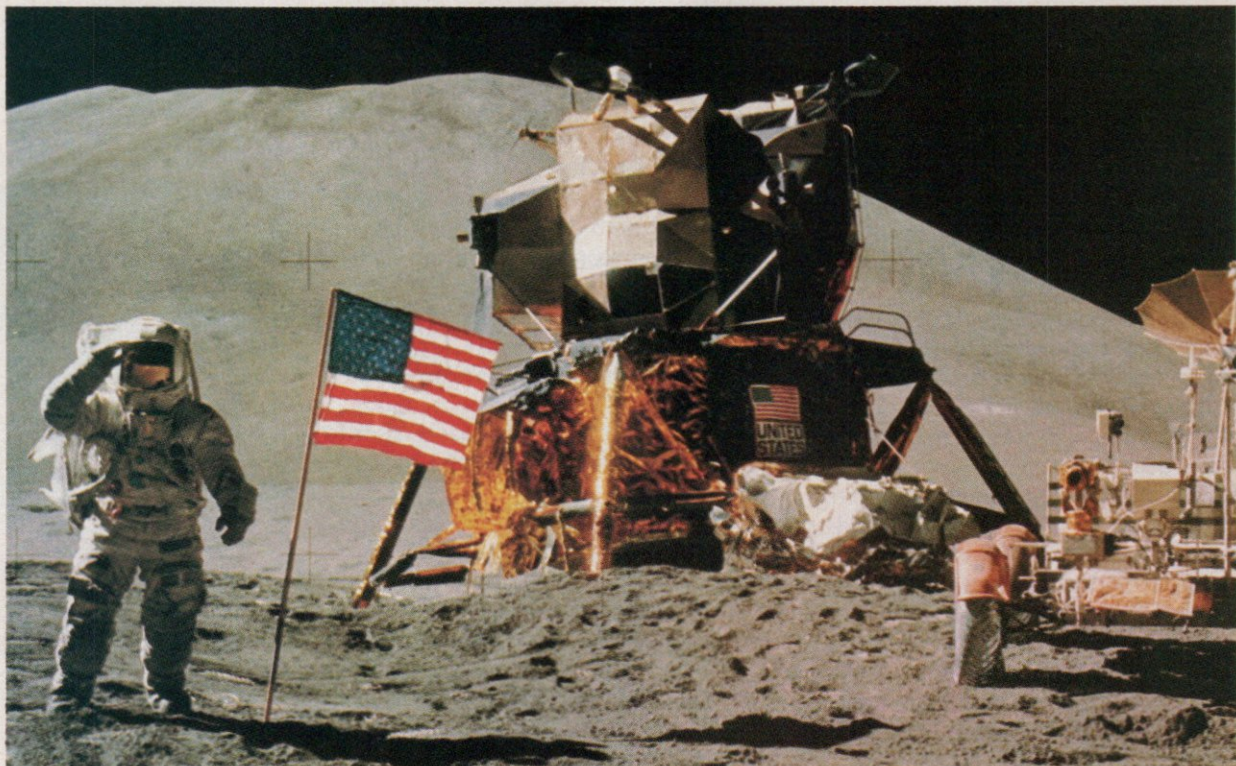

BEYOND BASIC

Dear A+: I was so pleased at David Thornburg's "Learning Curve" column on the shortcomings of Apple-soft BASIC in your February 1986 issue that I was inclined to write you a letter of thanks. Time passed, and I neglected to do so. However, in view of recent criticisms by letter writers Allan Porter and Allan Mahler (April 1986), I feel I must respond.

Mr. Porter says the column was a disservice to your readers. If he feels that the airing of alternative views is a disservice, I suggest he begin lobbying Congress immediately for the repeal of the first amendment. Thornburg stuck to the facts in his article. Every criticism he cited was well founded.

I do not differ with the letter writer on the fact that "the genesis of any computer program is inside the human skull." Indeed, this is where all the great inventions of mankind begin. Given a creative thought, however, available tools must be used to implement that thought. Throughout history, in all professional fields, old tools have often been discarded for new ones that lead to higher quality and productivity. Worldwide, study after study has shown that the use of structured languages, such as Pascal,

lead to more reliable programs and more productive programmers.

As for Mr. Mahler, I'm sorry if his body cannot stand the tremendous physical strain of having to enter TWO WHOLE CHARACTERS for an assignment operator (Pascal's :=). I certainly am glad I do not have to read any of his programs if the number of keystrokes per line is his prime consideration.

The writer is correct about English. It is far from perfect. That is why engineers, mathematicians, musicians, and professionals in countless other fields have all adopted other, more precise, notations for their craft. As the demands of their work increased, the notations they used were often traded for more useful conventions. Why should the profession of computer programming be different?

As for the writer's difficulty in having a Pascal program write to the printer while the program is running, I have had the opportunity to experience both Apple Pascal and Turbo Pascal and have had no such trouble with either.

In Turbo, there is a built-in logical output device (LST) that allows you to do this directly. In Apple Pascal, you need merely to open the printer device (PRINTER:) as an output file. In both cases, this information is readily available in the language manual. One has to wonder how open-minded Mr. Mahler was about Pascal as he allegedly "fought for a few months" with a language frequently taught to college freshmen in a ten-week quarter.

As for criticism of the "experts," they have something that the writer, because of his attitude, will never achieve. They have the experience of working with *many* programming languages. They do not believe Pascal is perfect, any more than they believe BASIC is perfect. Both BASIC and Pascal are merely single steps in the evolution of computer languages. Indeed, Niklaus Wirth, the creator of

Pascal, accepted criticisms of his own language and created a new language (Modula-2) to correct some of its shortcomings. Now *that* is open-minded!

Remember, when it first appeared, BASIC was very "different." Indeed, the B in BASIC stands for *beginners*. Those who wish to continue using beginners' tools should step aside and allow the rest of us to progress to Pascal and beyond!

CD-ROM APPLICATION

Dear A+: I recently read your article entitled "Optical Data Storage" in the April 1986 issue of A+ and found it very interesting. Compact Disc Read-Only Memory (CD-ROM) technology certainly is an innovation in data storage that holds many great possibilities.

The article mentioned that Reference Technology has developed the application of a database covering toxicology and drug interactions. The database you referred to is the Com-

puterized Clinical Information System (CCIS) of Micromedex, Inc. I would like to point out that although Reference Technology assembles the CD-ROMs, the database is actually produced and sold by Micromedex, Inc. of Denver, Colorado.

In 1985, Micromedex, (which had been producing medical databases on microfiche since 1974), became the first company to produce a database using the CD-ROM. The Computerized Clinical Information System of Micromedex includes the Poisindex, Drugdex, Emergindex, and Indentindex databases. The system is currently used by physicians, pharmacists, nurses, and other allied health professionals in hospitals, drug and poison centers, clinics, and physician's offices throughout the world.

Apple's cable specifically matches pin numbers 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 12, 13, 19, 20, and 23 so that you can use it for a variety of peripherals, as the chart indicates. For cable number 590-0335, all the first and second numbers in the pin configuration should be reversed. Also, the Apple III contains a Serial Card III, not a Super Card III.

SONY'S NEW INCREDIBLE MONITOR/TV

Sony has developed a near-flat 41-inch-diagonal Trinitron cathode-ray tube (CRT) with a maximum horizontal resolution of 1861 pixels. Each pixel is composed of a phosphor trio of red, blue, and green dots that can combine to make virtually any color.

Sony says the tube was developed for use in CAD/CAM applications and eventually for the Japanese Hi-Vision HDTV (High Definition TV) system being proposed as a future television standard to give TV pictures many times the picture quality of today's sets. Don't expect to be able to run right out and buy these, though. Sony recently announced

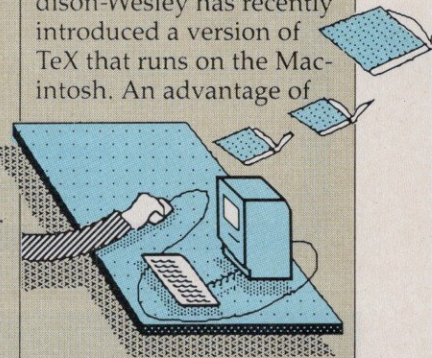
a prototype model of a monitor based on the tube, with a resolution of more than 1000 lines horizontally and more than 750 lines vertically, which is available only to developers for the small sum of about \$40,000 each. Sony officials claim the picture quality is good enough for displaying color slides with barely any loss of quality. Just imagine that monitor on a next-generation color Macintosh. Wow!

DESKTOP PUBLISHING

Desktop publishing, a term coined by Paul Brainerd of Aldus Corporation, is definitely one of the most commonly heard computer buzzwords these days. Many people, including myself, feel that desktop publishing represents a major new use of personal computers. I started exploring the use of personal computers in electronic-publishing systems five years ago, when I used an Apple II to create documents for the computer typesetting of a plant dictionary I was writing, using the TeX typesetting language developed at Stanford University. I inserted the TeX commands into a database

template on the Apple and then telecommunicated the files to a DEC System 20 mainframe for processing.

Times have changed. The TeX typesetting language no longer requires a mainframe; in fact, Addison-Wesley has recently introduced a version of TeX that runs on the Macintosh. An advantage of



TeX over page-layout programs such as PageMaker is that TeX works with ordinary text files from almost any program. You can now create word-processing, database, or other files that contain embedded TeX instructions on your Apple II and transfer them to a Macintosh for typesetting and printing on the LaserWriter or a Linotronic typesetting machine—a good example of how the Mac and the II can work together effectively.

The Apple II is an excellent low-cost data-entry workstation that costs less than some terminals yet offers local disk storage and processing. The Mac, with a megabyte of RAM and a 32-bit processor, is as powerful as the mainframes of yesteryear and can handle complex tasks, such as TeX processing,

SOFTWARE-COMPANY BLUES

Software companies that produce entertainment software for the Macintosh are really singing the blues lately. These poor guys are being hurt from all sides. Marc Canter, president of MacroMind, tells me that Hayden Software is so many months behind on paying his company royalties for hit programs such as MusicWorks, VideoWorks, and CheapPaint that he's unable to keep up with his original plans for creating the next batch of great software and often worries how he'll be able to keep funding his current staff of only six people. And Hayden isn't the only firm that hasn't been paying its bills to software developers lately; First Software, one of the largest software distributors, is in serious financial trouble and owes a lot of money to many starting developers.

To make matters worse, Macintosh owners don't seem to be willing to part with many dollars for entertainment software. Illegal copying of programs is rampant among collegiate Mac users and others who are ordinarily a prime market for entertainment titles. When Charlie Jackson of Silicon Beach Software told me how many

copies of his company's fine Enchanted Scepters adventure game sold last month, I could have cried. And the folks at Electronic Arts tell me that the Apple II is almost always part of their plans for an entertainment product but porting games over to the Mac is a much lower priority. Has Apple finally convinced the world that the Mac really is a business computer?

CHEAPER MULTILAYER BOARDS

West-Tronics of Bensonville, Illinois, recently announced that it has developed a new method of creating multilayer printed circuit boards that cost about 16 to 20 cents per square inch for a four-layer board, which is only half what traditional boards cost. According to West-Tronics, the new boards are cheaper because the company's process eliminates a lot of the traditional etching and laminating of multilayer-board manufacturing.

Entertainment-software producers are being hurt from all sides.

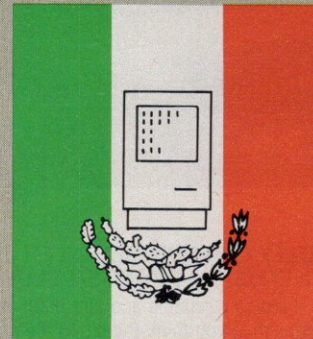
SERVANT

Macintosh wizard Andy Hertzfeld is busy working on a new program tentatively called Servant that is an alternative to the Macintosh Finder. We got a sneak preview of this fascinating program when Andy demonstrated it to the Apple 32'ers users' group this spring. Servant is packed with features yet loads twice as fast as the current HFS and up to five times faster than the old MFS. Servant also permits multiple application windows to be open on the desktop simultaneously.

Andy has slightly deviated from Apple's way of doing things, which has prompted some squawks from Apple people; for example, Andy doesn't like scroll bars except for word processing, so he has chosen to use a hand to move the desktop (similar to the hand in MacPaint). Andy says that if Apple is not interested in Servant, he will find a third-party developer to market it for him.

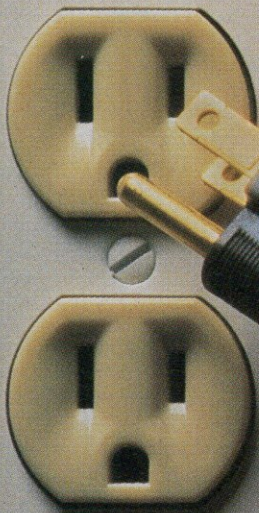
Some of the other features in the preliminary version of Servant are the ability to assign custom-designed icons to folders or to edit other icons; the ability to use any MacPaint document as the background pattern on the desktop; a speech option that speaks the name of any icon or menu choice that you select; movement

of the actual outline of the icon when you drag it—not a simple rectangle as in the current Finder; and the ability to view the name, size, and date of files in conjunction with the full-size icons. Some neat cosmetic touches add a little flair: The hands of the watch spin while you are waiting, and the lid of the trash can flips open when you throw something away. We'll keep you posted as we find out more about Servant.

Apple de Mexico has finally received approval to sell Macs in Mexico and has announced that it is offering Spanish versions of many popular programs, from Excel to PageMaker. Apple has also created a special Apple IIe Turbo System for sale in Latin America. This system is selling well in Mexico, where Apple has an estimated 35% of the personal-computer market.

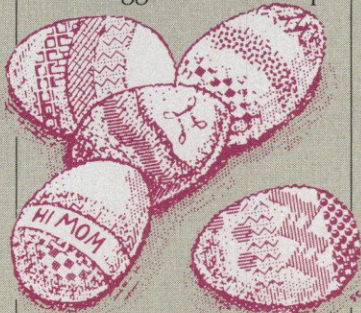

Another from Tyler Bowell: To avoid having to worry about your men in Choplifter! and thereby extend your playing time, start the game by landing beside some men, on their right side, but don't let them get into the chopper; when the men get as close as they can to the chopper, take off and land about halfway across the screen. 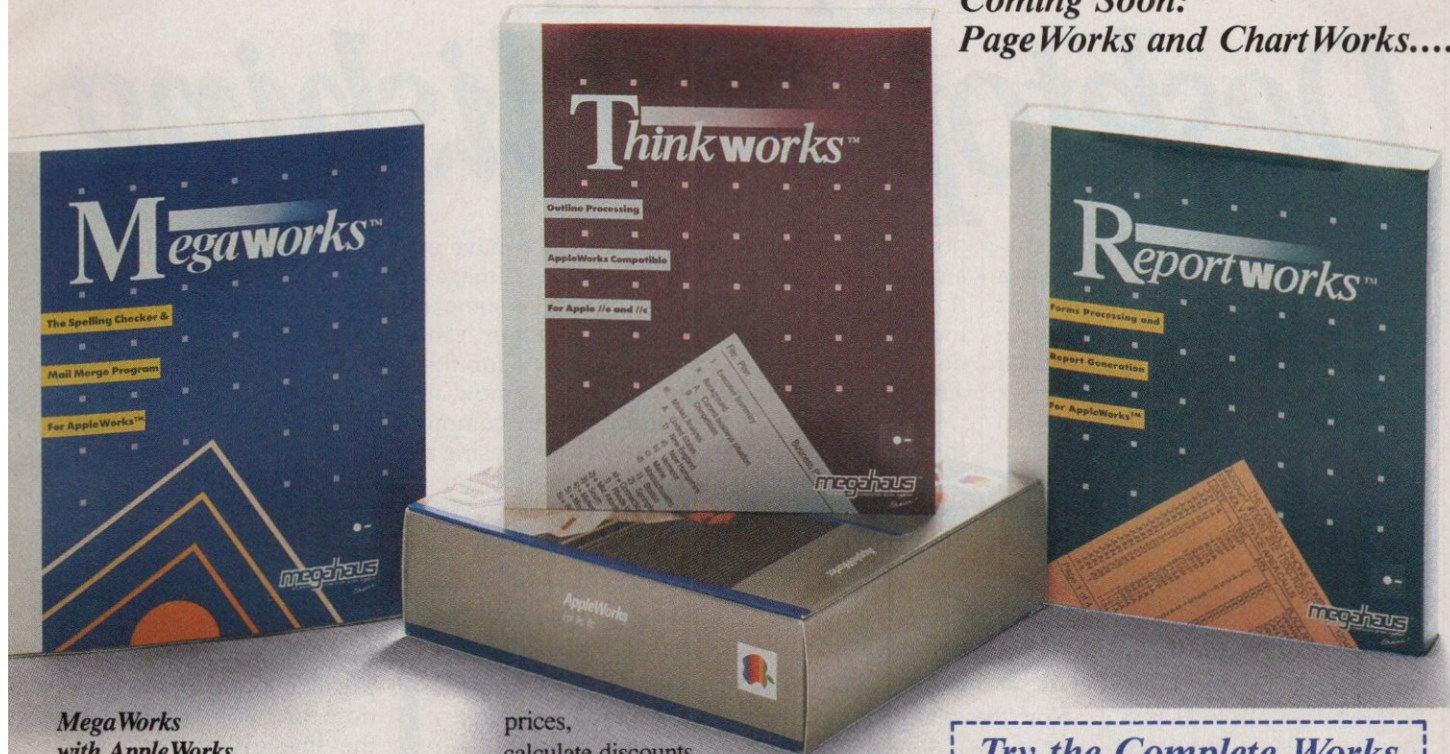

APPLE II Desktop Publishing

The Apple LaserWriter is just that—an Apple output device, not just a Macintosh printer. Direct support from Apple Computer, Inc. for Apple II/LaserWriter connections is reputed to be on the way, but you can get a head start with some software from outside developers and a little bit of simple programming.

Of course, you can always use a LaserWriter in its daisy-wheel printer simulation mode to print out plain text from just about any Apple II application. The LaserWriter hooks right up to a serial port on the Apple II just the way a serial-interface daisy-wheel printer does, using a standard RS-232 serial cable. You set the software to talk to a Diablo 630 printer and set the Apple LaserWriter for 630 emulation, and away you go.

The LaserWriter can do much more, though. With the PostScript page-description language built in and its own powerful internal computer, the LaserWriter can take commands from the Apple II and process them into complex text and graphics drawn at 300 dots per inch over a full page.

Unfortunately, at present, PostScript is the only language that produces that kind of output on the LaserWriter, and Apple II applications don't yet normally produce PostScript output. Rather than providing PostScript-encoded descrip-

tions of the operations for producing a page image, most Apple II applications produce letters or dot patterns meant for an ImageWriter or similar dot-matrix printer.

Three Possible Solutions

Given that language gap between the II and the LaserWriter, three solutions are possible. You can try to teach the Apple II to produce PostScript, you can intercept Apple II out-

have an Epson printer instead of an ImageWriter, you probably have some translation software (a "driver") that adapts the standard output for the Epson machine. That's also how most Macintosh applications communicate with the LaserWriter, using a driver routine installed as part of the system configuration.

We won't know for sure until Apple releases such a translation product, but the evidence is that the firm has one in the works. At least under ProDOS, it should soon be possible to run an application that was created for the ImageWriter and get results that are as good or better on the laser-based machine.

Especially for the LaserWriter, however, using this type of translation software is not necessarily an optimal solution. The LaserWriter connected through this type of driver wouldn't get any more information than what the software would have provided to the ImageWriter. In effect, the LaserWriter is hobbled by the lesser powers of the ImageWriter, while both the originating program and output device have the potential to do more.

LaserWriter as Computer
Teaching the LaserWriter new tricks at the machine-language and ROM level is also a possibility, but for most of us that approach doesn't seem practical. Although the com-

put and translate it to PostScript on the fly, or you can get the LaserWriter to accept ImageWriter files.

Translating is perhaps the easiest general solution, because the techniques are well established for other types of printers. If, for example, you

puter that is embedded in the LaserWriter is a 68000-based machine with ROM, RAM, inputs, and outputs, it's not set up for user programming, and Apple has not made available any programming tools or an operating system.


If you are an experienced programmer, though, you might consider that PostScript, besides being an output language for printers, is also a complete programming language that theoretically can do anything that any other programming language can handle. With the right program, the LaserWriter can accept ImageWriter-format files, smooth out the images for the increased resolution, and print them out in laser-written form. You can also download programs to the LaserWriter and run them, using the Apple II as a terminal.

By far the the easiest way to get the Apple II talking to the LaserWriter right now is to get the Apple II to speak PostScript. Creating PostScript output is somewhat more difficult than simply creating characters and dots, but it's not all that hard.

Desktop publishing with your Apple II-series computer just requires the LaserWriter, some available software, and a little bit of simple programming.



You will, however, have to learn at least some of the PostScript language. You might try the *PostScript Reference Manual* or *PostScript Tutorial and Cookbook*, both from Addison-Wesley; the *A + PostScript* tutorial series (June–September 1985); or any of the growing number of PostScript books.

Once you've figured out what you want to say in PostScript, you shouldn't have much problem with the basic mechanics of getting the Apple II to say it. PostScript page descriptions consist of procedural statements in ASCII (normal text) or bit maps in hexadecimal form, both of which you can produce with the right routines in Applesoft or another programming language.

If you do go this route, remember that PostScript is a vector (drawing procedures)-based, rather than a pixel (dot pattern)-based, language. So creating an image is more like creating shape tables for screen video than it is like fiddling with bits in screen memory. Instead of telling PostScript where each dot should go, you tell it a procedure for drawing an image.

You can, if you wish, send normal Apple II hi-res pictures to the LaserWriter by using some routines in PostScript that accept bit-map pictures in hexadecimal form, but that will give you the Apple II's 192 × 280

screen resolution, rather than the 300-dot-per-inch maximum of the LaserWriter.

Furthermore, when you do get application software to produce PostScript output, you won't be able to see your creations directly on the screen, unless you also write your own PostScript-to-screen pixel converter (which, to say the least, would be a major enterprise). So you'll have

to create most of your work as a series of iterations: writing PostScript instructions, printing the result, and then making necessary adjustments.

If you have no love for programming, on the other hand, you may just want to wait for a bit. Fairly soon, you should start to see a growing

number of programs for the Apple II that include PostScript output meant for the LaserWriter.

Lancaster's Electronic Linecaster

If you do decide to take the PostScript plunge yourself, you don't have to start completely from scratch. Don Lancaster, one of the true pioneers of the personal-computer movement, has been exploring the Apple II/LaserWriter connection, and he's put together an intriguing package called *Apple Writer/LaserWriter Utilities* that transforms the Apple Writer II word-processing program into a PostScript output package (see "Apple Writer Is an Open Road," below).

The results can be absolutely stunning. Included in the package are routines that set typeset text, routines that draw circuit diagrams, and routines that produce bumper stickers and business cards. One even draws Mickey Mouse.

Happy Hacking

At the stage that I saw them, Lancaster's routines did most of the middle half of the job—you still have to organize the basics, and Lancaster's software won't take care of the very fancy cases. It is, at least right now, intended for those of us who like to hack around: You do need to learn at least some PostScript, and many

APPLE WRITER IS AN *Open Road*

Apple Writer II may not have been designed to drive PostScript printers, but it was designed for change—in the best of the Apple II tradition it includes an open-ended "macro" feature, its own high-level programming language, and even a built-in communications feature.

The macros and the WPL language make it easy to add text strings, find selected points, and pull up various blocks of text, depending on what came before. Basically, you can have WPL perform any operation that you can do directly from the keyboard.

PostScript, felicitously, can be expressed purely in ASCII (ordinary text). So if you add in the right strings at the right places, Apple Writer can indeed speak PostScript.

The adaptation is not completely perfect, however. Because the Apple Writer WPL facility was meant for small and moderate tasks, it is hard to automate the generation of the more-

complex PostScript statements.

Furthermore, the PostScript codes are not processed by the II, only by the LaserWriter. As a result, Apple Writer can't tell you if you've made a mistake or asked for operations the LaserWriter can't carry out.

Talking Direct

On the other hand, Apple Writer can at least talk directly to the LaserWriter, so you don't have to switch back and forth to a communications program to try out your files. One of the choices on the Additional Functions menu is Connect Keyboard to Printer/Modem, which routes what normally would go out to the screen to the serial port.

For short PostScript routines, you can hook the LaserWriter up to just about any serial card, run the card's initialization program to set up a 1200- or 9600-bps link (the LaserWriter can work with either speed, but you want the faster 9600 bps),

and then switch to Apple Writer.

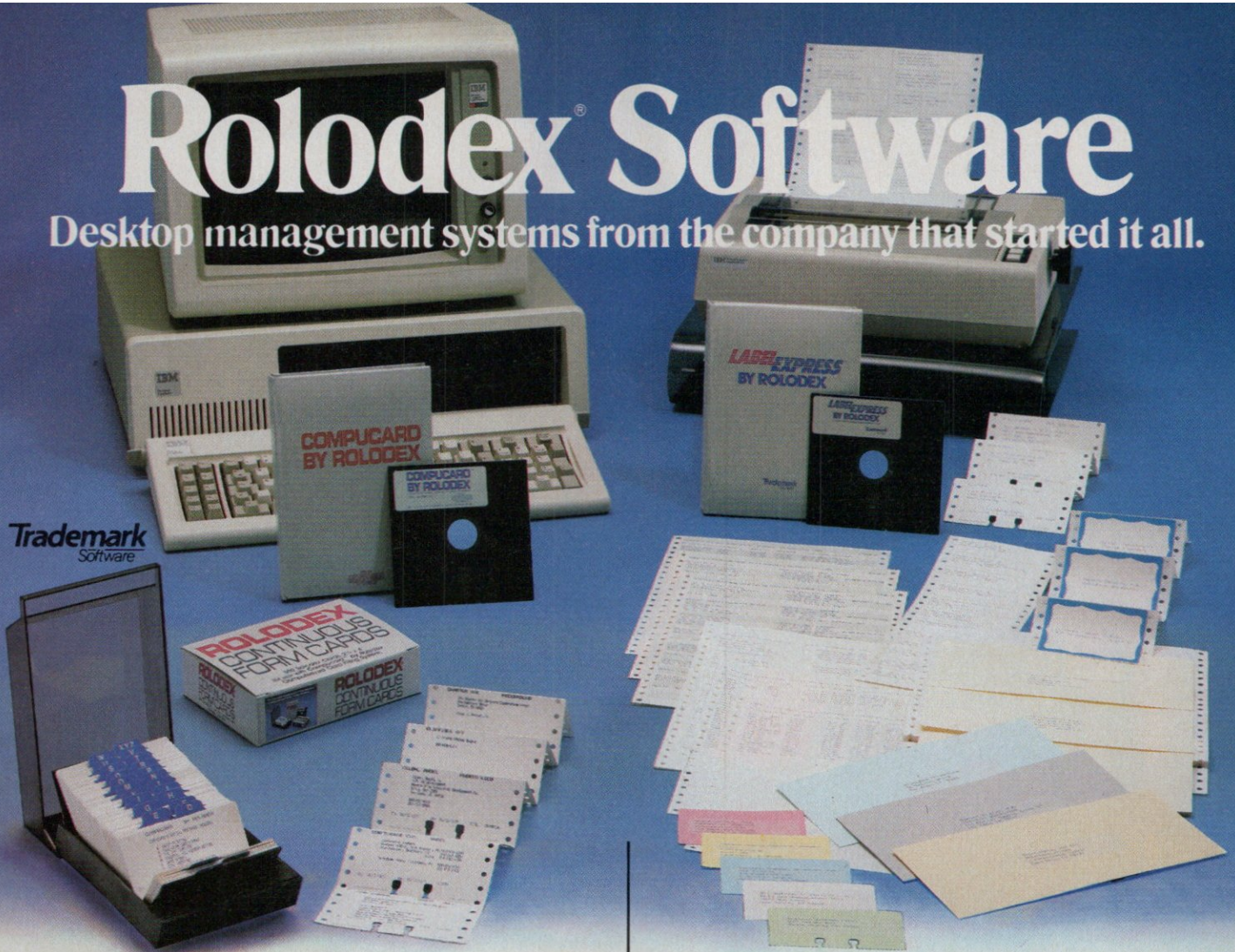
For longer routines, though, you'll need some kind of "handshaking" that lets the LaserWriter tell the II to pause while already sent characters are processed. The LaserWriter uses the method known variously as DC1/DC3, X-ON/X-OFF, or Ctl-S/Ctl-Q, which means it sends back the first in each character pair when it needs the Apple II to wait and the second character when it's ready for more text. Some cards, including Apple's Super Serial Interface, have such a handshaking feature built into their driver software.

At 9600 bps, Apple Writer can't really keep up a two-way conversation, so if you simply send your PostScript files to the LaserWriter without any special settings, you'll probably miss any error messages that come back during processing. You can get a free copy of how to make those settings from Don Lancaster.

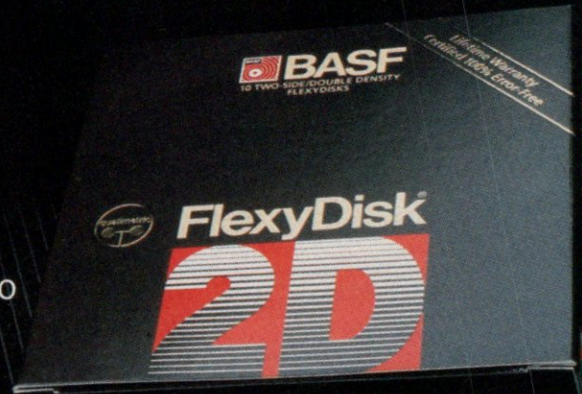

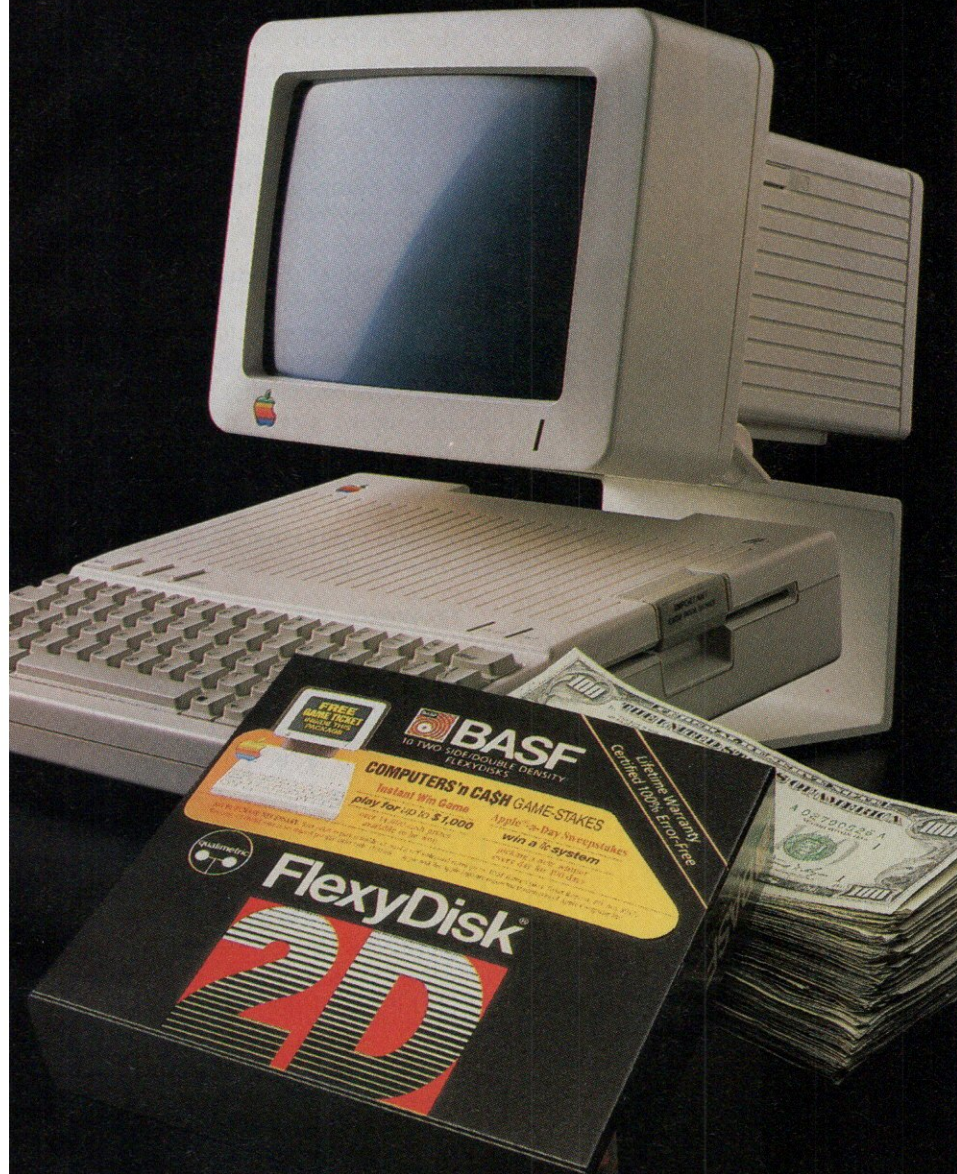

steps require you to figure out how to customize one of the dozens of examples to perform your specific task.

But the routines are steadily evolving; you get readable, modifiable PostScript source code; the \$49.95 price is a true bargain; and Lancaster's update policy is generous: Once you buy a copy, he sends you the next update automatically and keeps doing so as long as you send back the previous update fee. He'll also answer any reasonable question about PostScript and the Apple II by phone at no charge!

Note that to try the package, you'll also need a copy of Apple Writer II (\$195, from Apple), an Apple Super Serial card or equivalent, and an RS-232 cable to hook your II up to the LaserWriter.

The Apple Writer Solution

Running the package goes like this: Using the ProDOS filer programs (from your ProDOS user disk), you make a copy of the four disks from Don Lancaster and then move a copy of your Apple Writer program to the first working disk. You boot up this combined program disk and give Apple Writer its initial opening Return.

You're now, courtesy of the Apple Writer Word Processing Language (WPL) and some programming by Lancaster, in a menu-driven system that lets you pick among a dozen or so routines on each disk, switch to any of the three other disks, or exit to Apple Writer.

Most of the routines include demonstration files that you can run by just answering a few yes/no questions, but for any serious work, you'll have to create your own text files either to combine directly with the provided routines or to send to the LaserWriter following a setup routine from the collection.

For example, the Justify menu choice leads you to a submenu with 11 different types of justification (see figure 1). One choice, the Mixed Font justify, lets you combine up to ten different fonts in the same paragraph, including a large multiline initial letter (what typographers call a drop cap). To use this routine, you enter your text as a normal Apple Writer file, with the addition of one or more of the ten possible escape codes (the ESC key followed by a number) wherever you want to change type specifications. Then, you reinvoke Lancaster's routines with the DO

command (Control-P from Apple Writer), start the justify routine, and see what the result looks like on the LaserWriter.

This routine, because it produces PostScript output directly from text rather than from an ImageWriter file, creates much finer typography than what you get from standard programs for the Macintosh. For example, it provides for placing punctuation marks at the end of lines slightly indented into the right margin ("hanging punctuation"), a feature that most simpler programs and most commercial typesetting systems do not normally give you.

Other routines produce multicolumn output, left and right justification, and even centered letters within multiple columns (which makes for attractive lists and tables). You can do step-and-repeat printing for labels, curved and fancy text for logos and awards (see figure 2), and even giant text for signs (which you paste together from individual 8½ × 11 LaserWriter sheets).

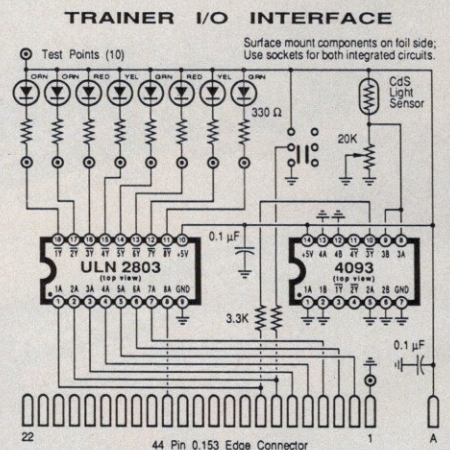


Figure 3: With a little work, you can produce drawings as complex as circuit diagrams.

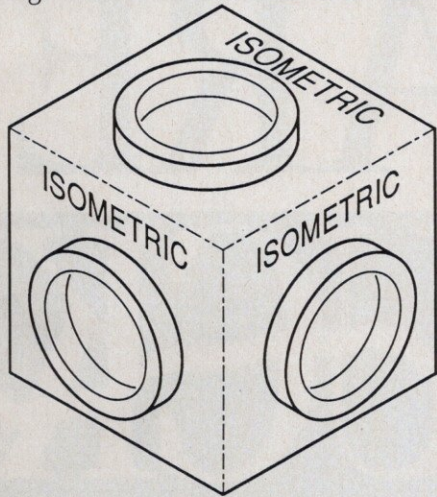


Figure 4: With the right routines, you can produce 3-D perspective drawings even if you can't draw a straight line.

If you're picture- rather than text-oriented, you'll also find many routines for both serious diagrams and some lighter work. Of necessity, these require a greater knowledge of PostScript and usually a larger number of iterations before you get them just right, but they do let you produce drawings as complex as circuit diagrams or 3-D perspective drawings, even if you can't draw a straight line (see figures 3 and 4).

For most of the graphics routines, you follow a multistep process. First, using the supplied grid routines, you print out a sheet with the markings you need to tell PostScript where to put your images. Then, using that

grid as a digitizing pad, you enter any necessary coordinates into your file. Typically, simple drawings need 20 coordinate pairs and some of the complex ones several times that. Hand-digitizing and typing in the results may seem like a rather primitive approach, but it's cheap and effective and doesn't take nearly as long as you might fear.

All curved lines in PostScript are made from a set of mathematically generated shapes called curved splines, so you'll probably need to study up on those in the PostScript manuals if you want to do any drawings that are more ambitious than

straight-line diagrams. One of the routines in Lancaster's package even prints out small samples of all the shapes possible, in a small grid, to give you an idea of your choices.

Just a First Step

If you have an active imagination, you'll want to create a lot of images that you won't find in these routines. Because you get the PostScript and WPL source code, however, and because your own inputs are text as well, everything you create becomes a building block that you can use again in more complex procedures. You can save, modify, and combine your work, just as with any other Apple Writer text.

If you need to get some regular tasks done efficiently, you can simply use the same routines over and over with new text files to supply the content. Once you get the hang of WPL and PostScript, it's even relatively easy to set up your routines so less computer-knowledgeable people can use them. If you like computer games, you may find just experiment-

ing with PostScript a fascinating exercise. Think of it, perhaps, as a high-end Printed Page Construction Set.

That support for both serious business and some less-serious playfulness is what we've come to expect from Apple—and that's certainly what you'll get if you hook an Apple II and a LaserWriter together. +

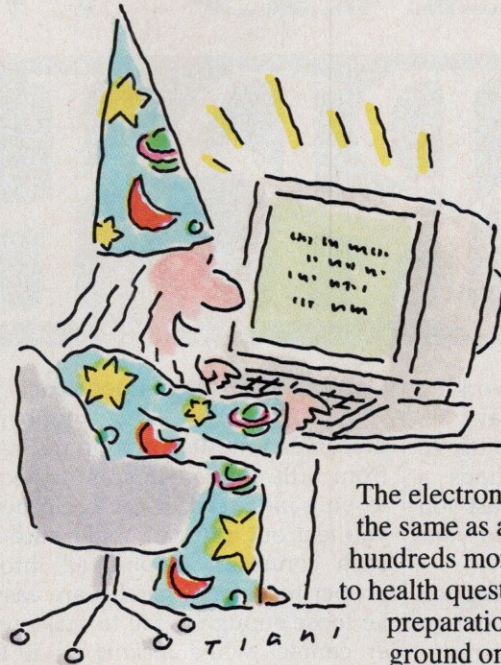

HARDWARE

HARD LUCK

As cooperative and hardworking as your computer may be, sooner or later it's going to throw a tantrum, perhaps a small one, but big enough to cast you back (temporarily, of course) to your old technophobic days.

When your Apple comes a cropper, you can panic and mill around or you can remind yourself that a fair number of problems are soluble with a bit of common sense, a simple tool or two, and a willingness to make the effort. Sure, some computer failures demand special tools and training to overcome them, but if your computer goes strange without filling the air with odious smells, there's a good chance that a little tinkering on your part will put things to right.

Trouble can develop in the (1) cabling and interconnections, (2) computer proper (the box with the chips and boards), (3) keyboard, (4) video monitor, (5) storage system (disk drives), and (6) peripherals (e.g., printer, plotter, modem, digitizer). In the paragraphs that follow, we'll look at some of the easy-to-cope-with difficulties that might arise.

Cabling and Interconnections

A surprisingly large number of personal-computer symptoms result from little things such as neglecting to plug in a cord or cable. So before you tear out any hair, make sure that each connector is plugged into its proper receptacle. Cables are easy to jar loose enough to fail to make proper contact while *looking* as if they were solidly attached.

Cables that you plug in and unplug frequently are susceptible to the sloppies. In time, the pins and shells get worn and loose and refuse to make a solid connection. At some point in time, you'll have to replace one or more of these plug-worn cables, although a little first aid and some care in the process of plugging and unplugging can forestall the inevitable.

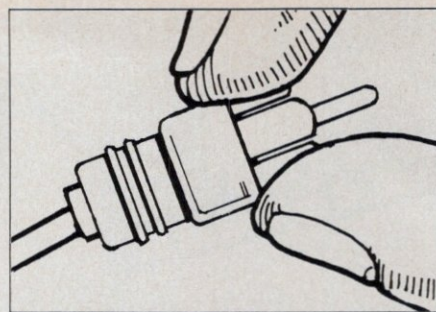


Figure 1: Using your fingers, you can press the shell of an RCA phono plug back into shape.

The connector that's the easiest to loosen (and, hence, tighten) is the RCA phono plug on computer-to-TV video cables. The outer shell of the plug—made of a thin metal stamping—spreads because you have to wiggle it when inserting it into or removing it from its connection. Use

your fingers or a pair of pliers to *gently* press this shell back into shape (see figure 1).

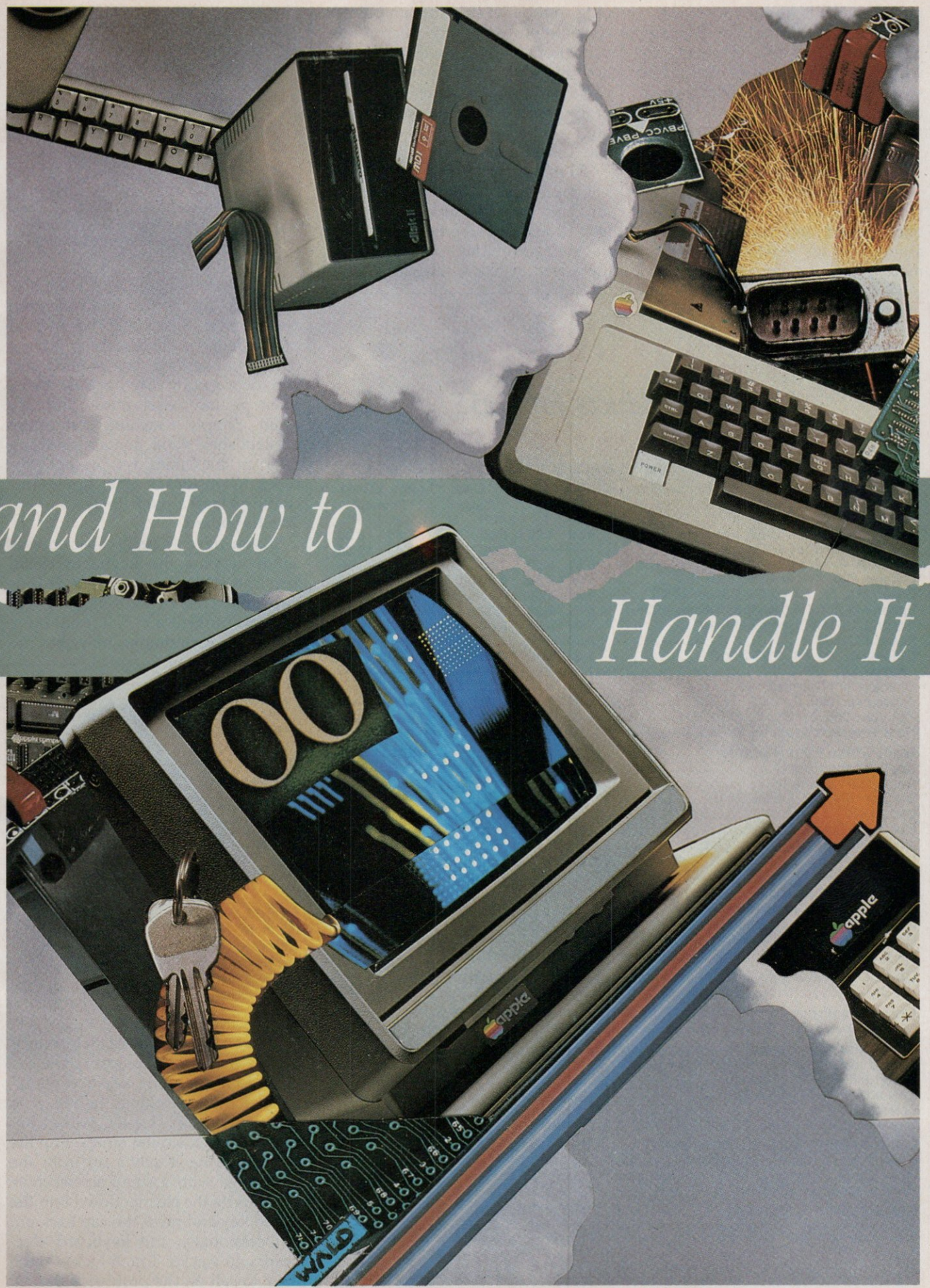

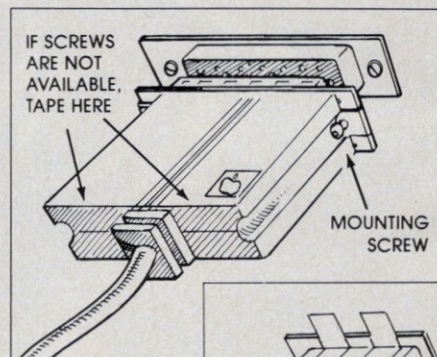


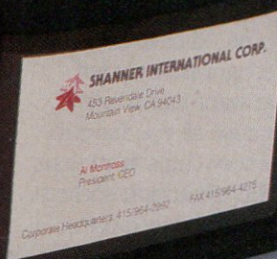
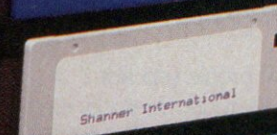
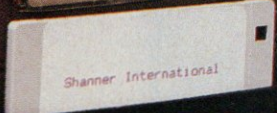
Figure 2: Secure the more elaborate connectors such as DB-25s with screws or tape.

The best way to manage the more elaborate connectors (commonly, DB-25s) is to attach them securely with screws or tape and leave them alone (see figure 2).

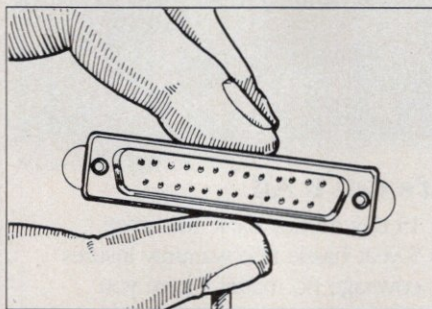


Figure 3: Make sure the male DB-25 connector's pins are straight and even.

If you've determined that you do have a problem, check to see that the pins (male connector) are straight and even and that the shell makes a snug fit over the matching connector (see figure 3).

Suppose you turn on your computer one day, and the monitor comes up with nothing but a raster (a flickering white screen). You can bet that the monitor isn't getting a signal from the computer. Although there are several possible causes, the most common one is a loose or detached video cable. Check the cable at the computer end and the monitor end. If the cable just won't connect firmly, apply first aid, as discussed above. If, on the other hand, you get a completely dark screen, satisfy yourself that the monitor power cord is plugged in and the

power switch is turned on.

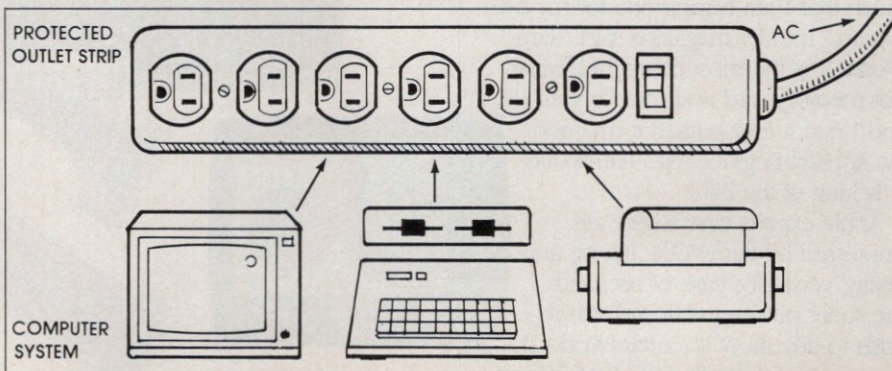


Figure 4: A good strategy is to plug all of your power cords into a protected outlet strip.

A good strategy is to plug all your power cords into a single outlet strip, which you can use as the master switch for the whole system (see figure 4).

Invest in a good-quality strip, one with a circuit breaker, a power light, and protection against electrical "noise," which can cause your computer all kinds of aggravation. Expect to spend somewhere around \$50. It's well worth it. For ultimate protection (at ultimate cost!),

plug your outlet strip into an uninterruptible power supply. Such a doodad not only "conditions" the household electricity, but it also lets you shut down the system gracefully in the event of a brownout or black-out.

The Computer

Troubleshooting the computer itself requires more expertise than I can impart in this short article. Nevertheless, should your Apple II, II Plus, or IIe start exhibiting odd symptoms (deranged displays, refusal to accept

input, and other forms of computer dementia), turn the machine off, open the lid, disconnect the internal cables, remove the boards, and blow out (with canned compressed air) and/or vacuum up the dust balls. Then replace everything and try again. Simply reseating connectors reestablishes good contact and can clear up the flakies. For present purposes, the insides of other Apples (including Macs) are off-limits.

The Keyboard

If you haven't been conscientious about keeping the keyboard clean, keys can stick or even refuse to produce characters. A thorough application of canned air, followed by a thorough vacuuming, may be the

only necessary treatment.

If some keys persist in their recalcitrance, you can try removing the cap from each offending key and spraying the inner workings lightly with electrical contact cleaner, sold at Radio Shack and similar stores. Pop the cap by prying it gently up from the front edge with a small screwdriver. Then spritz the cleaner down into the naked key and press the cap back on.

Occasionally, the keyboard electronics go wacko. Tough luck—you'll have to call on the professionals.

The Display Monitor

Most monochrome monitors have readily accessible controls for brightness (or "black level") and contrast, as well as horizontal and vertical hold. Some also allow you to adjust picture height and width. Next time you turn on your computer, experiment with these controls and note how each one affects the display. Service personnel report that an unexpectedly large number of home computerists bring in computers that are "malfunctioning," only to find out that someone has inadvertently twitched one or more of the display

controls enough to distort or even wipe out the picture.

The ideal brightness and contrast settings are those that give you a sharp display from your normal viewing distance. Cranking up the brightness smears the image, shortens the life of the picture tube, and gives you a headache. Ditto for contrast. Play with the two controls until you arrive at the sharpest, clearest image at the lowest comfortable viewing intensity.

Horizontal tearing and vertical rolling of the image may be due to various electronic problems in the computer or monitor, but give the horizontal and vertical controls a try. As components age, their electrical values change somewhat, and occa-

sionally you need to compensate by fine-tuning things. You can almost always settle the screen down with some judicious knob twisting.

To the preceding problems, color monitors add those problems that are associated with color saturation (intensity), color accuracy (tint), and color purity and alignment. You can intensify color with the color control, and you can distribute the spectrum correctly with the tint control. You have to leave color alignment (including purity adjustment) to a trained technician, however, who has to open the monitor and do a lot of fiddling around inside—a fairly expensive process.

Unless you've had your monitor or color TV set for a long time, it's unlikely to need alignment. Generally, tinkering with the various image controls (brightness, contrast, color, and tint) should do the job. If you've made a reasonable effort and the display still looks dismal, the TV- or computer-service center is in for some profit at your expense.

Remember that, dollar for dollar, a monochrome monitor gives you a sharper image than a color monitor does. A color TV set used as a monitor gives you the poorest image of all. No matter how much you touch up the controls, you can't overcome the TV's inherent limitations.

Monitors, along with the rest of your equipment, like to be clean. So every few days, wipe the screen off with a *slightly* damp sponge and quickly dry it, and don't allow dust (or anything else) to clog the ventilation slots. Heat and electronic components are natural enemies.

Disk Drives

Service people report that disk drives fail more frequently than any other computer component. Despite this seemingly horrifying statistic, disk drives are pretty reliable. Here

are a few hints anyway.

If you have trouble getting a disk to boot, the problem may be with (1) the disk itself (try another copy of the same program or another program); (2) an errant data bit in the system (turn off the computer for a few seconds, remount the disk, close the drive door tightly, and reboot); (3) dirty read/write head(s); or (4) incorrect spin rate. Actually, there can be many other causes, but these are the most common.

You can clean the heads with a commercial head-cleaning kit. Just don't overdo it, or you'll cause premature head wear. To determine if timing really is the cause of your grief, you'll need a diagnostic disk. Retiming requires that you get to the innards of the drive, and the manual that comes with the diagnostic disk should tell you how to do this.

Handle disks carefully, replacing them in their envelopes as soon as you're finished with them, and never leave disks sitting in disk drives when you've closed up shop.

For an in-depth look at do-it-yourself disk-drive repair, dig out your March and April 1985 issues of *A+*, which include a two-part series called "First Aid for Disk Drives."

The Printer

Paper jams, paper dust, and blown dot-matrix printheads constitute the major ills your printer is heir to. Printers with easily accessible configuration switches are also prone to sudden failures due to little fingers' fiddling with little switches. Before doing anything else, check to see that all the switches are properly set. You should have made records of the settings when the printer was installed.

Paper jams usually result from improperly seating the tractor holes on the tractor pins, oblique feeding of continuous forms with a friction-feed printer, or anything that hinders the movement of paper. Hindrances may arise from improper paper loading, small scraps of paper in the paper path, allowing already printed pages to feed back through with new paper (it happens!), and objects sitting on the paper on its way to the printer.

Paper produces a large quantity of fibrous dust that can eventually cause your printer to misbehave. Preventive maintenance pays. Carefully clean out your printer about once a month. Use canned compressed air to dislodge the fibers and a vacuum

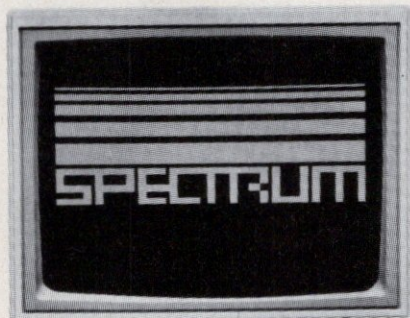

cleaner to get rid of them. After the unit is clean, wipe a *thin* coat of high-quality lubricant (such as a Teflon-based oil) onto the rail that carries the printhead.

A blown dot-matrix printhead either refuses to print anything or prints only some of the dots. The result of one or more missing dots is fine blank lines across the printed page. All the popular dot-matrix printers come with user-replaceable printheads, and you'll save a service charge by doing the simple replacement yourself. Order the correct head from the dealer, remove the old head, and mount the new one. Removal generally amounts to no more than taking out two screws and unplugging a small cable. Replacement reverses the process and is just as easy. While you're at it, clean off the printhead rail and wipe on a little bit of lubricant.

The Moral of the Story

Maintenance is better than repair. Keep your equipment clean, dry, and well connected. Don't let familiarity breed contempt. And when disaster strikes, don't panic. Yell, but don't panic. Then sit down and let your sense of logic and order tell you where the problem lies. If you feel you can handle it yourself, give it a try. Otherwise, pack the computer off to the service center. Of course, you must *never* do anything to your computer while it's still under warranty! Let Apple Computer worry about it in that case. +

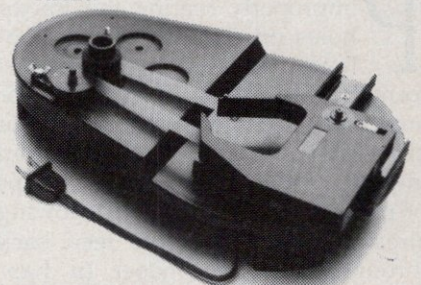

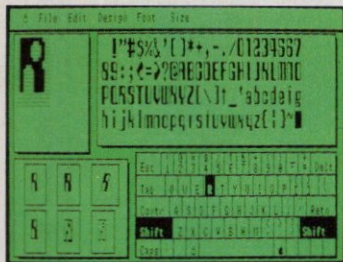

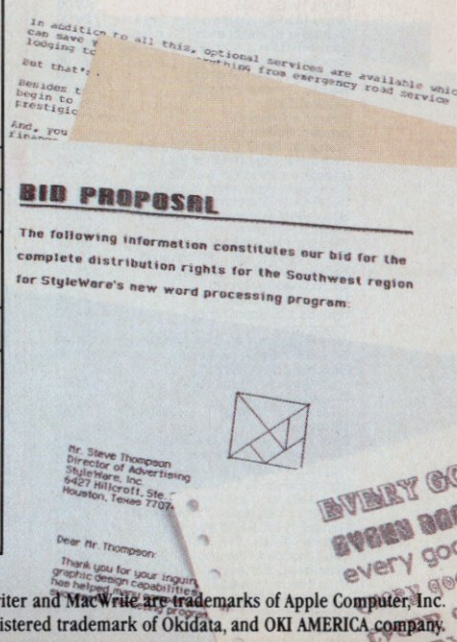

APPLE III ALTER EGO

Titan Technologies' III Plus IIe lets your Apple III emulate a IIe.

There was a time when thousands of Apple II owners longed for a device that would allow their machine to emulate the Apple III. As irony would have it, they might now need to convert in the opposite direction, and Titan Technologies (formerly Saturn) has just the set of plug-in boards with which to do it.

At first, this product appears to be a downgrade—something akin to the Plug and Play kit that made my Okidata 92 printer act like an IBM Graphics (i.e., modified Epson MX-80) machine and, in the process, removed some of its best features—but that is not the case here. In fact, Titan's III Plus IIe not only opens the Apple III's drives to virtually the entire Apple II and IIe software libraries, but it also enhances the III's natural functions.

Who would have believed it could come to this? I vividly recall the excitement surrounding the introduction of the Apple III a little over five years ago and the subsequent disappointment many of us shared when the first machine we laid eyes on—at a New York computer show—spewed garbage onto the screen, beeped pitifully, and died. As it turned out, this failed demonstration was not an isolated case of computer crib death, for Apple IIIs were popping their chips all over the country. I must admit that those of us who had invested one or two thousand dollars in an Apple II (and could ill afford to write that off and buy a III) breathed a

sigh of relief when the first release turned out to be less than wonderful, but Apple quickly diagnosed and cured the malady, thus generating renewed interest—not to mention a certain amount of jealousy.

Apple II owners had mixed feelings about the III. On the one hand, we marveled at its 128K RAM, up-and-down-arrows, numeric keypad,

built-in 80-column uppercase and lowercase display, 16 colors, enhanced graphics, and "typeahead" buffer; on the other hand, many people worried that the Apple II was being superseded, and nobody wants to be stuck with an obsolete computer. Of course, the Apple II did not die, it simply spawned the IIe and IIc models, new generations that today happily coexist with it.

For a variety of reasons, the Apple III did not fare as well. Some say it never quite recovered from its ill-fat-

ed start; others blame competition from Big Blue, which entered the microcomputer field with a solidly established image in the business community and placed its PCs on the very desks Apple had intended for its new machine. The final death knell—so the story goes—was sounded by Steve Jobs, who is said to have seen the III as a nuisance in the Macintosh's path. Notice that no one has blamed the machine itself; it remains an excellent computer that never got a chance to really prove its worth.

A New Lease on Life

Today, little or no new software is being written for the Apple III, but an estimated 80,000-100,000 units are still in use by a fiercely loyal group of owners, who will see the Titan cards as a new lease on their machine's life.

From the beginning, emulation of the Apple II and II Plus was a highly touted feature of the Apple III; its designers set out to create a business machine that serious Apple II owners could graduate to without rendering obsolete their accumulated software library. But the emulation went only so far: It enabled the Apple III to display the II's high-resolution graphics and 40-column text screens and to run virtually all programs that had been written for an unenhanced Apple II. The number of unenhanced IIIs was rapidly diminishing at that time, however; many 80-column cards were on the market, and more and more applications programs were



written to take advantage of them.

Thus, Apple II emulation meant little to Apple III owners whose needs went beyond running games or the earliest application software packages. As it turned out, even game players fell victim to incompatibility, for neither of the III's two game ports worked in the Apple II mode—the term *joysticks* became a misnomer. The Titan III Plus IIe solves the joystick problem (it has an on-board 16-pin game socket), but, since it emulates the IIe's 80-column card

rather than the old Videx or Double-Vision types, early 80-column Apple II programs remain incompatible. A PR#3 command invokes the 80-column feature, and some preboot programs might work, but Titan makes no guarantees in that direction. Since most of these game programs are now outdated, that handicap should be of little concern.

Installing the Titan

The III Plus IIe package comprises two Titan boards, one a modified version of a previously marketed Titan

Apple II emulation card, the other a new IIe card. Owners of unmodified Titan Apple II emulation cards can send them to Titan for an upgrade that costs \$175. Installing the two boards is a relatively easy task when you follow the furnished step-by-step instructions. Briefly, you first locate the video ROM on the motherboard and replace it with Titan's ribbon cable. A 24-pin connector on the other end of the cable goes into one of the Titan boards, which you press into slot 2 of the Apple III. You then link the two cards by way of another ribbon cable and place the second one in slot 3. Assuming that you have a parallel card in slot 1, you'll have only

one vacancy left, which you can use for, say, a CP/M card.

Booting the Titan startup disk produces a menu (see figure 1) with three options: 1) START APPLE III OPERATION, 2) CHANGE IIe EMULATION, and 3) START APPLE IIe EMULATION. Option 2 yields a second menu, leading to options for

changing the serial-printer and communications settings (see figures 1 and 2). Changing a jumper on the board in slot 2 allows the computer to access a serial printer connected to the Apple III's built-in RS-232C port.

If you want to communicate with the outside world from the IIe mode,

connect a modem to the serial port, and set the software accordingly. The Titan III Plus IIe software duplicates many of the Super Serial Card's functions, but not all, so you may run into trouble. I did not encounter any problems with the Hayes 300- and 1200-bps modems. If you are using the serial port for a printer, you probably don't have a parallel card in slot 1, and thus the solution to an eventual communications problem is to install the Super Serial Card, which the Titan cards can address if it has the

proper jumper setting.

Because it carries its own complement of 128K RAM, the Titan card set can take advantage of the IIe's double high-resolution graphics display, which has a resolution of 560 x 192 dots per inch. Not all graphics programs work with this enhanced mode, so option 3 on the second menu lets you toggle this feature on or off, and you can change all these settings in midstream by pressing the open-apple/Reset combination, which brings back the main menu.

You can also move back and forth between the II and III modes without turning off the power.

Once you've configured the system, normal operation is a snap: Boot the startup disk, replace it with one containing the ProDOS or SOS system, and press the corresponding option number. If you want to see what kind of Apple IIe the Titan cards have turned your III into, run the ProDOS User's Disk and press S (for *Slot Assignments*). Figure 3 shows the screen that appeared on my machine.

It looks great, but does it really work? You bet. The first program I tried was Word Perfect, and all went well until I had to delete a character and searched the Apple III keyboard in vain for a Delete key. The Titan people have solved the problem simply by giving Control-Shift-Backslash the same effect. Next I ran AppleWorks, with equally smooth results. In fact, the III can outperform

the IIe, because even its numeric keypad and two-speed keystroke-repeat feature function properly in the IIe emulation mode.

When I spent a whole evening running every conceivable type of Apple II program on the III, I soon realized that anything I could run on my Apple IIe also ran on the emulated IIe. In each case, I made vain attempts to crash the program or, at the very least, run into a snag, but the real IIe duplicated the frustrations as well as the joys. When I had a slight problem with the graphics on Newsroom, the solution was to turn off the double-hi-res mode. Since Word Juggler, for a long time my favorite word processor, was originally written for the Apple III, it made little sense to run the IIe version in the emulation mode, but I tried it anyway, and it also worked splendidly. The only Apple IIe program that refused to run was SuperCalc 3a, but it failed only because it requires a CMOS 6502 (65C02B) microprocessor. Not really a problem, because this chip, which you find in the Apple IIc and newer IIe computers, is easy to install in the Apple III, replacing the NMOS 6502B.

RAM Bonuses

The Titan startup disk contains two RAMdisk programs, one of which activates automatically. It checks to see how much memory your Apple III has in its main memory and then installs as much of that

as possible as a RAMdisk. In the case of a 256K Apple III, that means a 192K RAMdisk—enough to hold a good dictionary, for example. Although installation is automatic, you have to format the RAMdisk before you can use it.

I mentioned at the beginning of this review that the Titan cards enhance Apple III operation, and this improvement involves an SOS RAMdisk, which requires more setup work, but is well worth the trouble. The Titan startup disk contains an SOS RAM driver that you must first transfer to your application disk by way of the Systems Configuration Program (SCP). If the disk has insufficient space, you can set up a two-stage loading procedure. For you experienced SOS users, the configuration should be a breeze; others may find it slightly complicated, but the Titan manual contains clear, step-by-step instructions.

I was sorry to discover that the Titan cards couldn't address my high-capacity Micro Sci A143 floppy drive in IIe emulation, but I'm not so sure that I can't do something to rectify that. On the other hand, they do work with a ProFile hard disk and (under ProDOS) the Apple III's clock/calendar chip. The Titan emulator doesn't provide flashing characters and MouseText (icons) either, but wouldn't you really rather have the other extras?

All in all, a bona fide Apple IIe can do little that the \$399 Titan III Plus IIe cards can't emulate. That versatility and the aforementioned RAMdisk features make this a highly recommended addition to any Apple III. It might even serve as an inducement to purchasing a III, which (I am told) has dropped to about \$400 on the used market. +

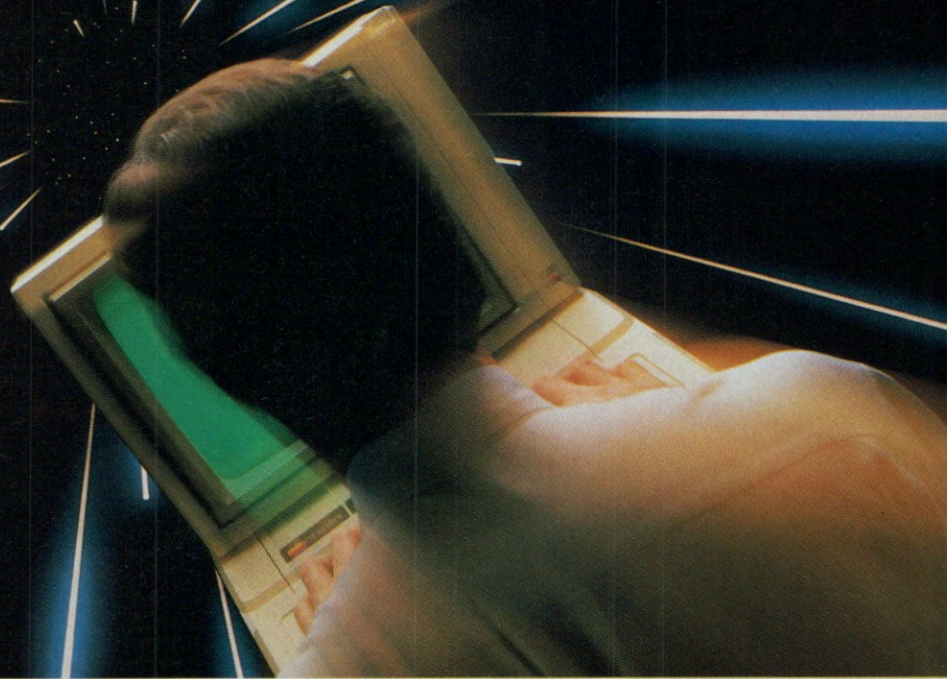

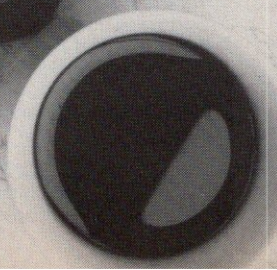

Here comes the editor-in-shief now with my story in hand! A quick ajustment of my glasses—they've got heavy black frames and a bad habit of falling down my nose when I'm typing. It wouldn't do to face the turning point in my career with my glasses asque.

"Bailey?" he says in that gruff, tobaco-stained voice I love and fear so much.

"Yessir!" I say, pride already putting a sizable lump in my throat.

"Is there any hope of your ever lerning how to spell?"

As many of us know so well, no matter how hot the story or how important the information, spelling and typographical errors reflect poorly on a writer. In the case of business letters and press releases, the bad impression can go beyond the writer and reflect poorly on

the company he or she represents.

If the sad tale of the cub reporter strikes a chord in you, you'll be relieved to know that help is on the way. Software publishers have trained a valuable and powerful player to add to the word-processing team. Spelling checkers, either stand-alone or built

into word-processing programs, have reached a peak in terms of speed, ease of use, automatic correction capabilities, and even the incorporation of some artificial-intelligence techniques. Fulfilling a broad range of requirements, from those of young students writing term papers to those of professional journalists, spelling checkers are a must if you strive for perfection in your written communications (and who doesn't?).

Word-processing programs may include a built-in spelling checker, or the manufacturer may provide a spelling checker that works with the word-processing program. Spelling checkers fall into three main categories. Those that are included in, or can be installed into, a word-processing program are considered integrated, because you do not have to leave the word-processing program to check the spelling of your documents. The second group works with specific word-processing programs, and the third group works with any word-processing program that saves documents as ASCII text files. The spelling checkers in the latter two categories require you to leave the word-processing program and then start the spelling-checker application in order to check your documents.

If you already own a word-processing program, look for a spelling checker that works specifically with your program. If your word-processing program is not listed in the chart that accompanies this article but saves documents as ASCII text files, you are still in luck.

This review will cover the the best-known spelling checkers for the Apple II series and a few recent arrivals. The chart that follows presents the remaining programs and their basic features.

Although spelling checkers offer a variety of capabilities, the basic operating premise is the same for all of them. They all contain a dictionary database, but some programs have more words in the database than others do, and almost all allow you to add your own words. When you begin spell-checking, the program instructs you to load your document (unless the checker is integrated with your word-processing program, in which case you can spell-check without leaving the word-processing program) and compares the data, or words, in your document to the words in its dictionary database. If a word is not in the program's dictionary database, the spelling checker lets you know, in most cases, by highlighting the word in context.

Of course, the more words a spelling checker's dictionary has, the more effective and complete the correcting job will be. No spelling checker can take the place of a good human proofreader for complete accuracy, however. As we delve deeper into the correcting process, you'll see why.

The first thing you'll want to ascertain in choosing a spelling checker is which programs can work with your word-processing program. If you haven't yet purchased a word-processing program, you'll want to consider those with built-in spelling checkers. In general, you can save time by eliminating the need to switch disks if the spelling checker is integrated with a word-processing program.

Two valuable features to look for in a spelling checker are the ability to suggest alternative spellings and the provision for you to scroll through the program's electronic dictionary, thereby eliminating the need to leave your work to search through a printed dictionary if the program does not come up with the correct alternative spelling to a misspelled word. In general, you can choose one of the alternative words and prompt the program to replace the word automatically with your choice, or you can type a replacement directly into your document.

The suggested alternative spellings are usually based on words listed close to the misspelled word in the dictionary that use similar letters. They appear, with instructions and options, in a "proofing window" next to your document. Sometimes they're amazingly helpful, sometimes not. For instance, the incorrect word *presinct* in

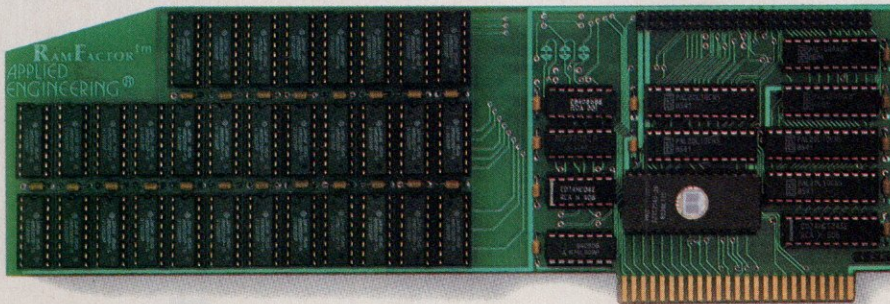

the sample document is somewhat removed from the correctly spelled *pre-cinct* in the dictionary, so suggested spellings would be something like *pre-scient* or *prescience*. If you don't have a clue how to spell the word, your alternatives are to scroll through the words beginning with *pre* in the program's dictionary or to ask the person in the next office.

No spelling checker can catch words spelled correctly but used incorrectly. For example, take the words *scene* and *sole* in the sample document. Since both words appear in most spelling-checker dictionaries, they pass as correct.

A nice feature common to all the programs in this review is that they let you customize their dictionaries to fit your personal writing needs, either by adding your own words to the spelling checker's database or by creating a dictionary from scratch on a separate disk. So if you work with a lot of terms that the spelling-checker dictionary lacks, you can add those words to your program's dictionary as you create documents. Many specialized dictionaries, already compiled and available on disk, cover legal, medical, and techni-

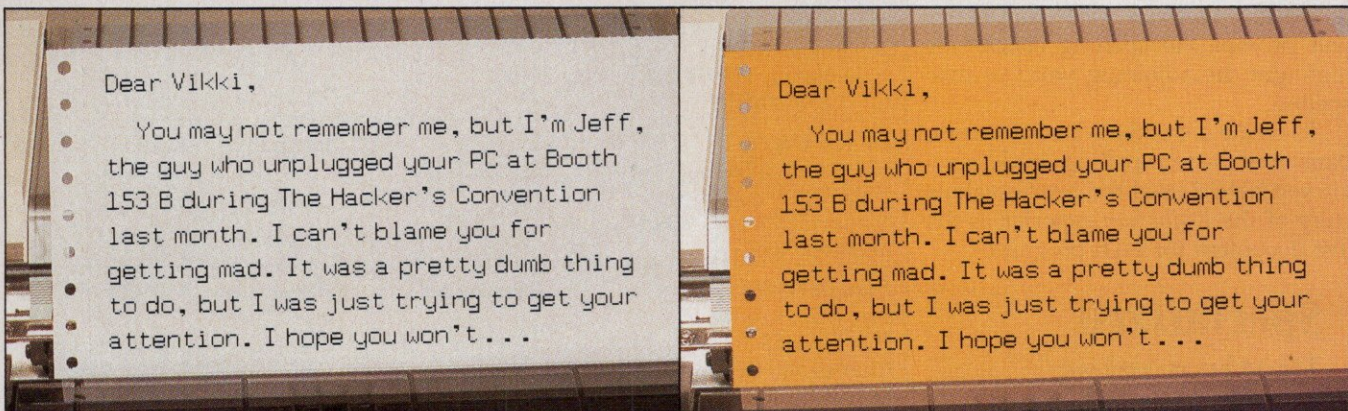

If you need to create a separate dictionary disk, you will likely require two disk drives. Two disk drives are essential anyway if you don't want to waste a lot of time switching back and forth between your document and stand-alone spelling checkers as you work your way through the correction process.

Occasionally, all writers encounter a word that completely stumps them. Some spelling checkers offer a way to deal with these mystery words. You can substitute "wild-card characters" for one or more letters of a word you don't know how to spell. The program then searches the dictionary for similar words containing the letters you do know, in the same relative position. Think what you could do with cross-word puzzles!

In addition, spelling checkers provide you with useful statistics on your documents. Most give you a total word count, a list of the unique words and how many times each word appears, the number of "suspect" words, and the number of corrections you made. If you plan to embed commands in your document, in most cases you must do so after you've corrected it. Otherwise, your commands will prompt the spelling checker to highlight the adjoining word as misspelled.

To create a standard basis for comparison of the ten spelling checkers reviewed here, I used the heartbreaking story of the *Daily Sun* reporter as the test document for each program.

Bank Street Speller

Designed to work exclusively with Bank Street Writer, this program, like the word-processing program, is ideal for families with young students. The spelling checker is easy to use and consists of a single disk with the program on one side and a dictionary of more than 30,000 words on the other. Bank Street Speller lets you assign passwords to your text files.

As with most spelling checkers, when you boot it and load your text file, the program tells you how many words your document contains and how many of those words are not in the program's dictionary. It also lists all the unique words in your document by letter, tells you how many times each word appears in the document, and prints the list. Educators will appreciate this feature for language study.

As you encounter each highlighted word in your document, the program gives you the option of ignoring it and going on, replacing it, getting a suggested spelling, adding it to the dictionary, or searching the dictionary. Ignoring words is an option in all spelling checkers because they highlight words such as proper names, addresses, jargon, and unusual words that are correct but not in the spelling-checker dictionaries. If you plan to use those words often, you can add them to the dictionary.

Bank Street Speller incorporates the valuable wild-card option. Referring to the sample document, let's say I have no idea how to spell *garanteed* correctly. The suggested spellings are no help, so I type in *g=====teed*, using *=* as my wild card. The program gives me the correct spelling, *guaranteed*.

Two disk drives make life with Bank Street Speller a lot easier and are an absolute necessity for making your own dictionaries on separate disks.

The Bard's "Pro-Am" Apple II/c Writing System

Integrated with a new, multilevel word-processing program (which, by the way, looks quite interesting), The Bard's spelling checker contains a 50,000-word dictionary. You can add

words to this dictionary, but you can't create your own dictionaries on separate disks.

The program suggests alternative spellings and lets you scroll through its dictionary to find words, but it lacks a wild-card option.

The Bard's Insert Mark option lets you mark words or phrases with an asterisk. Then, using the Find feature of the word-processing program, you can locate those marks to make changes you can't make with the spelling checker activated.

When making corrections, you can either type in the new word or choose

from one of the suggested spellings and press Return. The new word automatically replaces the incorrect one, with any capital letters or punctuation automatically substituted.

Better Working Word Processor

Better Working, a word-processing program with built-in spelling checker, highlights suspect words in your document that it doesn't find in its 50,000-word dictionary—but it stops short right there.

Although you do have the options of ignoring, changing, and adding words to the dictionary, you must come up with the correct spelling

On the Horizon

I was able to get only preliminary versions of two of the spelling checkers I tested. By the time you read this article, they should be available in final form. Try to find a dealer that will let you test the software before you make a buying decision.

Pinpoint

Designed for installation as a Pinpoint desk accessory in AppleWorks, the Pinpoint spelling-checker dictionary contains 50,000 words. Installation of the program was tricky.

Once I was in AppleWorks, however, the spelling checker was very easy to use, even more uncannily accurate at coming up with correct spellings for my errors than the PFS:Write program was. Like the PFS:Write spelling checker, Pinpoint does not give you the option of scrolling through its dictionary. You can make additions to the dictionary, however, and create your own dictionaries as text files. Before you quit your document, the program gives you a summary of the number of words in your document, the number of suspect words, the number of corrections it has made, and the number of words you've added to the dictionary. One handy feature: When you install Pinpoint's spelling checker, the installation program asks you to specify which version of AppleWorks you're using and reformats accordingly.

Spellbound

If you're willing to spend some time personalizing a spelling checker to fit your needs, then Spellbound may be for you.

This spelling checker is unique.

Designed to work exclusively with AppleWorks in real time—in other words, as you are typing your document—the program uses a beep to alert you to an error.

Spellbound's dictionary comprises 1000 words that the publisher has determined to be the most frequently used and misspelled words in the English language. So, until you've spent time creating your own personal dictionary, Spellbound is useful only as a typo catcher.

The program caught minor slips such as *was t* for *wasn't* (but not *wasnt*), *gong* for *going* and *cty* for *city*. It did not catch any of the major misspellings in the sample document, however.

According to the publisher, Spellbound is programmed to catch only these four types of spellings errors, which, he has determined, represent 90–95% of all spelling errors: the use of the wrong letter, the insertion of an extra letter, the omission of a letter, or the transposition of two letters. If your error does not fit into one of these categories, you're stuck with it. The program features a special Autopilot option, which, when activated, automatically replaces misspelled words while you charge on with your typing.

Although Spellbound represents a unique concept, if your needs are complex and you produce long documents with many different words, the program is not powerful enough to meet those requirements. The version I used was erratic, and I would not want to have to rely on Spellbound if my life depended on producing a perfectly spelled document.

without any assistance from the program. It gives you no suggested spellings, and the program lacks the capability of scrolling through its dictionary to look for possibilities. So you must use a printed dictionary to find the correct word, type it into a box at the bottom of the screen, and press Return to substitute the correct word for the misspelled one.

PFS:Write

Integrated with the PFS:Write word-processing program, the PFS spelling-checker dictionary is fixed at 75,000 words, and you can create as many personal dictionaries as you need. Each personal dictionary can contain up to 200 words, and you can save them to separate disks. These personal dictionaries are treated as Write documents, so you can delete and add to them as easily as you can to any other document.

This spelling checker was uncannily good at coming up with the correct spellings of the misspelled words in the sample document, a real tribute to the language skills of the designers. This ability is especially important because you do not have the option of scrolling through the electronic dictionary. So if you don't find the correct spelling for your word listed in the alternatives, you must search through a printed dictionary.

The program automatically replaces capitals and punctuation, catches words typed twice, and prompts you if you try to replace a misspelled word with another word not in its dictionary.

A unique feature gives you the option of checking just one word in a document, which you choose by positioning the cursor and pressing open-apple-X. An interesting aside: The only suggested correction for *turth* in the sample document was *tush* (a long pointed tooth, or Yiddish for but-tocks).

Sensible Speller

If your word-processing program stores its files by using Apple's PRO-DOS operating system, then this latest and most powerful version of Sensible Speller will work for you (see "Sensible Grammar" for a brief look at a use-

ful companion program). It works with AppleWorks, Apple Writer (Pro-DOS), Word Juggler, and MouseWord.

The spelling checker includes a fast and easy utility that you use to customize the program to work with your word-processing program. The package includes a program disk and an 80,000-word dictionary disk. You have the option of adding words to the main dictionary or creating your own dictionary disks. The program gives you a total word count for your document, as well as the number of unique words and the number of times each word appears.

When you begin correcting, your options are to add the highlighted word to the dictionary, ignore it, request a suggested spelling, look the word up in the program's dictionary, mark the word so you can find it later with the word processor, or correct the word by typing in a replacement.

The program allows you to scroll through its dictionary and also to use wild-card characters. Sensible Speller has two handy additional features. You can set it up to ignore characters such as embedded commands, acronyms (such as USA), and numbers. The program can also list all the words you've modified during the correction process with the new spellings listed opposite them. If you're a chronic misspeller, these lists can be quite helpful in curing your affliction. In fact, Sensible Speller rates very high as a valuable writers' tool, and I strongly recommend it to professionals.

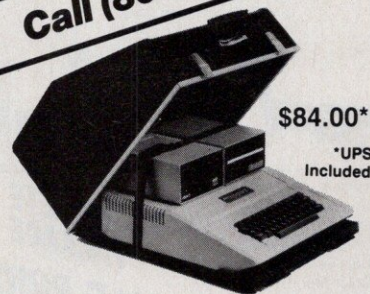
Spellworks

For use with AppleWorks exclusively, Spellworks contains a 90,000-word dictionary. The program has some major drawbacks, however. Spellworks is the only spelling checker in this group that doesn't display your misspelled words in context. It does display the words alone on the screen in the order they appear in your document or saves them to a Misspell file on your AppleWorks document disk. You must then return to AppleWorks and open the Misspell file, where the words are displayed in alphabetical order.

The inconvenience of this method is obvious. In order to make your corrections, you must manually compare your printed document to the list, look up the correct spellings in a printed dictionary, and then go back and make corrections. Furthermore, Spellworks doesn't help you find the correct spellings.

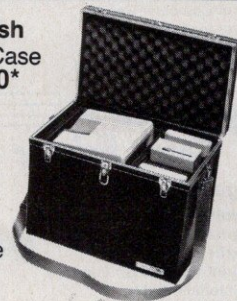

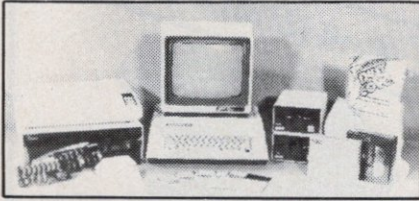

Webster's New World Spelling Checker

The Webster's program is compatible with ASCII text files, Apple Writer II, Bank Street Writer, HomeWord, Magic Window II, PIE Writer, and Screenwriter II. This program offers a 114,000-word dictionary and some unique and time-saving features.

First, it has four different "scan levels" for finding words in its sizable dictionary. If you make few spelling errors and typos, you can use the Manual scan, which rapidly searches the document for errors without suggesting alternate spellings. A Quick scan searches only in the general alphabetic vicinity of the word in question but does suggest alternate spellings. Full scan gives you the most thorough word search and is the most time-consuming. Automatic scan claims to use an artificial-intelligence technique for determining where to

search in the dictionary, based on the kinds of errors you've made in past documents.

Since I ran only one document through Webster's spelling checker, I can't say how accurate the artificial-intelligence technique is. But I will say that Webster's caught more errors in my sample document than any other spelling checker did, and the program was very good at suggesting the correct spelling. For instance, it was the only program to provide the correct spelling of *sledgehammer*. The program also catches double-word typos, such as *to to*.

Sensible Grammar

Sensible Software, maker of Sensible Speller, offers another writing aid many writers will find useful. Sensible Grammar catches most punctuation and spacing errors and singles out more than a thousand "misused phrases" with speed and precision. Unfortunately, its abilities as a grammar checker are not as extensive as you might wish and possibly never can be, given the complex set of rules that govern English grammar. Sensible Grammar's value simply depends on the types of mistakes you make and how frequently you make them.

Designed to be used with a mouse, Sensible Grammar works just as easily without one. The Check option is the heart of the program. With it you can check your document for punctuation errors, grammar errors, or both. In most cases, you will probably choose both, and when you do, Sensible Grammar loads the punctuation list and each of the error lists that you have selected. Next, you enter the name of the document to be checked, and Sensible Grammar begins its search, sentence by sentence, with a forward and backward motion, as it compares each sentence against its list of possible errors.

To help with the editing process, Sensible Grammar uses a series of

overlapping windows to indicate its location in your document. The rear window, whose left edge is only partially visible, traces the program's movement through the document, while sentences with problems appear in the front window. If the program tags a punctuation error, it offers you the options of ignoring it, marking it, or having the sentence and a description of the error sent to the printer. If it finds a grammatical error, you can also enter a correction or have the program suggest one. Editing continues until you've reviewed your entire document.

Advantages

Sensible Grammar singles out many common typographical errors, including words that have accidentally been typed twice in a row; single occurrences of brackets, quotation marks, or other punctuation marks normally used in pairs; and incorrect or inconsistent spacing adjacent to punctuation marks. It can even check to see whether commas are being overused and suggests semicolons as alternatives in some places.

Another group of Sensible Grammar options focuses on word and phrase selection. You can, for example, choose to include complex legal terms in your document or have them translated into simple English. Simi-

In addition, the Webster's program automatically replaces capital letters and punctuation and catches errors you make when you are typing replacement words. I highly recommend this program to professionals who demand high standards of accuracy in their writing.

WordPerfect

From the powerhouse of word-processing programs comes the added feature of an integrated spelling checker. The WordPerfect program contains a dictionary with more than 50,000 words and the option of adding more. You can create your own dictionaries if you have two disk drives.

The program gives you suggested spellings for words in your document it doesn't find in its dictionary, and you have the option of scrolling through the dictionary. Wild-card characters give you added leverage for

word searches, and the program alerts you if you type in a misspelled replacement word. It also spots double-word typos.

The spelling checker is a worthwhile addition to the king of word-processing programs, and you can upgrade your copy of WordPerfect to add the spelling checker for only \$30.

Cast a Spell

Spelling checkers add significantly to the advantages writers have already gained with word-processing programs. Although they are not a replacement for careful proofreading, if you're willing to spend the time required to run your documents through a spelling checker, you can be sure you'll get a much higher degree of accuracy in your work.

larly, contractions can be bypassed or changed into more formal English. Sensible Grammar also recognizes and corrects word groups that should be written as single words (e.g., *every thing, can not*) and vice versa (e.g., *alot* should be *a lot*).

The last feature is a wordy-phrase checker with a list of over a thousand awkward phrases and their alternatives, and although Sensible Grammar cannot detect disjointed thinking, the faulty phrases and superfluous words it identifies are often associated with such thinking. Replacing these phrases may clear up enough of a sentence's meaning to make additional editing simpler.

Disadvantages

Despite Sensible Grammar's capabilities, some people will find the program too limited. It cannot find misplaced words, poor sentence structure, or verbs in the wrong tense—each one of which is a violation of good grammar. A document you proofread with Sensible Grammar will still require careful reading before you can consider it error-free.

To use Sensible Grammar with a word-processing program, you must save your document as a text file, print out the corrections, and then enter each change individually with your word-processing program.

Sensible Grammar comes on a protected disk, thus leaving users dependent on Sensible Software for

backups. Sensible Software has plans, however, to provide a flow of updates. The manual is simple and well written—it keeps its promise of having you running the program in 15 minutes.

Individuals who have few problems with their writing or who are effective proofreaders will have little need for Sensible Grammar. If you are among the remaining majority, though, Sensible Grammar may be a useful tool for you.

A CONSTRUCTION SET FOR TEACHERS

Tutor-Tech makes creating instructional software fast and easy.

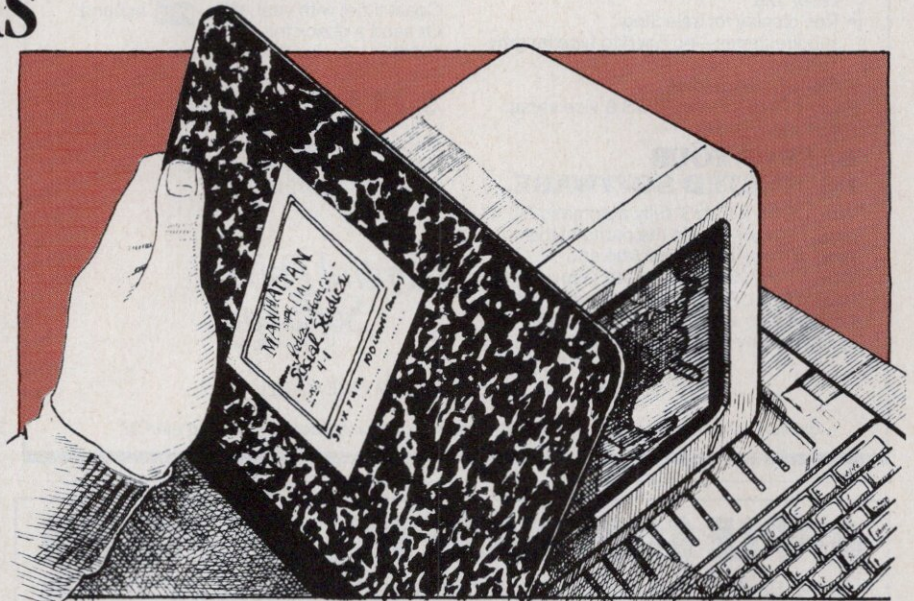
This January I came across a new "construction set" authoring system for the Apple IIe and IIc computers that deserves a close look by teachers interested in creating instructional software. This product is Tutor-Tech from Techware, Inc.

Tutor-Tech consists of a teacher's disk for creating lessons, a student disk for running them, and an optional grader disk for performing statistical analysis and creating grade reports from data captured automatically during lesson use. These three components are priced separately to allow purchases to be tailored to each classroom's specific needs.

Lessons you create with Tutor-Tech are organized around screens or "pages." Each lesson can contain graphic information as well as text. You ask students questions that they answer by "clicking" buttons (for multiple-choice responses) or by entering text from the keyboard.

Whenever a student clicks a button, the program jumps to a new screen that the teacher has previously chosen to be the destination for that button. Typed responses are analyzed to see if they match a predefined answer. The program then branches to one of two screens, depending on whether or not the student's answer was correct.

This ability to branch quickly through many pages of a lesson makes lesson construction easy. It does require advance lesson planning, however, so the teacher knows which page is the correct destination for each button click.



The Tutor-Tech buttons can do more than direct the program to a new screen. Three button types are available: neutral, plus, and minus. When a student clicks a neutral button, the only thing that happens is that a new page appears. A click on a

and paper showing, roughly, what will be on each screen and what should happen when each button is clicked.

Individual lessons can contain 250 pages, assuming you don't run out of memory first. You can build larger lessons from smaller ones by linking them together. This method solves any RAM-space problems that might otherwise occur.

To keep memory requirements to a minimum, Tutor-Tech pictures are built from graphic objects rather than from bit maps. This style of graphics (also found in MacDraw and Filevision, for example) allows the representation of complex pictures in little memory space.

Another Maclike aspect of this product is its use of pull-down menus and the mouse. (The mouse is necessary only for use with the teacher's disk—students can use cursor-control keys instead). The similarity to the Macintosh interface is so close that I was able to use this product within a few minutes of opening the package. Unfortunately, the lower resolution of

plus or minus button increases or decreases the student's score by one point and causes a jump to a new page. The score for each lesson accumulates automatically, and students can't tell the "value" of a button.

The Authoring Situation

Lesson creation with Tutor-Tech has two stages. The first entails the creation of a storyboard with pencil



the Apple II screen keeps the result from being as nice as a Mac image.

I built a simple ten-screen lesson about the solar system with this product. I created and tested the entire lesson in less than 30 minutes (mostly because I didn't worry about the quality of my artwork). I could never have created software this quickly with a traditional programming language.

Filevision Comparison

I couldn't help but think of Filevision while working with Tutor-Tech. The solar-system lesson was one I had also created with Filevision last year, using a feature that lets you link multiple Filevision screens together. The major difference between the two programs (other than their hardware) is that Filevision does not allow automatic scoring and that Tutor-Tech lacks highlighting and database features.

Editing is much easier with Macintosh-based products such as MacDraw and Filevision than it is with the Tutor-Tech program. I wish this program had an optional alignment grid, for example.

You can't relocate a Tutor-Tech graphic once you've drawn it on the screen. On the other hand, a sequential Undo feature lets you take a picture apart, piece by piece, until the screen is blank. If you place an object in the wrong location, you can erase it and add a new one without disturbing any other parts of the screen—not a bad trade-off.

Tutor-Tech's main contribution is that it allows teachers to concentrate purely on the lesson itself, without having to worry about the mechanics of programming, which is what the creation of computer-assisted lessons should be about! **+**

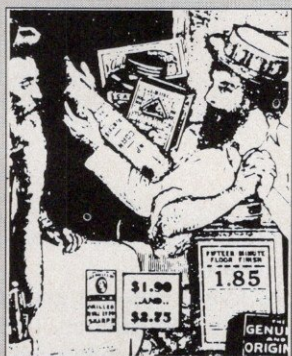

About a fourth of the entrants claimed there was no solution to the March puzzle. To them I say add and then multiply these numbers: 1.20, 1.25, 1.50, 3.16. Where these folks went wrong was in using real numbers instead of integers. (By the way, phoning the *A+* office to press your claims won't do you much good, since I'm hardly ever there.)

Another fourth came up with solutions such as 2.41, 1.15, 2.54, and 1.01, which produces 7.1100061. Close, but surely the clerk would have noticed when his desk calculator came up with a total with more than two decimal places.

Programs that solved the puzzle ran from as long as eight hours to just under one second, that from Jeffrey Zarkin of East Lyme, Connecticut, the March winner. He examined only multiples of the prime factors of 711,000,000 (79,5,5,5,5,5,3,3,2,2,2,2,2,2). He specified one number, Z, a multiple of 79 less than 9 (since $79 \times 9 = 711$) and not equal to 7 (that not being a prime factor) in lines 120-150. Five being a prime factor six times meant that one other number must be a multiple of 25, less than $711-Z$, and a multiple of the primes. In other words, 711,000,000 divided by $Z \times Y$ produces an integer (160-200). With Z and Y determined, two simultaneous equations must be solved: $X \times Y = 711000000 / Y \times Z$ and $X + Y = 711 - (Y + Z)$, which merge into one quadratic equation, $X \times X - S \times X + Q = 0$. After finding an acceptable solution, the program

returns to search all possible solutions, finding two (which are the same with a different order).

The cleverness of the programmer, rather than of the program, reduced a search of hundreds of billions of possibilities to 104, which is how it could

run so fast.

Phil Noble, of Weed, California, gets an honorable mention for the most improved program. His first program took more than 52 minutes. He followed with a second entry that ran in 27 seconds. **+**

ity to drag bodies around and the failure to follow a guy (perhaps Dee) who walks right by you, make me wonder, though. Another example, "push Fred out of the Turbolift," translates as *press Fred* (like a button on a console). Maybe I was press-



ing Fred's belly button by mistake.

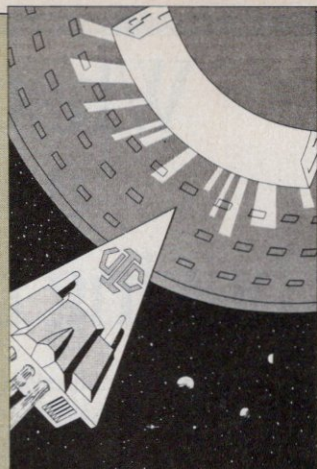
Essex was delayed beyond its original release date. Evidently, the program had a few problems. Not all of them seem to be fixed. For instance, after uncovering the Vollchon spy (on the bridge no less), I knocked him out and then hit him again. The program informed me, "The spy lies here out of commission."

"I'm going to kill you," the spy says calmly. Before I could type a character, the poison-fanged spy bit me. Nothing like a surprise to shake up a cruise.

Nevertheless, the prose proves to be well written and fairly descriptive. The interplay between you and a tour group is entertaining and enlightening (at

least the first few times you play). You should pay attention to the ceaseless chatter. Some of the off-hand comments conceal clues. Another good idea is to question each member of the tour group about the other tour members.

Essex is a good adventure game but not a great one. Although portions of it stimulate your imagination, often you find yourself wandering aimlessly. The pace of your achievements, at least compared to their speed in Mindwheel and Brimstone (the first and third Electronic Novels from Synapse/Brøderbund), is slow. Die-hard science-fiction gamers might find Essex interesting. In fact, I would go so far as to liken it to a B-grade cult movie. Most



of you will probably want to pass it by, however, in favor of the excellent Mindwheel or Brimstone.

hacking around. Fortunately, you get a card of the most common commands to put next to your keyboard. It all takes a little bit of getting used to, but it's worth the effort; once you get the hang of it, it's practically addictive.

The good news here is that you have all the facilities of the *Enterprise* at your disposal: transporters; communicators; tricorders; phasers; computers; and, of course, the ever-popular photon torpedoes. The turbolift can take you to any part of the ship, although you'll probably have to draw yourself a map.

The bad news is that there are a lot of ways to die in *The Kobayashi Alternative*. In the original "Star Trek" episodes, there was never any doubt who was going to live and who was going to die. For instance, if Kirk, Spock, McCoy, and Crewman Newman (who we've never seen in any other episode before) were all to beam down to the surface of a strange alien planet, it was no secret at all who was going to be eaten by the Great Ghastly Green Globber—and usually before the first commercial.

No, it was never Kirk, Spock, or McCoy who got an on-site inspection of the Ghastly Green Globber's alimentary canal. Or, if one of them somehow had the bad luck to die in the middle of the show, the others found a way to resurrect him before the final fadeout—or at least in the next movie.

Unfortunately for the Officer Candidates playing *The Kobayashi Alternative*, this simulation is not as forgiving. Here,



when Kirk makes a mistake, it's Kirk who dies.

Blessed be the programmers—there are all kinds of great ways to die, such as beaming into the center of a mountain. And in this simulation, death is for keeps. There are no convenient reincarnations, resurrections, or friendly alien supergods to put you back together and into the game so you can keep on going.

The disk won't self-destruct, though, so you do get an unlimited number of second chances—if you're willing to start at the beginning again. If nothing else, this game will teach you caution!

Two commands are most valuable to a new player. The first is Scan. You cannot possibly do too much scanning. Every piece of information is valuable—if not for winning the game, then certainly for your survival.

The second command you already know. It goes like this (in unison now): "Scotty! BEAM US UP!"

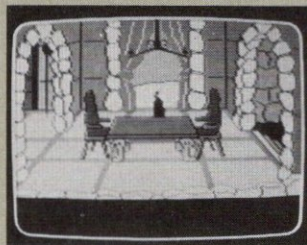

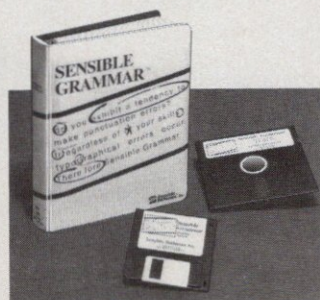
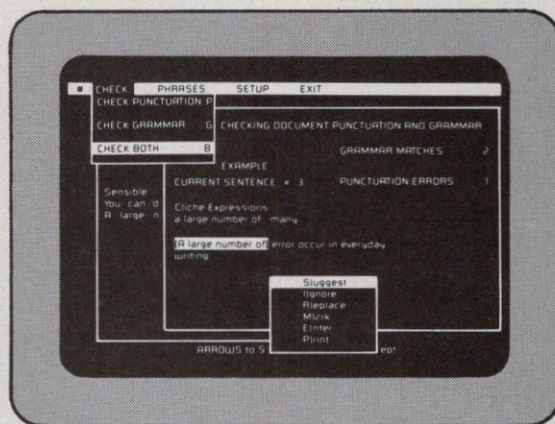

Speaking of Graphics

GRAPHICS PROGRAMS FOR KIDS

Rainbow Painter, Picture Writer, Color Me, and Designer's Pencil

Graphics programs are wonderful tools for introducing children (and adults) to computers, and a gaggle of Apple II graphics programs are intended for young people. This month, we look at four of them.

Rainbow Painter

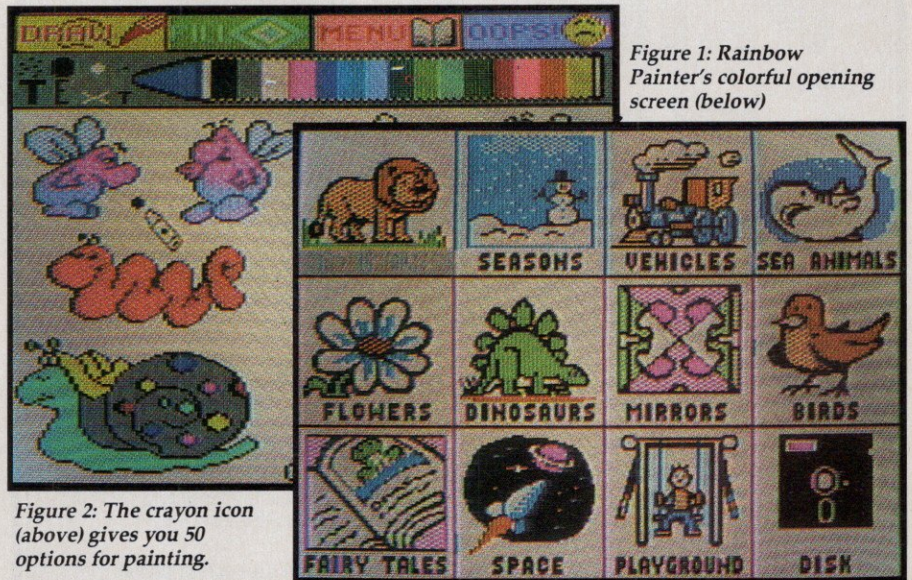


Figure 1: Rainbow Painter's colorful opening screen (below)

This full-featured paint utility operates with a joystick or with the keyboard. The program opens with a colorful screen of icons (see figure 1). Click on Playground to draw on a blank screen, Mirrors to create kaleidoscope-type images, or any of the other ten icons to open "books" of predrawn black-and-white images for coloring.

Once you've made your selection, the "playground" appears, with icons at the bottom of the screen. Clicking on the rabbit in a hat opens a window of drawing options such as line, box, and so on. The crayon icon opens a box of 49 brushes to paint with, plus FILL (see figure 2). A paint-bucket icon lets you cycle through 99 colors and patterns, and the book icon pages through the four images in your selected coloring book.

Other icons allow you to edit patterns; undo your last move; access new picture libraries; and load, save, and print pictures.

Rainbow Painter offers as many options as most "adult" graphics programs do. It is a wonderful program for any child—up to the age of 90.

Picture Writer

Picture Writer, comparable to Penguin Software's Graphics Magician (see "The Graphics Magician," A +,

May 1984, and "Seeing Double," A +, January 1985), records the steps you use in creating a graphic. The program then redraws the completed picture, step by step. You can store finished pictures as "process" pictures (in which the drawing steps are

saved) or as standard 34-sector pictures.

As you draw with Picture Writer, you can compose music. Pressing M plays a note for most drawing steps. The higher the step is on the screen, the higher the note. In the Music

mode, R redraws the picture with the music accompaniment. Young people can have fun drawing designs that play distinctive tunes.

Unfortunately, we can't recommend Picture Writer. The menu icons are too small, and the user interface is cumbersome. Instead of selecting an icon with the joystick, you must use the keyboard—e.g., C for color, then 5, and 5 again for solid blue. Five for blue? Apple colors have numbers: 1 is green, 6 is blue, and so on. Every graphics program we've seen adheres to this scheme. If they must use numbers to select colors, we'd want our children to learn Apple's numbers.

If you want to introduce children to step-by-step drawing, show them the professional's Graphics Magician—it may not have music, but it's easier to use than Picture Writer.

Color Me

With an enhanced Apple IIe or a IIc and a joystick, KoalaPad, or mouse, even very young children can

experience the joy of using red, yellow, and 14 other colors, with Color Me, a double-hi-res graphics program.

The palette, one of the cleverest we've seen, is displayed as a striped crayon. Selecting a colored stripe chooses the drawing color, and the tip of the crayon changes to that color. You use the crayon to draw, fill, and enter text. Other options include Undo, Magnify, Cut and Paste, and Print.

For a children's program, Color Me

packs a surprising wallop: It includes two active graphics pages to allow easy cutting and pasting between different pictures. This feature, com-

bined with supplemental Color Me picture disks, encourages kids to put together good-looking pictures.

Color Me is a wonderful program for children (assuming the adults are finished playing with it).

Designer's Pencil

Designer's Pencil is a graphics programmer's toolkit, not a paint program. It features more than 30 commands that, when you put them in the right order and give them the correct parameters, produce a graphic. The program draws the pictures as you watch. The range and power of Designer's Pencil is impressive. It has commands to draw lines, arcs, and circles; fill; make kaleidoscopes; alter the speed of drawing; and so on. The program also includes simple music commands.

Like many programs that were originally created for Atari or Commodore computers, Designer's Pencil was designed to work with switch-style joysticks (up, down, left, right), rather than the Apple joystick's rheostat mechanism. Therefore, using an Apple joystick is awkward. If you don't have a joystick attached to your computer, you can use the keyboard, but if a joystick is attached, the program automatically accesses it. We would have preferred an option to select keyboard input, even if a joystick were connected.

The user interface is clumsy. The screen is divided into four major areas, and to move from one section of the screen to another, you must position your cursor correctly. For example, you must enter the master command area from the middle of the screen. To enter a command into the programming area, you select it from the rightmost window. Moving from window to window is distracting. Also, you don't see the results of your program until you enter the master command area and issue a RUN command—novices will have trouble conceptualizing the results of command arguments.

The programming language of Designer's Pencil includes variables, labels, GOTOs, and recursion. The instruction manual describes the language features, but we doubt that a child or a beginner could tap its power without a lot of work.

We like the idea of using graphics to teach programming, but such an effort might better be directed at learning BASIC or Instant Pascal; with these languages you can see the

The Macintosh Section

Last month we saw that a complete 68000 instruction is made up of an instruction mnemonic and up to two operands that tell the 68000 where to find data to work with and where to store results. To review, the general form of a two-operand instruction, such as MOVE, is:

MOVE source_operand,dest_operand

A location to be used by an instruction is called an effective address and can be a memory location or an internal register specifically referred to in the instruction, or can be a memory location calculated by the addition of as many as three different quantities. The availability of so many different ways to access data permits you to write efficient and powerful programs.

You tell the 68000 how to calculate an effective address by specifying an addressing mode for each operand an instruction uses.

You can use 12 fundamental addressing modes with the 68000. The assembler formats for these modes (as suggested by Motorola, the designer of the 68000) are summarized in figure 1, as are the effective-address calculations for each mode. Be aware, however, that not all instructions can use each addressing mode. To determine which are permitted, you'll have to consult the detailed description for the instructions in question in the Motorola reference manuals.

Let's now look at each of the addressing modes.

PROGRAMMING

A few 68000 instructions don't require you to specify all operands, because the "missing" operands are implicit to the instruction. The implicit operand usually involves the program counter, the stack pointer, or the status register.

For example, when you use the JMP (jump) instruction, the only operand you have to specify represents the target address of the jump. You don't have to indicate that this address is to transfer into the program counter: this requirement is implicit.

Immediate

An immediate operand is a numeric constant that forms part of the one to five words each 68000 instruction occupies. Its location within the instruction is the effective address.

The assembler format for the Immediate addressing mode is #number, where number represents an absolute number or a

symbolic label for a number. The # symbol preceding the number is very important; if you don't include it, the instruction will assemble as if the operand were an address, rather than a constant, so the program won't work properly. Examples of immediate operands are:

#45	;decimal 45
#\$2D	;hex 2D (45)
#mySize	;symbol

Notice that hexadecimal numbers are preceded by a \$ character.

Data Register Direct

When you use this addressing mode, the operand is simply one of

the eight data registers, D0–D7. To select this mode when you write a program, refer to the data register as Dn (n = 0–7). Here are some simple examples of how to use the Data Register Direct addressing mode:

```
MOVE #4,D0    ;4 -> D0.W
CLR.L D4      ;0 -> D4.L
```

When you use the Data Register Direct addressing mode, you can deal with operands that are three different sizes: byte, word, and long word. To indicate the size of the operand, you attach one of the following suffixes to the standard instruction mnemonic:

```
.B (byte)
.W (word)
.L (long word)
```

When you specify a suffix, the instruction uses only the first 8 (byte), 16 (word), or 32 bits (long word) of the data register. If you don't do so, your assembler will assume it's dealing with a word operation.

Address Register Direct

The operand here is one of the eight address registers, A0–A7. You refer to an address register by a name of this form to select the Direct addressing mode. (A7 is usually referred to as SP, for *stack pointer*.)

Here's an example of how to load the address with the label Record into the address register A0:

```
LEA Record,A0
```

Although you don't have to store addresses in an address register, you will often use them for that purpose so you can take advantage of the 68000's powerful Address Register Indirect addressing modes. You typically use these modes after first storing the base address of a data structure in an address register—you can't use the indirect modes with data registers.

Address Register Indirect

The operand here is one of the eight address registers, but the effective

address that instructions act on is the address stored in the register, not the register itself. To indicate this addressing mode, you enclose the name of the address register in parentheses. The assembler format for this addressing mode is (An).

Here are two examples:

```
MOVE.L    #4,(A3)
MOVE      D0,(A2)
```

You should be careful not to confuse this indirect mode with the Direct mode, in which data is read from or written to the register itself. Whenever you see the parentheses, think "contents of."

Address Register Indirect with Post-Increment

This addressing mode is quite similar to the Address Register Indirect mode, except that after the processor uses the effective address, it increments the number in the address register by 1 (for a byte operation), 2 (for a word operation), or 4 (for a long

word operation). You designate this addressing mode by placing parentheses around the name of the address register, followed by a plus sign to indicate the post-increment operation: $(A_n)+$.

The Post-Increment addressing mode is particularly useful when you're moving ranges of memory from one place to another, because you don't have to follow each move with extra instructions to increment the base pointers for the two blocks. For example, consider the instruction

```
MOVE      (A0)+,(A1)+
```

If you execute this instruction ten times in a row, the 68000 will move the ten words beginning at the initial address stored in A0 to a block beginning at the initial address stored in A1. After each word moves, the address registers increment by two (it's a word operation), so that you're automatically ready to move the next word.

Post-increment addressing is also handy for removing ("popping") data that you pass onto the 68000's hardware stack, as we will see at the end of this article.

Address Register Indirect with Pre-Decrement

This addressing mode is primarily for adding items to the hardware stack. You designate it by placing a minus sign before the name of an address register enclosed in parentheses: $-(A_n)$.

The 68000 calculates the effective address by first decrementing the contents of the address register by 1 (for a byte operation), by 2 (for a word operation), or by 4 (for a long-word operation). The address it acts on is the new address in the register.

Address Register Indirect with Displacement

The 68000 calculates the effective address here by adding a 16-bit word with a plus or minus sign (a "sign-extended" word) to the address stored in an address register. The assembler format for this addressing mode is $d16(A_n)$, where $d16$ represents a number from -32768 to 32767 , or a symbolic label for such a number. If you use a number or label, do not precede it with #, as you would do if you were using the Immediate addressing mode.

This addressing mode is typically for accessing a specific item in a data

structure whose base address is stored in the address register. For example, if there's a data structure beginning at location Addresses in your program, and you want to read the third word in the structure, you could use the instructions

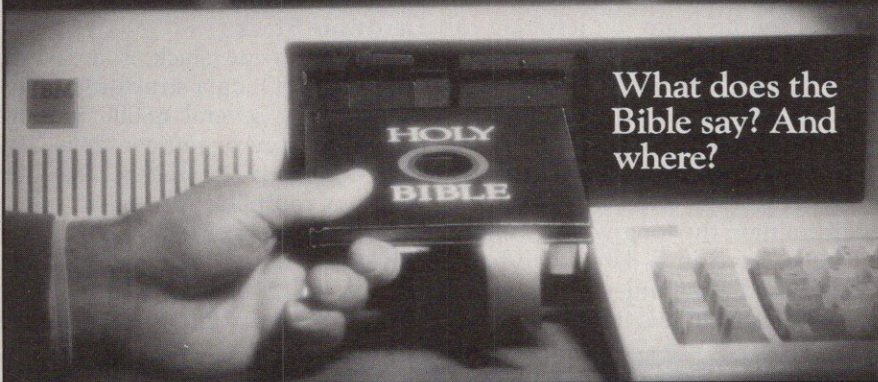
```
LEA      Addresses,A0
MOVE     4(A0),D0
```

As we'll see next month, you'll be using this addressing mode quite often on the Macintosh, because any variables you define within the program must always be referenced as displacements from the address stored in the A5 register. So, for example, if you call your variable MyRecord, a MyRecord(A5) operand gives its base address, and the address of the third word in the data structure is MyRecord+4(A5).

Address Register Indirect with Index

The 68000 calculates the effective address for this addressing mode by adding together the number stored in an address register, an index stored in another address register or a data register (sign-extended word or long word), and an 8-bit, sign-extended, displacement byte. This mode is the

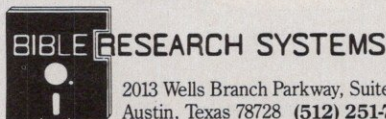

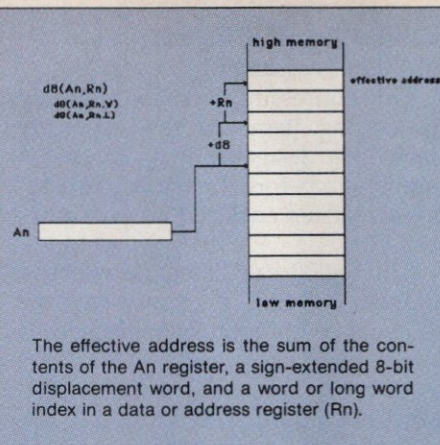


Figure 2: Address Register Indirect with Index addressing mode

most complex of the 68000's addressing modes, but, as you can see from figure 2, it is not too difficult to visualize what is happening.

The assembler format for this mode is $d8(An,Rn)$, where Rn represents the data or address register being used as the index register and $d8$ represents an eight-bit number or a symbolic label for the number. In order to indicate whether the index register is a word or a long word, you add a $.W$ or $.L$ suffix to the Rn name in the instruction; examples are $D3.L$, $A0.W$, and $D2.W$. If you don't specify a suffix, the assembler assumes a word index. Note that since the displacement byte is only eight bits long, the displacement range is from -128 to $+127$. (The base point is the word following the first word of the instruction.)

This indexed addressing mode is useful when you're working with a group of fixed-length records. To access any record in the group, you first store the address of the first record (record 0) in an address register, then multiply the record number you want by the number of bytes in the record, and store the result in the index register. When you access the record, you can use the displacement byte to step to the field in the record in which you are interested.

Absolute

The effective address for the Absolute addressing mode is the specific address that is stored in the instruction bytes. The assembler format is $abcdef$ —i.e., a six-digit hexadecimal number (or a symbolic label).

Note that if you use a label that refers to a position within your application program, Macintosh assemblers use the Program Counter with Displacement addressing mode instead.

Program Counter with Displacement

The effective address is the sum of

the address in the program-counter register and a sign-extended, 16-bit displacement word.

The assembler format is $label(PC)$ or $label$, where $label$ represents the symbolic label for a position within the program. The assembler automatically determines what the displacement between the program counter and the labeled position will be and puts it into the executable object code for the program. You should never have to calculate it yourself.

Program Counter with Displacement is a very important addressing mode on the Macintosh because all the programs you write must be relocatable (that is, able to run at any position in memory)—no part of the program may refer to an absolute location if that location is within the body of the program. By referring to addresses in a relative way, the operating system can load and run the program anywhere it wants.

Program Counter with Index

The effective address for this mode is the sum of the address in the program counter, the long word or sign-extended word in a data or address register used as an index, and a sign-extended eight-bit displacement byte.

The assembler format is $label(PC,Rn)$, where Rn represents the data or address register being used as the index and $label$ represents the location of another instruction in the program. The assembler converts this location into an eight-bit offset from the value of the program counter.

As with the Address Register Indirect with Index Mode, the index register can be a word or a long word. Use the $.W$ or $.L$ suffix to identify its size.

The Program Counter with Index Addressing Mode requires one extension word. The first byte contains information relating to the index register and its size. The second byte contains the eight-bit displacement. Note that since the displacement byte is only eight bits long, the displacement range is from -128 to $+127$. (The base point is the word following the operation word.) Thus, the data structure you're indexing into must be quite close to the instruction.

The Program Counter with Index addressing mode is quite similar to the Address Register Indirect with Index that we looked at earlier. In fact, it's possible to write code to access records in a data structure that uses either addressing mode. The advantage of using the Program Counter with Index mode is that you don't "waste" an address register for storage of the base address. The disadvantage is that the base address must be within the range the eight-bit displacement byte provides.

Hardware Stack

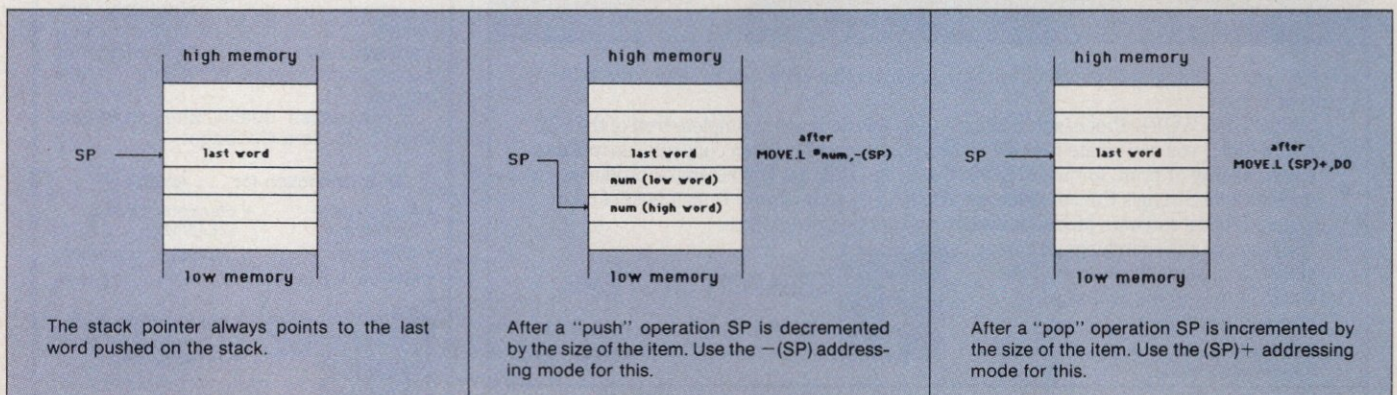


Figure 3: The 68000 stack and stack pointer. The address at the top of the stack is stored in the current stack-pointer register, SP.

The hardware stack is a last-in, first-out (LIFO) data structure implicitly used by several 68000 instructions that store or retrieve data. The LIFO characteristic means that the last item you place (or "push") onto the stack is the first item removed (or "pulled") from it. Figure 3 shows what a stack looks like and where data is pushed onto it and pulled

from it. The address of the top of the stack (the address of the last item pushed onto the stack) is stored in the current stack-pointer register, SP (the A7 register). The Macintosh operating system initializes its value when you start up.

When you push data onto the stack, the 68000 first decrements the stack pointer by the size of the data and then stores the data at the address stored in the stack pointer. Note that since the processor decrements the stack pointer when you place something onto the stack, the stack grows downward in memory.

The most common instructions that implicitly push data onto the hardware stack are JSR and BSR, which push long-word addresses (of the following instruction) before calling a subroutine.

When you pop data from the stack, the stack pointer increments by the size of the data. The most common instruction that implicitly pops data from the hardware stack is RTS—it pops addresses a JSR or BSR instruction has pushed there. It pops into the program counter, so that processing continues with the instruction following the original JSR or BSR.

You can explicitly use the stack for temporary data storage by using the SP Indirect with Pre-Decrement addressing mode, -(SP), to place data onto the stack. When you want to remove data, you can use the corresponding post-increment addressing mode, (SP)+. We're going to see next month that most of the internal ROM subroutines used on the Macintosh to perform standard operations are accessed by passing parameters on the stack using the pre-decrement addressing mode; function results are retrieved from the stack using the Post-Increment addressing mode.

The hardware stack can be positioned anywhere in memory, but you usually place it near the top of the available RAM space to leave as large a space as possible for program use.

Well, that's it for this month. Next month we'll see how to generate a simple 68000 program with the assembler tools in the Macintosh 68000 Development System (MDS). +

ACCOUNTING SYSTEMS

SOFTWARE BY RUSEL DEMARIA

"Pegboard" accounting systems have been popular with small businesses for many years. They are also called one-write systems because they are designed to post information to several places at once. For instance, when you write a check, the carbon paper transfers the information to a

Payable modules. Remarkably, the entire program comes on one disk. The program requires either a second floppy-disk drive or a hard disk for data, depending on the amount of information involved. You can use Plains & Simple to run one or more companies.

Plains & Simple is extensively icon-oriented, a wonderful adapta-

manual includes an excellent tutorial that uses the sample information that comes on the disk.

Visually, Plains & Simple is just like a paper ledger system (see figure 2). You post all transactions on a grid that looks like a piece of paper. You can add or remove accounts from the display at any time. Although you can display your entire chart of accounts, you will probably limit the display to the accounts you deal with most frequently. You can scroll quickly to accounts that are off the screen by using the Tab key or the horizontal scroll bar.

Plains & Simple comes with 27 sample charts of accounts, ranging from service stations to medical offices (with real-estate agencies, restaurants, general retail outlets, and others in between). The 27 charts have enough variety to assure that most small businesses will find one that suits their needs with little or no modification. You can also choose which accounts will appear on summary reports.

Plains & Simple is a versatile system. For instance, you can enter transactions directly from the appropriate monthly journal or from one of the customer or vendor cards. In either case, the transaction posts to both places. You can also apply payments selectively to invoices. Because the program is all on one disk, all in-

cash-disbursements ledger and also to a ledger card for the vendor or recipient of the check. The same principles apply to the recording of receivables.

Now computer programmers are discovering how naturally the pegboard system fits into computerized accounting. Two fine examples for the Macintosh are Plains & Simple from Great Plains and MacOneWrite from Sierra On-Line.

Plains & Simple

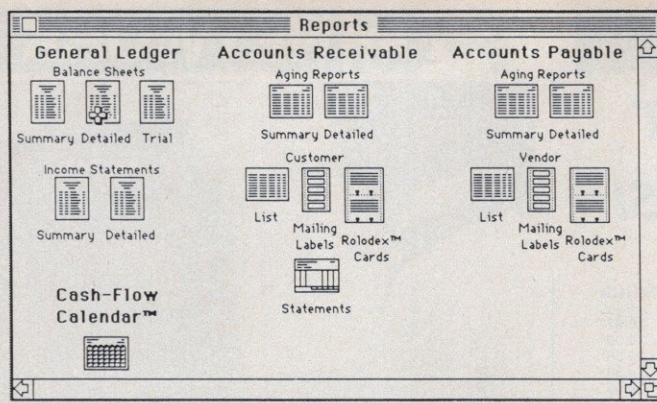


Figure 1: Plains & Simple's Reports menu screen

Plains & Simple is a fully integrated one-write accounting program, that includes General Ledger, Accounts Receivable, and Accounts

tion of the Macintosh operating environment. You begin work from a central screen divided into three parts: G/L, A/R, and A/P (see figure 1). By selecting the appropriate icon, you can open up Chart of Accounts, General Ledger, General Journal, Sales/Cash Receipts or Purchases-/Cash Disbursements Journals, Customer or Vendor Cards, Company Information, and Reports.

Although the Plains & Simple manual does a good job of guiding you in the use of the program, it stresses often that you should leave the initial setup to someone well versed in accounting principles. The

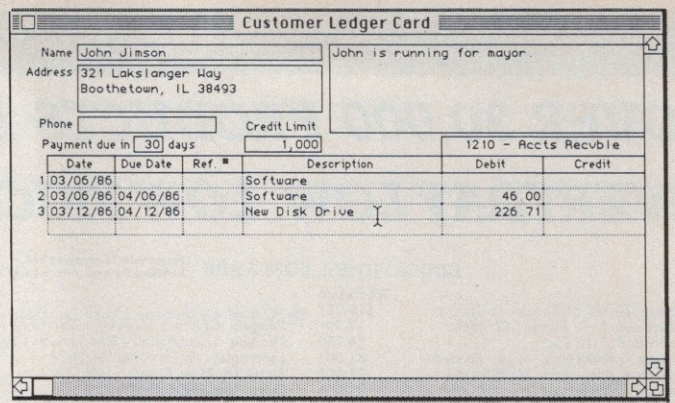


Figure 2: A customer ledger card from Plains & Simple

formation integrates automatically, and reports are up to date.

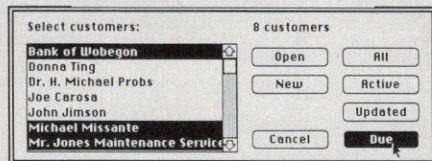


Figure 3: Choosing a customer ledger card with Plains & Simple. Note the choices and the highlighted entries under Due.

You can also add new customer or vendor cards at any time (even during transactions), or you can use a special miscellaneous classification for a one-time customer or vendor. When you select customers or vendors, you can select from Active, Due, Updated, all cards, or one individual card (see figure 3). Once you have made the selection, you can page from one card to another at will. You can set credit limits and terms on the cards. If you enter a transaction that exceeds a credit limit, the program alerts you.

Numerous effort-saving features make Plains & Simple a joy to use. For instance, the first time you enter a date in a particular journal, you might enter the month and day (the program adds slashes for you). After thus establishing the month, you need only type the day. You can add a transaction for the wrong month, but the program will warn you before proceeding.

Typing part of a customer or vendor name is sufficient; the program displays the appropriate list, highlighting the closest match. The Auto Enter feature lets you balance any transaction automatically—Plains & Simple doesn't allow unbalanced transactions.

MacOneWrite

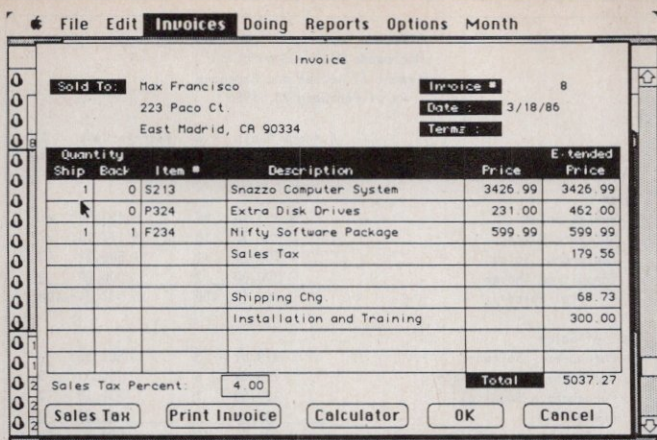


Figure 4: A detailed invoice screen from MacOneWrite

Sierra On-Line first introduced the Cash Disbursements module of MacOneWrite in June 1985. Since then

the company has added an Accounts Receivable module and a General Ledger. A Payroll module is still under development. MacOneWrite carries the pegboard metaphor about as far as it can be carried on a computer—down to the pegs themselves and the holes in the ledger paper (see figure 4). If you are already familiar with pegboard systems, you should feel right at home.

The three existing modules of MacOneWrite come on three separate disks; the system works well with any configuration, from a single disk drive to a hard disk. Although each module is independent and Accounts Receivable can integrate with Cash Disbursements, the best way to use MacOneWrite is with all three modules. You use the General Ledger to enter transactions not applicable to the other modules, to integrate data, and to produce most final reports.

Each module has its own accounts file. The C/D and A/R modules can share the same accounts file (on a hard disk or external disk drive), but the G/L accounts file is more extensive and also includes budgets and a user-definable category for groupings on balance sheets and income statements. This ability to group accounts allows you to control the output of

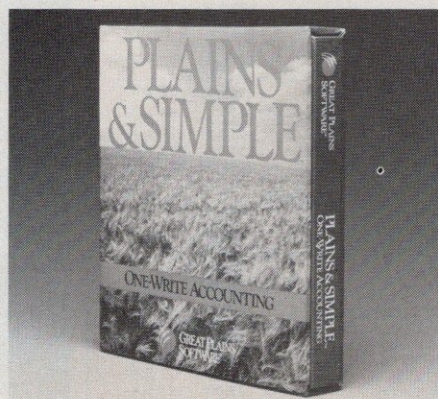
your reports and group all accounts appropriately. The C/D module can produce limited reports, but you cannot control groupings or display budget information with it.

Each module comes with a clear, informative manual and some sample files. The G/L manual even includes some basic accounting information that might be handy for novices.

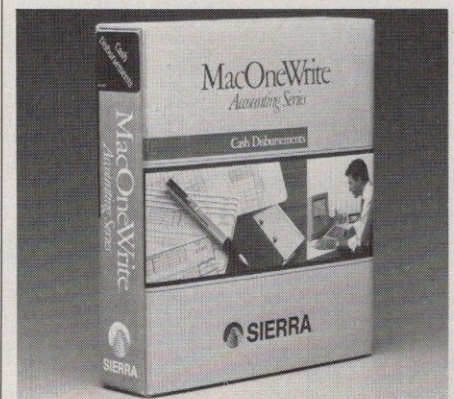
You can call up your chart of accounts any time. Normally you fill in accounts by account number, but if you can't remember the number, you can call up the chart, highlight the desired account, and insert it automatically into the current journal.

Even better news is that you can set default accounts for various kinds of transactions in A/R journals. For instance, for invoices you might always disburse the transactions to your Sales and your Tax Liability accounts. For recording payments, you might use the main Cash in Bank account and, perhaps, Discounts Allowed. Thus you avoid having to reenter account numbers. Unfortunately, the C/D module does not include the default-account feature.

In the A/R and C/D journals, you select from a pull-down menu the kind of transaction (invoice, payment, credit memo, and the like) that you

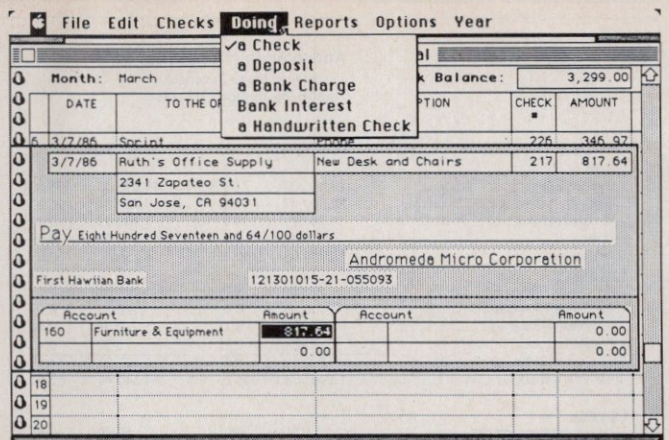


Figure 5: A cash-disbursements transaction with MacOneWrite

want. This selection stays in effect until you change it. Fortunately, you can begin an invoice, for instance; find that you meant to enter a payment; and change the choice without losing the information you've already entered (assuming you haven't posted the transaction yet).

Most transactions automatically use the system date or the most recently used date, and the program warns you when you try to enter a transaction for the wrong month. As you split transactions, the program

always displays a running total and prevents you from entering unbalanced transactions. If you need to do some extra figuring, the Mac calculator is always available (as it is in Plains & Simple).

You can selectively link payments with invoices by using a special column on the customer card, into which you can place any one-letter code. Items with matching codes will be associated. Thus, to apply a payment selectively to a specific invoice, you label both the payment and the

invoice with the same code.

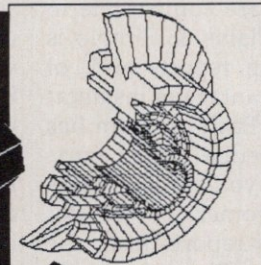
Although you can enter sales transactions without having a detailed invoice, the invoice screen is excellent (see figure 4). The invoice automatically displays totals accumulated from unit prices, calculates the sales tax (at the rate you determine), and produces the grand total. Also, you can mark back-ordered items and add any other charges or credits necessary (before or after calculating the tax). You can then print the invoice on a standard invoice form.

You can also print checks with MacOneWrite and/or record manually written checks (see figure 5). The system remembers which checks it has not yet printed and prints them out when you are ready.

MacOneWrite automatically posts transactions to customer and vendor cards in the system. By calling up one of these cards, you can see at a glance all of that particular client's or vendor's activities. When entering names onto invoices or checks, you need type only part of the name, and the program fills in the rest. You can also print out a full A/R journal or an aged A/R journal at any time (even in the middle of a transaction) and add customer and/or vendor cards. When printing customer statements, you can add specified late charges on all balances over a certain age. You can also specify balance forward only or open items on the statement.

Finally, the MacOneWrite G/L lets you produce a SYLK file for use with Macintosh spreadsheet programs such as Excel or the Jazz spreadsheet module. Such a spreadsheet file contains all the proper labels, the entire chart of accounts, and all the data for up to two years.

Comparisons

Two significant differences distinguish Plains & Simple and MacOneWrite from each other. First, MacOneWrite does not have a full Accounts Payable module—it has Cash Disbursements, but no aging of accounts payable. In contrast, Plains

& Simple has a full A/P journal.

The second significant difference is that MacOneWrite comes on three separate disks, and Plains & Simple is all on one. On a hard disk, this distinction becomes fairly meaningless, but with floppies it makes a noticeable difference. On the other hand, you can use MacOneWrite with a single floppy-disk drive, and with Plains & Simple you cannot.

Both programs are comparable in speed, although Plains & Simple is faster at producing reports and, of course, has the advantage of instantaneous integration. Each program has features that expedite data entry. MacOneWrite lets you call up charts of accounts, customer or vendor cards, and various reports from the transactions screens; Plains & Simple does not. On the other hand Plains & Simple allows you to work directly on a customer or vendor card, and MacOneWrite doesn't.

The two programs also differ in their reporting setup. Plains & Simple displays all reports on the screen first and allows you to scroll forward and backward through reports. Often you don't have to print a report at all. MacOneWrite can display reports on the screen as well, but you can only page forward through them—you can't go back. Also, the visual appeal of the Plains & Simple reports is generally superior to that of MacOneWrite's (see figure 6).

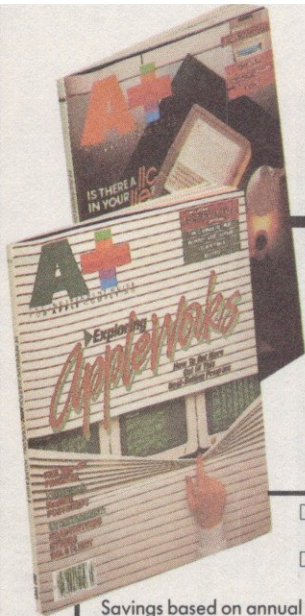
Plains & Simple can print any journal (the format can be quite wide,

since you can print sideways on the paper); charts of accounts; summary detailed, and trial balance sheets; summary and detailed income statements; summary and detailed aging reports for both A/R and A/P; checks; master lists, mailing labels, and Rolodex cards for customers and vendors; and aged invoices with open items or balance forward for customers. Moreover, you don't even need special forms, because the program can print lines and boxes on the invoices if you wish. Finally, Plains & Simple has a special report called the Cash Flow Calendar (see figure 7). It displays a month at a time, with three numbers on each day: receivables due, payments due, and running bank balance. At a glance, you can tell a lot about your liquid assets over time and make informed decisions about upcoming purchases, tax payments, or other financial events.

MacOneWrite can print journals; aged A/R reports; balance sheets

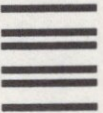

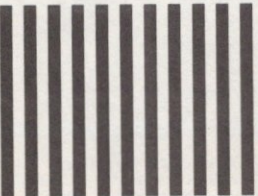

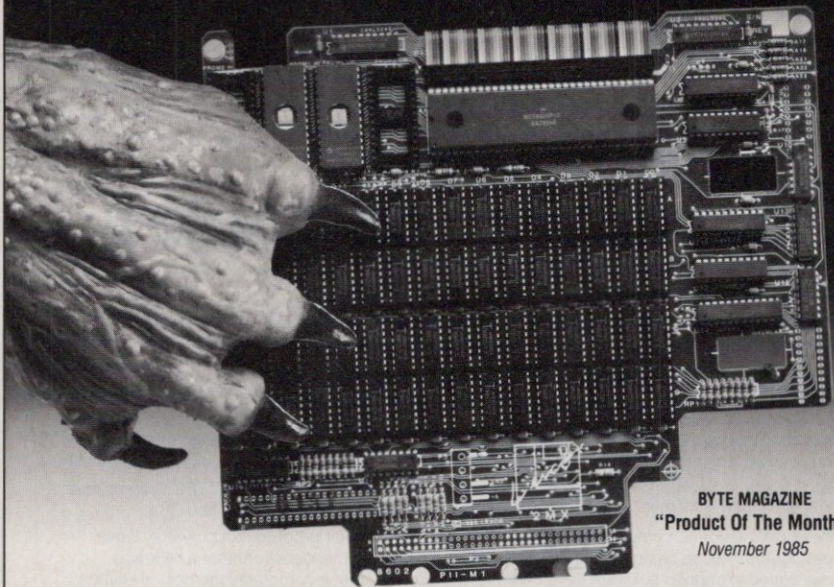
with or without budgets; trial balances; income statements with or without budgets; report-groupings lists; detailed invoices and/or statements; sales slips for cash sales; mailing labels; checks; master customer or vendor lists; vendor year-to-date lists; charts of accounts; and a special year-end report (see figure 8).

Both programs can automatically reverse an erroneous entry, and both keep an unalterable audit trail. You may encounter minor problems when you make accounting errors, but both programs catch errors in most cases before they cause any confusion. Although they do not completely protect you from the chaotic effects of sloppy or erroneous accounting, they can help immeasurably. These are excellent programs and provide error-free performance when you use them intelligently.

The two programs differ somewhat in the general ledger. MacOneWrite erases all general-journal entries after first printing and then posting them. Plains & Simple keeps all general journals intact and also makes special use of the general ledger. By examining the general ledger, you can review summaries of any transactions for any date, for any account you select. If you want to see the detail of a transaction, you can open a special Zoomed Journal that displays the transactions that occurred on a certain date that affect the specified account. This feature can help you find errors and examine the history of any specific general-ledger account.

Customer support at both companies was responsive and helpful. The people whom I called knew what they were talking about, and on the rare occasions when they did not know, they found someone who did.

On Balance

Although neither program is perfect, each is an excellent product that works smoothly and without errors, and they both accomplish their goals of making accounting easy and informative. Although they are designed to meet the needs of small businesses, they may, in fact, be adaptable to businesses of various sizes.

If I had to recommend one program over the other, I would find it very difficult to do so, although I personally prefer the single-disk integration of Plains & Simple since I work with a dual-floppy system. Also I prefer the full Accounts Payable module that Plains & Simple offers.

Both programs make excellent use of the special features of the Macintosh and are equally easy to use and learn. The copy-protection schemes they employ are relatively painless and unobtrusive. The visual and operational differences between the two programs are noticeable, but since both methods are appealing, a preference of one style over the other is largely subjective. I see no objective way to rate one over the other.

The best advice is to try to preview any program as complex, time-consuming, and personal as an accounting program. You'll depend on it a lot once you begin to use it, and you'll probably use it often. So it helps to like the program. **+**

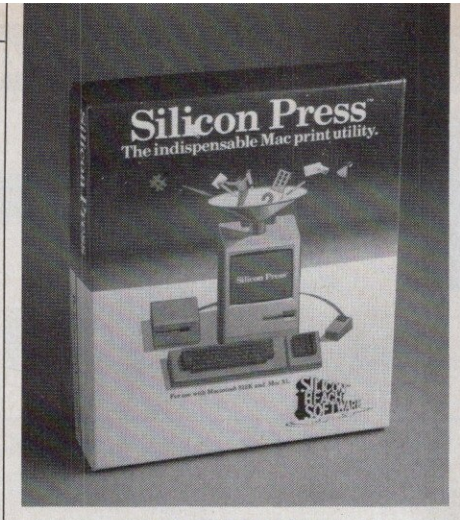



Silicon Press

Silicon Press is a program for the Macintosh that lets you create designs for cards, stickers, or labels of virtually any size and print them out in layouts of columns and rows on an ImageWriter, LaserWriter, or Epson printer. The package is a time saver for anyone who regularly prints identification tags, mailing labels, disk labels, price stickers, personalized greeting cards, or anything else that varies from the standard 8½ × 11-inch full page—from small stickers or Rolodex cards up to a 17 × 17-inch layout.

You can print rows and columns of the same image or merge data from a data file to vary the text on each label or tag. You can also include graphics imported from other programs such as MacPaint or MacDraw and print multicolored labels with an ImageWriter II with a color ribbon.

When you open a Silicon Press file, the screen displays two or three windows: a design window, which shows the design for a single label; a layout window, which shows the arrangement of labels to be printed on a full page; and (if applicable) a data window, which shows the data records to

be merged with the design in printing. The design window can include graphics (pasted in from the Scrapbook and sized to fit), text, and names from a merge file. You can have the layout window generated automatically or arrange it manually and can type records directly into the data window or copy them in from a data-

base or merge file. Silicon Press uses the same data-merge conventions as that Microsoft Word does: The fields in each record are separated by commas,

the first record in the data file (the header record) lists the field names as used in the merge file, and the merge file identifies field names by enclosing them in international quote marks, also called data-merge marks (« and »).

The feature that makes Silicon Press a desirable replacement or supplement to any database program is its convenience and flexibility in sizing labels and designing full-page layouts. The program automatically sizes the design window for you when you choose the Set Design menu option and specify the size of the label. Similarly, it generates the layout window automatically when

you choose the Automatic Layout menu option and specify the horizontal and vertical spacing between labels and the number of rows and columns on a single page. With both options, you can enter sizes in inches or points, you can enter inch measures in decimals or fractions, and the Preferences command lets you choose centimeters instead of inches.

One chronic problem with special formats—no matter what printer or program you use—is aligning the paper precisely in the printer. Typically, you end up wasting a lot of labels in test runs before arriving at the correct positioning. Silicon Press doesn't eliminate the need for trial and error in paper alignment, but it does offer a feature to make this process less wasteful: the Test Print option lets you print one label or one page of labels, showing a dotted rectangular outline around each label. This way, you can make fine adjustments to your on-screen layout before the final print run, and you can use normal paper to test your printout before loading the label paper. Furthermore, when you're print-merging with a data file, the Test Print option prints only one label at a time and positions the print head at the top of the next label, rather than rolling forward a full page as some other merge programs do.

In short, after having tried to produce custom-size labels using various options and combinations of MacWrite, MacPaint, Microsoft Word, Microsoft File, MacDraw, PageMaker, OverVUE, BASIC, and PostScript code, I tend to agree with the claim printed on the Silicon Press package: Silicon Press is "The indispensable Mac print utility" for anyone who regularly prints labels. **+**

Suggestions from our readers

MAKING MIMEOGRAPH STENCILS

Mimeograph machines cannot reproduce halftones reliably, which limits mimeographed pictures to line drawings. The Mac doesn't produce halftones, which are dots of different sizes, though, but makes lines and shades of gray by using dots of the same size with different spacings. As a result, stencils from the Mac and ImageWriter produce good graphics on a mimeograph. Tests with my mimeograph machine show that the Mac does a better job than the expensive electronic stencil machine I have, and it does so with the cheaper standard stencil!

I was able to make stencils on the ImageWriter by removing the ribbon, setting the page size to 8½ × 14 inches, and setting the paper-thickness lever inside the ImageWriter to the four-sheet form thickness.

UNOBSCURED OBJECTS

While using MacPaint, I accidentally noticed something strange happen when I was attempting to move selected objects around the screen. When you move the arrow from the selected object, it has the shape of a lasso. When the lasso leaves the bottom of the screen, it becomes an arrow again. If you click the mouse at the area where the lasso changes to an arrow at the bottom or side of the screen, you can still move the object that you selected.

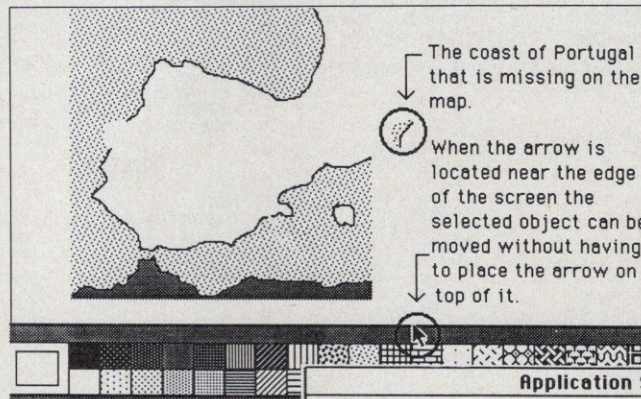


Figure 1: Moving objects in MacPaint without an obscuring arrow

This observation may not seem like anything too important, but it has proven to be very useful. Often, when moving small selected objects, I've found that the arrow obscures the object, thereby making it difficult to place. Not anymore. Now I just move the lasso to where it becomes an arrow again at the bottom of the

screen, and I can move the object without the arrow being on top of it (see figure 1).

KEYBOARD SWITCHER SETS

Macintosh users who use Switcher quickly realize that the most efficient strategy is to save the program configurations you use most often as Switcher "sets." Then, when you want to install your programs in Switcher, you select Load Set from the File menu and choose the appropriate set from the dialog box.

For those of us who like to use the keyboard, Andy Hertzfeld was kind enough to install ⌘ key equivalents for the most frequently used Switcher commands, including Load Set. To choose a Switcher set from the Load Set dialog box, however, you must

type a significant portion of the Set's filename.

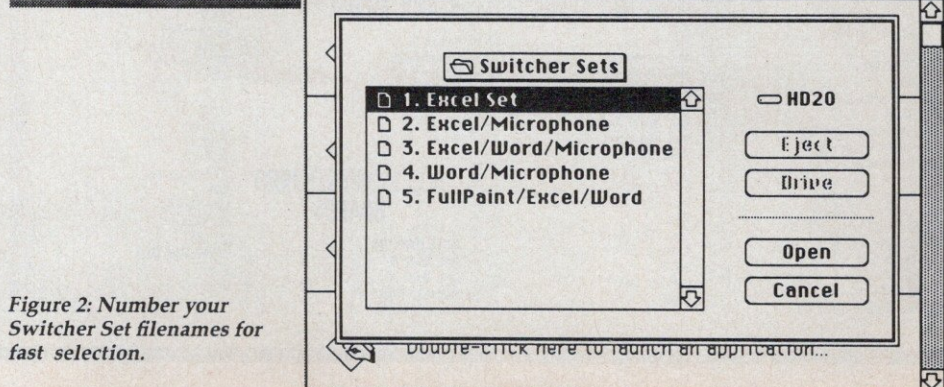


Figure 2: Number your Switcher Set filenames for fast selection.

Keyboard users take heart! By beginning your Switcher-set filename with a number (see figure 2), you can select the appropriate Switcher set with only one or two additional keystrokes. For example, to load the Excel/Word/Sidekick set in figure 2, you type

Command-L, 3, Return

Although Switcher is the prime example here, this technique works with any application in which you want to load files quickly from the keyboard each time you use the program. Microsoft Word glossaries, File report formats, and Excel macro-sheets are other likely candidates for taking advantage of this MacTip.

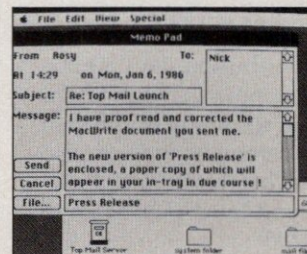

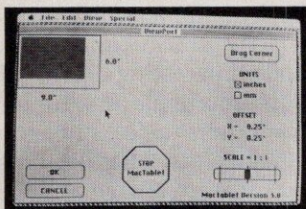

PUTTING THE DESKTOP IN ITS PLACE

The converging path of the Apple II and the Macintosh

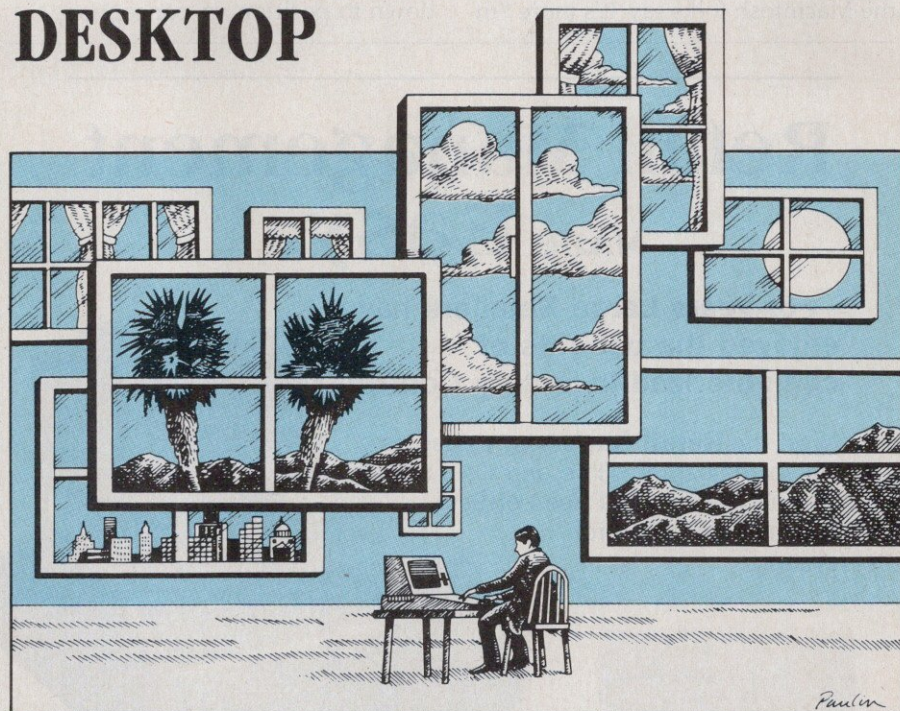
Add a graphic desktop program to an Apple II, and you get (choose one): an easier-to-use machine; a second-rate Macintosh; another way to access your programs; or a trendy appearance without improved performance. You'll find Apple II and Mac owners who advance each of the above descriptions and can give you a good argument for their position.

Apple itself is firmly in the pro-desktop camp now. For strategic marketing reasons, the company is committed to bringing the II and Mac product lines closer together, and the user interface is just as important as hardware or software compatibility.

Apple, quite naturally, is also interested in creating a recognizable product look and feel. Either of those considerations alone would be enough to motivate Apple's backing of Catalyst (domestically) and MouseDesk (internationally), both of which provide a Macintosh-like desktop for Apple II machines.

There's more to this issue, though. Graphic desktops are a different mental outlook or metaphor, a different way of looking at human/computer interaction. They're also, in a strange way, more fitting even for the II than they are for Apple's other line of computers. And, as we shall see, they're part of a lesson the II can teach as well as one it can learn.

Actually, though, two very different types of desktop programs are available for the II, playing two very different roles in the system. Catalyst and MouseDesk are limited operating



environments, acting with the ProDOS operating system to find and start other computer programs. On the other hand, programs such as Jeeves and Pinpoint are tool and accessory sets for office applications.

Consequently, you normally use the first type of desktops *before* you

run your usual application programs. Once an application is running, the desktop gives up control and doesn't reappear until you quit the application and return to what would otherwise be the ProDOS system prompt.

The second group of desktops, in contrast, run *during* your programs, as pop-up and pop-down windows that are always lying in wait. They are

thus two steps removed from the first group and may or may not use a graphic interface.

On the Mac, the groups are closely related because tools and accessories are accessible from menu bars, which remain active and available during the use of application programs. The tools available before you launch an application program remain the tools during program execution.

That situation isn't possible on the II, however, because of the more limited role of the operating environment. Whereas the Macintosh operating system was written before the appearance of any Mac application software, leaving a clear set of rules for application programs, the Apple II desktop environments were written after most Apple II application programs and thus have to take programs as they find them.

Environmental Concern

For now, though, let's put aside the tool-type desktops and take a closer look at the first type of desktops, the

operating environments. Most first-time Apple II users prefer the icon-and-mouse approach to the ProDOS command-line method, especially now that most first-time buyers are not computer fanatics but people who see the machine as a means to a goal.

Users find seeing what is on a disk by clicking the mouse over an on-screen image easier than worrying about giving commands and remembering paths or slots and drives. As the Macintosh folks say, it's more "in-

tuitive." That advantage will also increase as the II continues to get more capacious storage choices and a wider range of peripheral types. Although the ProDOS operating system insulates users from changes in the hardware much more than did the prior DOS 3.3, you still have to deal with complex mental constructions to use ProDOS to access multiple files on different volumes. The differences between the graphical interface and the command-line approach boil down to position vs. conception.

Even for more advanced users, the mouse point-and-click method has its advantages. Copying disks, for example, is much easier with Catalyst than it is with the multilevel menu system of the ProDOS Filer utility, for instance.

A Mixed Blessing

The graphical approach is not entirely an improvement, however. Some of what desktops gain in ease of use comes at the cost of a more rigid approach. Desktops, for example, don't do very well with self-starting applications. Even though part of the impetus for creating software that boots and runs may have been the difficulties many users had with the command-line interface of the plain operating system, most of us have a whole collection of this software. There's not much point in running a desktop if you normally launch into programs by rebooting.

Desktops also have trouble distinguishing programs from data. Because ProDOS keeps track only of a few special kinds of files, a desktop can't normally tell if an unmarked file contains instructions for you, for an application program, or for the operating system.

You can tell the desktop which files are which by installing the programs, but if you're doing a lot of changing around of disks and running a lot of files through the system, you have to do a lot of installing and removing to keep your system up to date. If you stick with plain ProDOS, you can just swap disks.

Desktops can also get in the way of full communication between you and your program. The point-and-click model doesn't provide any good means of giving an application program an initial set of parameters or of setting options from a command line. Similarly, they give you only a limited ability to set up macros or record procedures, so you must do most desktop tasks one step at a time.

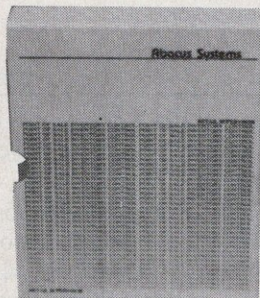
The limited scope of the Apple II desktop programs can also be a problem. Because the desktops cede complete control to application programs, the desktop environment doesn't provide any consistency for the application's user interface. Not only does this mean that each application can have its own different interaction style, but it means the desktop becomes one *more* program you have to learn and remember.

Consistency is always a double-

edged sword, and one of the attractions of the Apple II line has always been its variety of software and the range of available approaches. If you take word processing, for example, you'll find dozens of software choices on the II, one of which probably suits any particular work style and mental orientation. On the Mac, however, you'll find only a handful of word-processing programs, and most work in about the same way.

Pick and Choose

Still, some optional standards would be nice. International Solutions, the publisher of MouseDesk, has come out with a line of business programs that use the same interface as the company's desktop software, and other programs such as Roger Wagner's MouseWrite and Trutec's Person to Person telecommunications program also use a Mac-like approach. But so far, no announced program from Apple or anyone else ensures a consistent desktop and application-program user interface.

I believe the optional-standard approach is particularly fitting for the II series, because it continues the tradition of an open but supported architecture. Although, in electrical terms, you can put most cards in most slots in an Apple II, in most cases you want to go with the standard arrangement. If the circumstances call for another arrangement, though, it's no big deal to do it a nonstandard way. Desktop-related program-interface standards should be the same way.

In fact, having a graphic desktop as the operating-system interface should be an option. At times you can get more done with a command line or perhaps a menu-driven operating-system-shell program. The engineers of the Macintosh—who originally assumed that users didn't need open-ended choices, only limited numbers of predefined selections—seem slowly to be learning that lesson.

So watch not only how the II desktops evolve over the next year or two, but also the Macintosh itself. The II may become more Mac-like, but you'll also see more II-like features on Mac desktops.

Shall we say that the Mac's lesson is graphical interfaces and software consistency? In that case, the II stands, as always, as a beacon on the virtues of openness and configurability. And that's nothing to keep permanently hidden under anybody's desktop.

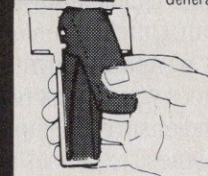

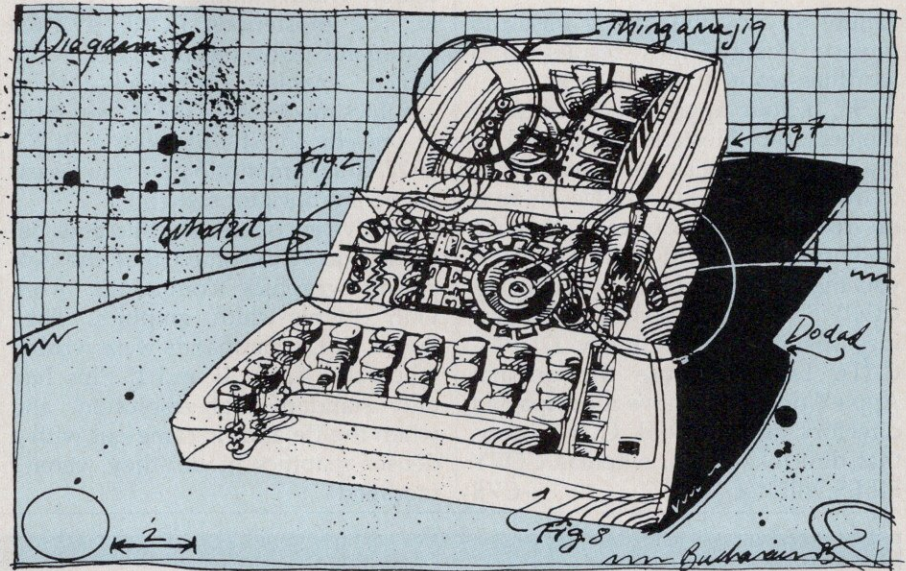
APPLEWORKS VERSIONS CONFUSING

Q. I own AppleWorks, Version 1.1. I went to my dealer for the 1.2 upgrade, and he had no data, specifications, or anything to explain what changes had been made. The copies he made for me would not run on my IIc, so he recopied them. The new copies were OK, but now I find I cannot make backups with my IIc utilities disk. Why can't I make backups as I could with my original 1.1 version, and what are the differences among the 1.1, 1.2, and 1.3 versions?

A. Version 1.0 was replaced by Version 1.1 after only a few months. Version 1.1 contained a new manual to accommodate IIc owners (this version was introduced with the IIc) but was found to have problems with non-Apple parallel printer cards. It seems that most printer-card manufacturers emulated Apple's older-style cards that were created with BASIC programs in mind. These cards automatically sent a carriage return at the end of each 80-character sequence. Unfortunately, ProDOS doesn't want those carriage returns, and they can cause problems in ProDOS programs such as AppleWorks (one symptom was that 80N printed mysteriously at the top of the page).

Version 1.2 overcame the non-Apple parallel-card problems by allowing you to issue control commands to the card itself, telling it to turn off the automatic carriage return after 80 characters. The procedure involves entering the Other Activities option from the main menu and then selecting the Specify Information about Your Printer(s) option. Next, you choose your printer under the Change Printer Specifications option and select the Interface Cards option. You can now change the card's automatic carriage return from 80 to 0 by entering the code Control-I ON.

Version 1.2 of AppleWorks also



added new printers to the Select Printer option and overcame problems with the underline and boldface codes on the Epson MX printers. Memory upgrades from various manufacturers come with software that

locate information on a 3.5-inch disk, and it lets you format a disk within AppleWorks so you don't have to use the system utilities. If you have Apple's Memory Expansion Card in your computer, this version will increase the desktop from 55K to about 800K. It will not, however, increase the record limit in the database program, the size limit in the spreadsheet program, or the line limit in the word-processing program (Apple maintains that it will soon increase these limits).

Currently, memory upgrades from other manufacturers increase these limits, but they work only with Version 1.2 of AppleWorks. Version 1.3 is the only upgrade that is not free from dealers. It costs \$20 from Apple, unless you purchase a Memory Expansion Card, in which case it's free. It is also the only version with an addendum to the manual.

When dealers upgrade your existing disks, they simply copy certain files from the new version, adding new ones and replacing any with the same name. The 1.2 upgrade consists of these files:

If you have Apple's Memory Expansion Card in your computer, Version 1.3 of AppleWorks will increase the desktop from 55K to about 800K.

modifies this version to allow it to recognize extra memory, and most of them work quite well. Quark's Catalyst, Versions 2.0 and 3.0, also work with Version 1.2.

Version 1.3 adds some minor features to AppleWorks: It recognizes the UniDisk 3.5 as a disk drive, so you don't have to type pathnames to

Failure to copy the correct files and replace existing files results in a worthless copy of AppleWorks.

So, if your upgrade contained all the necessary files and you copied all the required files, as explained above, to the best of my knowledge, there is no reason why you cannot make backups with your IIc utilities disk. If you made your backup by choosing COPY FILES from the IIc system utilities menu, you might try DUPLICATE DISK, because the original AppleWorks disks have a compacted directory, and the DISK COPY keeps that directory intact, whereas COPY FILES will not.

APPLESOFT AND DOUBLE-WIDTH GRAPHICS

Q. I read in your Inside the Apple IIe book that you can turn on double-width high-resolution graphics from Applesoft by following a PR#3 command with HGR and POKE 49246,0 commands. I've done this, but my line-drawing program doesn't seem to work properly. For instance, when I draw a horizontal line with HPLOT, I get a dashed line instead of a solid line. Can you tell me what I am doing wrong?

A. You are certainly enabling the double-width graphics screen properly. The mysterious POKE 49246,0 command turns on annunciator #3, which enables the double-width graphics modes. (On the IIc you have to precede this POKE with a POKE 49278,0 command to give you access to the annunciator switch.)

You've encountered difficulties because you've assumed that the Applesoft graphics commands work with double-width graphics. They don't! These commands were written when the Apple II and II Plus had only standard high-resolution, and when the IIe and IIc came out with a denser graphics mode, they weren't modified.

The reason you see a dashed horizontal line is that every graphics row on the screen is mapped to an interleaved series of 40 bytes in main memory and 40 bytes in auxiliary memory. (Each byte defines 7 adjacent pixels.) When HPLOT draws a line, it stores data in main memory only, so there are gaps for the pixels that correspond to auxiliary memory bytes.

The solution is not a happy one for Applesoft programmers: Write your drawing routines in assembly language. This is not simple, but it's about your only choice until Apple decides to rewrite Applesoft.

If possible, get your hands on a superb article entitled "True Sixteen-Color Hi-Res" by Allen Watson III. It appeared in the January 1984 issue of *Apple Orchard*, and it describes a set of subroutines you can call from Applesoft in order to use double-width graphics efficiently. If you aren't able to locate this issue, contact the publisher, International Apple Core, at (408) 727-7713.
