GS: GREAT SOFTWARE

Apple staged the announcement of its new IIGS with the company's usual flair. It created a slick and elaborate music video to the tune of Huey Lewis & the News' pop hit "The Heart of Rock and Roll," with lyrics such as "... the heart of Apple II is still beating." Apple bigwigs John Sculley, Del Yocam, and Steve Wozniak were dressed down in the archetypal Silicon Valley casual style. Del and Woz kidded and cajoled as they presented a humorous patter that heralded the latest scion of the Apple II dynasty. As the presentation built to a climax, a large radiocontrolled flying saucer flew out from backstage carrying a neon model of the IIGS, as the real Apple IIGS made its debut at center stage.

Now that the rollout is over, it's a good time to ponder what the machine will mean to Apple, to the personalcomputer industry, and to users. The IIGS is important to Apple because it gives the company a sexy new computer to help stimulate the consumer market. The 8-bit Apple II series is still a utilitarian workhorse that will continue to have a solid place in education, small business, and other markets where low cost and reliability are important, but the older Apple IIs lack the excitement and appeal of second-generation computers such as the Macintosh, Commodore Amiga, and Atari ST.

The Apple II line sorely needed a technology update, and Apple responded by giving the Apple IIGS a big dose of its premier software technology, the Macintosh user interface. The IIGS gives Apple a contender at the high end of the consumer and education markets that can outperform the low-cost IBM PC clones. It has enough hardware horsepower to let its users explore new realms of personal computing such as advanced entertainment software with realistic graphics and sound effects, sophisticated personal productivity programs, and CD-ROM technology.

The IIGS's impact on the computer


industry is hard to predict, but indications are that Apple has a big winner on its hands that may fatally wound Commodore's Amiga. The Atari ST will probably be hurt by the IIGS, but not as badly as the Amiga. The ST is an inexpensive computer that will still appeal to people who are enthusiasts of the Motorola 68000 chip, have limited budgets, and are willing to take a risk on Atari. I've been talking with leading third-party developers, and their outlook on the IIGS is optimistic. Developers are happy that Apple has created a capable machine for the consumer market; they feel that the IIGS will let them create secondgeneration software that will attract many new customers.

Computer users will also realize significant benefits from the IIGS. The improved color graphics and superior sound offer programmers rich resources for creating new software that will surely be more fun to use than what is available for 8-bit Apple IIs or PC clones. The Macintosh-like user interface will make the IIGS as easy to use as the Mac, and, unlike the Mac, the IIGS can be souped up through the use of add-in boards. Current Apple II users who upgrade to the new technology will benefit because they will be able to run most of their existing software and use most of their existing hardware. If they are lucky enough to own an Apple IIe, they can upgrade to the IIGS for a very reasonable price.

The IIGS looks like it will help reinforce the "Apple II Forever" theme by extending the legendary lifespan of the microcomputer industry's progenitor, the Apple II. Although the IIGS hardware may not be the absolute state of the art, it is the software that determines what the computer can actually do. Because of the high level of enthusiasm and support that software developers are expressing for the IIGS, I'm confident that GS will come to stand not just for graphics and sound, but for great software as well.





Dear *A* **+:** Your reviewer makes two factual mistakes in your September 1986 issue (pages 32 and 36) in covering the Sylvia Porter's Your Personal Financial Planner consumer software program (published by Timeworks, Inc., Deerfield, Illinois).

First he concludes that our program "tells you a lot about the past and the present, but it doesn't help you plan for the future." The contradictory fact is that a significant portion of the program—and also 32

pages of the manual—are devoted to our exclusive "Financial Planning by Objectives" system. This future planning system has been reviewed favorably in several dozen other leading computer magazines.

Second, the writer states that the program does not tell you "what kinds of investments you should consider, what the risks are, any tax implications, and so on." The fact is that our program is clearly identified and marketed (package, manual, advertising, promotion) as the first in the Sylvia Porter's Personal Finance Series and that the second program in the series is Your Personal Investment Manager, which includes investment strategies and fundamental and technical analyzers (in addition to portfolio tracking, transactions management, deadline alerts, tax monitoring, and telecommunications access to outside database sources).

ALPHAPRO/APPLEWORKS PRINTING SOLUTION

Dear A +: I am writing this letter to convey a solution to a printer-software communication problem that is shared by others with the same hardware setup.

Last year I bought an Alphacom Alphapro 101 daisy-wheel printer for my Apple IIc. The printer has worked well for me in all applications except AppleWorks. The main difficulty is in getting AppleWorks (Versions 1.0 and 1.2) to successfully communicate printer codes (e.g., boldface) to the printer, which emulates a Diablo 630. Alphacom personnel, whom I have found to be very helpful and cooperative, could not solve this problem, which is painfully common to the company's other customers. The best I've managed thus far is to use the Epson MX printer driver, which works well except for lack of print enhancement.

Through trial and error, logic, and celestial inspiration, I finally worked out the solution. What's needed are the manufacturer's interface manual and a complete list of ASCII character codes, such as the one in the Applesoft BASIC Programmer's Reference Manual. After setting the printer up as a custom printer. input the printer codes, using only the character equivalent of the hexadecimal (or decimal) values listed in the interface manual. Anything else will print out when the file prints. For example, for Subscript Begin, whose code is \$1B \$55, press the Escape and U (note capital) keys.

A more complete printer manual would have minimized the frustration involved. Also, despite the fact that printer codes are usually different from manufacturer to manufacturer, the AppleWorks manual could have at least given *one* example of code input. After communicating this solution to Alphacom application representatives, I was told that they would most likely issue a bulletin to current Alphapro 101 owners.

WORD JUGGLER ELABORATION

Dear *A* +: "Write On!" in the October 1986 edition omitted mention of many of the good features of Word Juggler that were cited for other word processors.

Lexicheck, the built-in spelling checker, provides a word count. Word Juggler provides hanging indents and can prevent both widows and orphans with the Need command, which reserves the correct number of lines for a paragraph. If enough extra memory is available, the program can generate both indexes and tables of contents (at the end of the document) by storing the current page number for an occurrence as a variable.

You can specify both starting and ending page numbers for printouts; the number of copies to be printed; and headers and footers, which you can position for odd- and even-numbered pages.

In addition to single, double, and triple spacing, you can use incremental line spacing and other printer features by sending appropriate commands to the printer that is being used. You can also get an unbreakable space simply by using an unneeded special character, which prints as a blank.

Nonprinting comments can be entered wherever you need them. The program can use any of the usual clock cards. The size of a document is not limited to disk capacity. In fact, you can create documents of any size by using the Insert Document command—I have single documents that occupy eight full disks. The output can be quickly previewed before printing.

This is by no means an exhaustive list of the features of Word Juggler. I feel that a very fine product has been severely shortchanged by your article.







plaid shirts at the podium, smoke on stage, and flying saucers overhead at Apple's dramatic IIGS debut.

HOW WILL THEY TOP THIS ONE?

Dress casual, bring earplugs, and watch out for flying saucers. With those three bits of advice, you couldn't go wrong at Apple's pull-out-the-stops introduction of the IIGS. Apple has long favored the "event" approach to unveiling new products, and the IIGS's debut was no exception. Like the introduction of the Macintosh and the IIc before it. this event featured newwave multimedia slide shows, ear-numbing rock



FLYING SAUCER AS IT APPEARED AT AN APPLE SALES MEETING


music, and pep-rally speeches from the top brass. But this one might be best remembered for its combination of calculated casualness and high-tech high jinks.

It was plaid-shirt day at the podium as both Apple Chairman John Scullev and CEO Del Yocam stepped forth looking as if they'd just dropped in from a barbecue. So much for the "buttoned-down" image that Sculley supposedly brought to Apple. In fact, it was difficult to spot a suit and tie anywhere among the 2200 Apple employees gathered at Cupertino, California's Flint Center, a college auditorium in which Apple often holds introductions and annual shareholder meetings. The justfolks approach contrasted sharply with the space-age dramatics provided by a flying saucer 20 feet in diameter. The helium-filled saucer rose from the stage amid smoke and spotlights and floated across the auditorium, bearing a neon, 3-D model of the IIGS. Spotlights shone on the model, casting a shadow of the IIGS on a far wall. Although such spectacles are par for the course when it comes to Apple unveilings, it's hard to imagine how Apple will top this one when it brings out its new Macin-

tosh products next year.

ENHANCED IIc

Apple also introduced an enhanced IIc at its flying-saucer extravaganza. The changes are subtle. The only external difference is that the key caps are now in the new light-gray color of the IIGS. Internally, Apple has redesigned the logic board to accept the new



Apple IIc Memory Expansion Card. This dealer-installable card provides up to one megabyte of extra RAM in increments of 256K. The card costs \$269 for the first 256K, and additional increments of 256K are \$69 each. For the same \$269 price, current IIc owners can get a new logic board and the Memory Expansion Card.

The new AppleWorks 2.0 automatically recognizes the card and lets you create larger documents than before and in-

crease the size of your desktop. You can also use the card to emulate an internal disk drive by creating a RAMdisk.

Applied Engineering and Checkmate Technologies have been selling IIc memory cards for a long time. Not only will these third-party companies now sell their cards to match or undercut Apple's price, but you can also install their cards yourself. The third-party products have several other advantages: Applied Engineering's card has a built-in clock; Checkmate offers a 16-bit option for its card; and both cards have five-year warranties, compared to Apple's 90-day warranty. Each company supplies programs that change AppleWorks 1.1-1.3 to work with its card and ease the size restrictions in each module. By the time you read this issue, both companies will probably also have patch codes that allow AppleWorks 2.0 to recognize their cards.

BANNER EVENT

What can you create with four Macintosh Pluses, a LaserWriter Plus, three boxes of computer paper, 450 students, and Brøderbund's Print Shop software? A 1.7-mile banner, that's what. At least that's what a group of students did at Thurston Middle School in Laguna Beach, California. These students created this banner to announce a businesseducation partnership program and stretched it through the streets of this Southern California city in last summer's Laguna Beach 10K Classic Race. The students decorated their creation with 200 logos and the names of almost 3000 people and 70 businesses involved in the program and/or the race. As this issue was going to press, the school was preparing to send a facsimile of the banner to President Reagan and had gotten the attention of the Guinness Book of World Records people. So

far, the Guinness arbiters have offered the school some Catch-22 information—a record has to have been established in order to break it, they say, but so far there's no record for the longest computer-generated banner ever. The school will continue to plead its case, according to Harley Lobo, the teacher who cooked up the project.

PATENT NO LONGER PENDING

Applied Engineering, one of the major manufacturers of Apple peripherals, was recently awarded a patent for its auxiliary-slot memory boards for the Apple II series of computers.

The patent was granted for the power-saving and multiple-bank-switching circuitry of the company's RamWorks memory boards, which provide an 80-column display and additional memory (up to 16 megabytes with the RamWorks III) for the Apple IIe.

The IIe's 6502 microprocessor addresses up to 64K of memory at a time. Applied Engineering's boards incorporate additional memory through split-second bank-switching, letting the processor switch one 64K bank of memory with another undetectably.





Increased sales pay for price reductions at some software firms.

POLARWARE PRAISES PRICING

Polarware/Penguin Software, Inc., is turning cartwheels over the results of its repricing strategy. In June, the entertainment and graphics software company slashed prices on all of its programs and now reports that consum-




before. This increase in sales volume is high enough to make up for the reduced amount that Polarware/Penguin receives for each sale, the company says, calling the response to the repricing "phenomenal."

This isn't the first time this company has dropped its prices. It tried a similar strategy in 1983 but bumped prices back up in 1984 because of heavy competition from cash-rich concerns such as CBS, Reader's Digest, Milton-Bradley, and Mattel, all of which had lots of clout with dealers and money to burn on mar-

keting. "It became an odd situation where we had to advertise more to sell for less," says Mark Pelczarski, Polarware/Penguin's president. So now that the "noise level" has died down, the company feels safe in making this

move again.

Polarware/Penguin isn't the only home-software company to slash prices in recent months. Electronic Arts has also repriced a host of its bestknown titles and calls them "classics." Programs such as One-on-One, Pinball Construction Set, and Archon now carry a suggested retail price of \$14.95, or less than half of their previous prices. EA reports enthusiastic consumer response to its new prices on old productslike Polarware/Penguin, it savs sales volume makes up for the lower prices-but takes a more conservative view of the meaning of the increased sales. "It's hard to tell if it's perceived to be a promotion" rather than a permanent price reduction, says EA's marketing vice president, Bing Gordon. If people think it's a promotion, they might be buying up as much as they can, thinking that the prices may go up again. Rather than tout the strategy as an immediate success, Gordon says he'll wait until January—when the new prices will be six months old—to make that call.

Alternatives to Using AppleWorks



Do the integrated packages Foundation and

AppleWorks has become one of the best-selling software programs of all time by integrating the three most significant personal-computer applications (word processing, spreadsheet calculation, and data management) with an appropriate level of power and simplicity. Despite its success, however, AppleWorks isn't all things to all people. Those who crave something a little different in an integrated program can choose from a couple of alternatives. Neither of these programs has the name recognition of AppleWorks, but each promises certain advantages for different types of users.

Before we look at these competitors, though, let's take a quick look at the latest version of AppleWorks. Last September, AppleWorks underwent its first major upgrade in more than two years. With AppleWorks Version 2.0, Apple has acknowledged two major weaknesses of the original program that third-party products were addressing: an inability to use more memory than 128K and the lack of a mail-merge function. The new version requires at least 128K of RAM and can take advantage of up to a megabyte of memory automatically.



One advantage of using extra RAM is that your files can be larger than before. Individual word-processing files can now be up to 511 pages long, and database and spreadsheet files can expand to fill all the memory you have available.

The mail-merge feature is a natural addition to the program. Rather than having to buy a third-party program to merge database data into a form letter, you can now do it right within AppleWorks. To do so, you create a database report containing the data you want to merge and then print the report to the Clipboard. With the report on the Clipboard,

you switch to the form-letter file and use a new printer option, MM (for mail merge), in order to display the categories of data stored on the Clipboard. You can then specify locations for the data you're going to merge from the Clipboard by moving the cursor within the form letter and indicating the field names from a list. You can then print the form letters, and the Clipboard data merges automatically.

The other big change to this new version of AppleWorks is the manual. The new manual contains much more information than its predecessor did about moving data between the spreadsheet and database with the DIF file format, about the limits of using the Clipboard, and about handling specific printing situations. All current AppleWorks users have their own wish list of features that are missing from the program, and this upgrade probably doesn't grant many of those wishes. The spreadsheet module for example, offers no additional financial or trigonometric functions.

On the other hand, AppleWorks is likely to remain the king of Apple II integrated software for some time, which means you have a wealth of books, enhancement products, and local experts to go to for help. If Version 2.0 doesn't allay all of your gripes about AppleWorks, you can still improve the situation with addon memory cards or accessory programs such as Pinpoint; if you saw the lack of mail-merge ability as the major shortcoming of AppleWorks Versions 1.1, 1.2, or 1.3, then this new incarnation should be right up your alley.

how to import and export files from AppleWorks, other ProDOS programs, or in standard ASCII or binary formats.

Foundation does not use the Pro-DOS operating system. Instead, it uses a proprietary operating system called GigaDOS. The main reason for using a proprietary DOS is to improve speed: Foundation calculates spreadsheets noticeably faster than AppleWorks does. One drawback, of course, is that to export files or import them from other Apple programs, you must use Foundation's import/export utilities, and you can't use Apple's disk-copying programs to make backup copies of the software (one backup program disk comes with the package).

The basic philosophy behind Foundation is to offer far more power than AppleWorks does, at the same price. Foundation's makers promote it as a do-all integrated program that can accomplish a variety of office-automation tasks, including accounting and order process-

the amount of available memory, but database files can be as large as the available disk space allows. If your spreadsheets or word-processing documents are large, you can link files together for continuous printing or data exchange. These flexible integration options are a major benefit of Foundation.

To move data in bulk from either a spreadsheet, database, or wordprocessing file into another wordprocessing file, you can use the Photo command, which is like using AppleWorks' Clipboard. Spreadsheets and databases can share information directly through Link commands, which let you access other spreadsheet or database files and automatically bring data from them into the currently active file. Finally, you can merge database or spreadsheet data into form letters in the word-processing module. Data can come from more than one database or spreadsheet, as long as all the files from which you want to merge data are open on the desktop. As for the

Now, let's look at two programs that hope to outdo AppleWorks, either by doing much more or by costing far less.

FOUNDATION

Foundation is a software package that integrates word-processing, spreadsheet, and database applications. It comes on three disks (a program disk, a sample files disk, and a disk of file-conversion utilities) and includes three manuals. A 63-page beginners' guide explains the major features of the program; a 171-page, indexed reference guide explains individual commands in each application; and a 12-page booklet explains

ing. In fact, it is a fast, powerful program with excellent integration between its applications. You can have up to 14 files open at once in individual windows on the screen (plus an on-line Help window), and you can resize the windows so more than one of them is showing at a time.

All the windows are open on Foundation's desktop, but the program itself occupies a lot of memory, and you have only 45K of memory space to work with. (Powerful filelinking features address this limitation.) Individual word-processing and spreadsheet files are limited to

individual applications, each offers a good deal more power than does its counterpart in AppleWorks.

Handling Words

In the word-processing module, you can link multiple files together for chain printing or chain viewing (which compensates for the small amount of available desktop space). Word-processing windows can be up to 255 columns wide by 255 lines long. The cursor-movement and deleting features are extensive: You can move or delete by word, line, paragraph, screen, or page.

The Search function accommodates forward and backward search-

ing and replacements, and you can use it to count the number of words in a document or the number of times a certain word occurs in a document. Another unusual feature is the word-processing module's Draw command, which lets you draw lines, boxes, or borders around text. The borders are represented with rows and columns of characters rather than actual lines, though, because of the limitations of the standard Apple monitor and because Foundation doesn't use the extra MouseText

graphics routines in the Apple IIc or enhanced IIe ROM.

Some output options include the ability to link several windows for continuous printing and to specify alternating left and right margins in a document for booklike printouts.

The drawback of the word-processing module is that it trades flexibility for ease of use. The main commands appear on a menu at the bottom of the screen, but this menu gives way to a series of submenus as you work with the program. You can

issue commands directly from the keyboard by using the Control key and other keys, but the letters of the commands aren't usually mnemonic. To select a search option, for example, you type Control-A. To set tabs, you type Control-G. The mailmerge process is also complicated, as it involves designating the linked files and fields by number, in the order in which they appear on the desktop. Similarly, the printer-option codes are complex.

Database Possibilities

Unlike AppleWorks, whose database manager has a flat-file structure, Foundation offers a relational database. You can link data between database files, so that entering an account number in one file might

automatically cause the program to search a second file, retrieve a customer name and address from it, and then enter that data into the original file below the account number. You can also have data move automatically from a spreadsheet into a database if you set up the proper link. To maximize use of the 45K desktop, database files on the desktop occupy only 2K of RAM—the rest of each file is stored on disk, and the database manager accesses it only when it needs it.


When you define a database file, you can specify different field types such as alphabetical, numerical, integer, date, or formula. You can use logical and arithmetic operators as

well as built-in functions to produce calculated results from one or more fields.

Because you can use IF and other logical functions, you can produce extremely complex database reports or sort through records in virtually any way you like. The database manager displays information one record at a time. To display multiple records, though, you can create a report and print it to the screen. The editor with which you create screen forms is fairly complicated—you must use the Control key and various letter keys to move the cursor around and insert or delete lines on database screen forms.

Surveying the Spreadsheet

Each Foundation spreadsheet can contain a maximum of 64 columns by 256 rows, which isn't a lot of space, but you can link multiple spreadsheets together, as long as all the linked spreadsheets are stored on the same data disk. The spreadsheet uses the standard A1-style column/row designations, and the formula structures will be familiar to anybody who has used AppleWorks. In addition to containing letters, numbers, and formulas, cells can also include dates.

One feature for advanced users is macros—you can define and store keystroke macros that enable you to automate complex operations with a spreadsheet, such as getting data from another spreadsheet; making detailed formatting changes; and entering, copying, or moving data in cells in a certain way.

Trade-off

In sum, Foundation packs a great deal of power into a reasonably priced package. Beyond the \$250, however, the price you pay for this power is the sacrifice of ease of use. Foundation ignores the open- and solid-apple keys, preferring the Control and Escape keys in combination with letter keys—and the Control-key substitutes aren't easy to remember. To its credit, though, the program does have an on-line help facility.

This program isn't nearly as easy to learn and use as AppleWorks, and the manual could be far more helpful, but if you put in the time, Foundation will stay with you through some highly sophisticated applications.

TRIO

Trio is a low-cost, low-end pro-

gram for Apple II users who want an integrated word-processing program, spreadsheet program, and database manager and are willing to trade power for price.

Trio comes on a single non-copyprotected disk, all of which loads into your Apple's memory at once. The low price of Trio begins to make sense when you discover that it lacks some features you take for granted with AppleWorks. The 124page manual doesn't have an index, and, although it explains the program fairly well, it isn't easy to use for reference.

The program's maker says it works with any printer and interface, but that's the case because it outputs standard ASCII characters without any printer-formatting codes. If you want to use boldfacing, underlining, or other enhancement features of your printer, you must look up your printer's control codes in your printer manual and enter them into documents before printing them.

As for Trio's integration, you can work with only one file at a time, and the facilities for sharing data between applications aren't what you might expect. To use blocks of data from a spreadsheet in a word-processing file, you must print the desired spreadsheet file or portion of a file to disk and then load it into the word-processing file as text. With the database manager, you can print a file to disk and then merge the data into a form letter in the wordprocessing module, provided you've specified variables in the word-processing document. You can also store variables in the Trio Klipboard and merge them into word-processing documents.


On the other hand, Trio is generally easy to use. It makes good use of the open-apple key in commands, and it is similar to AppleWorks in that most of the commands are the same in each application.

Trio's Strong Suit

Although the individual applications in Trio are unevenly matched in terms of power, the word-processing module is very capable. It offers far better file-handling flexibility than AppleWorks, for example. You can append word-processing files on a disk to another file, you can save a range of lines from a file to a new file on disk, and you can chain files together for printing.

Trio uses a "Klipboard" for temporarily storing blocks of text, but

unlike AppleWorks' Clipboard, the Klipboard lets you store up to 36 different blocks of text at once, and you can save the Klipboard file itself so you can reuse boilerplate phrases or data to be merged into a form letter. Another nice feature is an Undo Erase command that lets you recover text you've just deleted.

Database Limitations

The Trio database manager is decidedly less functional than its AppleWorks counterpart. This module uses a spreadsheet layout, so that fields are columns and records are individual rows. You can have up to 99 fields (columns) and up to 999 records (rows) in a file, but you must specify the size of the file when you set it up. You can manually extend the original size limits if you run out of room once the file contains data, however.

Because the database uses the spreadsheet matrix for a layout, you can't view records in single-record format. Rather, you must scroll from left to right across the matrix to view fields that are off the screen.

As for data types, the database manager recognizes only letters or numbers. You can't sort by date un-



less you use a YY-MM-DD format. One of the most useful database features, record selection, is also missing from Trio. You can't select groups of records based on their contents and logical criteria—you can search only for individual records and sort records on any one field.

Spreadsheet Considerations

Each spreadsheet file can contain up to 99 columns or 999 rows, although, as with the database manager, you must set the size of the spreadsheet when you begin a file. The spreadsheet doesn't follow all the basic conventions for row and column designations and formula formats, which makes it relatively difficult to learn and use. The upper-left cell of the worksheet is designated R1C1 instead of A1, which means twice the typing when you use cell coordinates in formulas.

The spreadsheet formulas themselves are also particularly clumsy. When you copy a formula in AppleWorks, a prompt asks you if you want the copy to be absolute or relative. In Trio, you must specify a relative formula through the format of cell coordinates—a relative for-

mula adding cells A1 (R1C1) through cells A5 (R5C1) is rc[-5]:[-1].

Even if you can get used to this bizarre formula formatting, you'll find that the spreadsheet module has fewer built-in functions than AppleWorks' module does. Some of the missing functions are ones you're likely to use every day, such as SUM and AVG. In all, the spreadsheet module offers less power and less ease of use than does the corresponding module in AppleWorks.

Less for Less

On the whole, Trio offers less power for less money. The word-processing module works much like the one in AppleWorks, and it offers better file-handling features, but the spreadsheet and database modules are decidedly inferior. Still, if your spreadsheeting and database needs are very limited, you can save yourself a lot of money by buying Trio rather than AppleWorks.





ROUTES FOCUSED INTEGRATION OPTIONS

Three-in-one programs such as AppleWorks, Foundation, and Trio (see "AppleWorks Alternatives" in this issue) compete for your software dollars by offering the three most popular applications-word processing, database management, and calculating—in spreadsheet one package. These programs are broadly useful, but they make some compromises in either power or ease of use. As your computing needs become clear, you may well find that your activities center on one or two applications, rather than

three, and that in those applications, you'd rather not accept the compromises inherent in three-in-

one programs.

Fortunately, many Apple software developers have come up with integrated packages that emphasize one or two applications. They realize that most people who are looking for a more focused integrated package are either number people or word people. The number people want a powerful spreadsheet program that integrates with a closely related function such as graphing, and the word people want the best in word processing with a closely related program such as a spelling checker. Database management, the third major application, is often bundled with either word-related or Depth over breadth in four integrated packages

number-related programs because it's useful for both.

Although you must give up one of the three major applications when you opt for a focused integrated package, you gain a lot in terms of power. Our sampling considers two examples each of word-related and number-related packages.

TWO INTEGRATED SPREADSHEET PROGRAMS

In the case of spreadsheet programs, those opting for a focused package will end up with number-crunching tools equal to anything available on any personal computer. Both of the programs here offer considerably more power than the spreadsheet programs in three-in-one packages, and they are specifi-

cally designed to be easy for number people to use.

SuperCalc3a is the Apple version of SuperCalc3, the archrival of Lotus 1-2-3 in the IBM world. The Apple product uses the same file format and offers just about all the same capabilities as the IBM version, which means you can do just about any type of number crunching you like.

The package includes three disks: The /PROGRAM disk contains the spreadsheet program and database manager, and the /GRAPH disk contains the graphing functions. The /TOOLS disk contains data-conversion utilities for AppleWorks, VisiCalc, or DIF files; the Sideways program for printing spreadsheets sideways on paper; and a file-transfer utility for sending SuperCalc files to an IBM PC or compatible computer for use on SuperCalc there. None of the three disks is copy-protected.

SuperCalc3a goes out of its way to aid every user, both with superb documentation and with a long list of compatible peripherals. The documentation includes a 26-page quick-start guide that walks you through the creation of a simple spreadsheet; a 425-page ring-bound manual that contains a reference section organized by program commands, as well as a longer tutorial

and appendices; and two quick-reference cards (one for working with the spreadsheet and one for graphing). The program works with virtually every printer, plotter, and expanded memory card (up to 500K), as well as the most popular video-display cards.

The heart of SuperCalc3a is the spreadsheet program, which is fast, versatile, and fairly easy to use, given its power. SuperCalc programs have always used a set of slash (/) commands, and this version is no exception. The open-apple key is used only for scrolling rapidly or moving the cursor into a cell's entry line for editing. Typing any of the 21 slash commands (such as /L [Load] or /F [Format]) reveals one or more submenus, from which you can select more specific options. If you get lost, you can always press a couple of keys to display a context-sensitive, on-line help function.

The SuperCalc3a spreadsheet matrix is a maximum of 63 columns by 254 rows, which harks back to the days of VisiCalc, but you can consolidate values between spreadsheets to gain more space. With an expanded memory card, spreadsheets can be up to 500K, which is enough to completely fill all of the worksheet's 16,000 cells. If you have a file that's larger than your disk space, SuperCalc3a will segment the file and store it on multiple disks. If you don't have extra memory, the program's scheme for managing sparse memory makes the most of what you have by storing only filled cells in RAM. When your spreadsheets get big, you can view two vertical or horizontal windows of the same worksheet at once.

SuperCalc3a contains more than 50 built-in functions, including internal rate of return, net present value, and payment, for financial use; trigonometric functions such as sine, cosine, and tangent; calendar and date functions; and logical functions. You can name ranges of cells to make referencing them in formulas easier, sort data on one or two columns, and create command files (or macros) that let you store complex sets of commands and then exthem automatically pressing a couple of keys.

The graphing features of Super-Calc3a are available from the /GRAPH disk, which must be in a disk drive when you issue graphing

commands within the spreadsheet program. You can create many different types of graphs: pie and exploded-pie charts, bar and stacked-bar charts, area graphs, line graphs, x-y graphs, and high/low graphs. You can view graphs on the screen—in up to 15 colors, if you have a color monitor—and you can print them in as many as 99 colors on a plotter. Graph titles can print out in any of eight different typefaces. You can store up to nine different graphs with each spreadsheet file. The graph-description files are

easy to create by following prompts on the screen.

The database manager uses the spreadsheets' matrix format, so that rows represent records and columns represent fields. You can use all of the spreadsheet program's commands and functions in a database file, so you can create calculated fields using formulas, sort data on one or two rows or columns, sum fields, widen columns to up to 127 characters, and otherwise manipulate data. The difference in a database file is that you must define separate areas for entering data, extracting data, and defining criteria for data selection. You must specifically identify these areas in a worksheet by entering cell coordinates so that the data-handling side of SuperCalc3a knows how to treat entries in each area. The procedure for setting these areas up is rather clumsy, compared with using the database manager in AppleWorks or other filing programs, but the database program is suitable for manipulating information in lists.

On the whole, SuperCalc3a is an excellent spreadsheet program with flexible, easy-to-use graphics that calculates faster than AppleWorks (which is no slouch itself) and offers many more functions. The manual is very clear, and the company supplies free technical advice for the first six months of ownership.

VIP Professional

As SuperCalc3a is a knockoff of an IBM PC program, SuperCalc3, VIP Professional is a clone of Lotus 1-2-3. With a few minor differences, this program is identical to 1-2-3, and the manual even suggests several Lotus books and magazines you can consult to learn how to use VIP Professional. All the commands in VIP Professional are identical to those in Lotus 1-2-3, and the levels of power in its spreadsheet, graphics, and database modules are likewise the same. The program runs on both the Apple IIe and IIc, and a slightly more expensive version is available for the new Apple IIGS.

Although vou can use Lotus-like slash commands with this program, VIP Professional also has a Macintosh-like interface that uses pullmenus for command selection. If you use slash commands, you can type letters or use the arrow keys to select commands from pull-down menus or dialog boxes. The program also works with a mouse, however, so you can use it to display menus and select commands, as well as operate scroll bars at the sides of the screen. Several icons at the bottom of the screen let you use the mouse to recalculate, to specify absolute cell references, and to access the on-line help function.

VIP Professional is a large program-it requires 256K of RAM on the IIe and IIc and 320K on the IIGS. This RAM is necessary for the program itself, so on the Apple IIe or IIc, you must use a memory-expansion card that employs a bankswitching technique to expand the amount of memory a program can use. Cards from Applied Engineering, Checkmate Technologies, AST Research, and Legend Industries will work, but Apple's own Memory Expansion Card will not, since it acts only as a RAMdisk drive, rather than as an extension of memory directly available to the computer's processor for program storage.

The VIP Professional package contains two double-sided 5¼-inch disks, neither of which is copy-protected. One is the program disk—you load the bulk of the program from the first side of the disk and then leave the disk in a drive to load program overlays from the second side as needed. The second disk contains sample files on one side and two utilities for enhancing graphs


and converting AppleWorks files on the other side. The documentation consists of a 10-page introductory handbook, a quick-reference card, and a 260-page manual.

VIP Professional's spreadsheet program combines the ease of use of other mouse-controlled Apple spreadsheet programs with the enormous power of Lotus 1-2-3. Its maximum worksheet size is a whopping 8192 rows by 256 columns. You can use the mouse to select cell references for formulas or to indicate groups of cells to be copied or named as a range. Anyone who has used a mouse knows that this device provides a way to specify cells in a spreadsheet that is far simpler and more efficient than traditional methods. Also, easy-to-use Mac-like dialog boxes have replaced many of the nested menus of the Lotus interface (in which one slash command produces a second list of options at the top of the screen).

As you might expect, VIP Professional's spreadsheet program uses a complete collection of functions. Its financial functions are internal rate of return, future value, present value, net present value, and payment. Logical functions include true, false, and if. Trigonometric functions include sine, cosine, tangent, PI, and log. And, there are the usual arithmetic functions including absolute value, maximum, minimum, round, average, sum, and a random number generator. You can also create keyboard macros, as you can with SuperCalc3a. You can't create permanent data links between spreadsheets with VIP Professional, but you can import data selectively from one file into the file you're working with.

The built-in graphing feature in VIP Professional is rather limited you can display graphs on the screen but not print them directly from the program. You can create pie, bar, and stacked-bar charts and line and x-v graphs for display on the screen in color or black and white. You can create and save multiple graphs from a worksheet, and if you update a worksheet, the program updates its associated graphs. To print a graph on a printer or plotter, though, you must use the GraphPrint utility that comes on the second VIP Professional disk, meaning that you must quit the spreadsheet program itself and then load a predefined graph file to

print once you've booted the Graph-Print program. This method is clumsier than that of SuperCalc3a, which lets you print a graph directly from the spreadsheet program itself. Once you boot GraphPrint, however, you can choose among four different typefaces for titles; specify different printers, plotters, or interfaces; and control the graph's size and position on the paper.

The database manager in VIP Professional uses the spreadsheet's matrix format, storing records in rows and fields in columns. You can use the spreadsheet's formulas to calculate database data, and the same spreadsheet formatting commands control the appearance of your file. As with SuperCalc3a, you must create input, output, and criteria areas of the worksheet so the database knows how to treat what you enter. Once you've entered your data, you can specify selection criteria in the criteria range and have the program display certain records that match the criteria in the output range. Again, this method of manipulating data is far clumsier than what you have with most filing programs.

In summary, VIP Professional is a remarkably powerful spreadsheet program that is easier to use than many less-powerful programs. Its smooth integration of slash commands and mouse-driven menus and icons is extremely effective. VIP Professional's graphing program isn't as easy to use or as powerful as the one in SuperCalc3a, however, and the database program is only for list management. VIP Technologies supplies six months' free customer support.

TWO INTEGRATED WORD-PROCESSING/DATABASE PROGRAMS

The two word-oriented packages we'll look at below are more than just word-processing programs. With their powerful database features, these programs can help you create complete automated systems for billing, customer tracking, inventory management, form-letter generation, and more.

Nine to Five

This program takes a unique approach to meeting the needs of the average business user. Developed by a salesman for sales-related activities, Nine to Five is essentially a powerful database program with integrated word-processing capabili-

ties. It comes in 128K and 512K versions—the difference is in the amount of program information maintained in memory and the amount of special information that you have to copy to data diskettes. In the 512K version, you can initialize data diskettes and use them immediately; in the 128K version, you must take the extra step of turning over the program disk in order to initialize data disks.


Nine to Five is based on the premise that you begin with a collection of information and then create text files (letters or reports) to use that information collection produc-

tively. You could, if you wanted, use Nine to Five solely for writing simple letters, but that would be rather like using SuperCalc3a or VIP Professional just for their database features

The package includes three disks: a double-sided program disk, a sample database disk, and a sample application-files disk. You can store only one database file on a disk because of Nine to Five's file format; application files such as database reports, form letters, and normal letters must be stored on specially initialized application disks. The non-copy-protected program comes with a 92-page manual that is more a tutorial than a reference work and does not have an index.

The database manager is the central feature of Nine to Five. Files can contain up to 50 fields and can occupy an entire disk. When you create a file, you must specify the length of each field, along with its name and data type. You can set fields to contain dates, integers, decimal numbers, general data (text and/or numbers), and yes/no information. You also specify a type for each database file and use this designation later to indicate which report formats and form letters can use the file's data. The types aren't rigid—you can define your own types according to the kind of information the data file



contains, such as sales, accounting, employees, and so on. Finally, you can set a password when you set up a file, so the file is accessible only to authorized personnel.

Some special field names in Nine to Five simplify data entry. If you use Next Date and Last Date in two separate field names, for example, the program will automatically calculate the Next Date entry when you enter an integer, simply by adding that number of days to the Last Date entry in that record. It then enters the calculated Next Date automatically in the Next Date field.

Once you define a database, you can change its name, type, field names, or password; if you want to add or delete fields, however, you must transfer the information into a new database file that contains the new fields.

Once you've set up a file and entered some records, you can sort data on up to three fields, extract data with a powerful set of record-selection criteria similar to those in AppleWorks, and find or match records according to strings of data you enter. If you can't remember all the data you want to match or find, you can use "wild cards" to broaden the file's search. All these functions, like others in Nine to Five, involve going through a series of nested menus at the bottom of the screen.

The database manager is very easy to use. It makes good use of the open- and solid-apple keys, and the commands are largely mnemonic, indicating the type of operation you'll perform by the letter of the key you press. Some special commands make data entry easy, including a Restore command that undoes a new entry and restores the previous one, a Same command that duplicates the entry from a previous record, and a Next command that adds 1 to the previous integer entry and puts the new number into the current field.

You can report data from a database or insert it into form letters by creating text files on a special Applications disk. Reports can be either in a columnar format or in custom formats you design by laying them out on an editing screen. Among the powerful reporting features are the ability to combine data from two fields into one field in a report; calculated fields based on arithmetic formulas; data selection based on record-selection rules; three-level sorts; sorts based on only a certain number of letters in a field (the first three letters or numbers in a field, for example); calculations that are conditional, depending on the contents of other fields; and date calculations.

All these reporting options are available from menus and are remarkably easy to use, considering their power. The manual doesn't do a first-rate job of explaining them, but you get the idea from walking through a series of tutorials. The reporting commands are available in any text file, so you can design a form letter that conditionally includes certain paragraphs, based on the contents of a database field, or that contains calculated figures, such as in an invoice.

Although you can create ordinary letters with Nine to Five's text editor, it's really designed to work with the database program. To create a form letter, you simply include the names of the database fields from which you want to import data and then make sure your database disk is on-line when you print. Text files can be only up to 100 lines long, but you can chain-print multiple files if you have longer documents. Like the database manager, the word-processing program features a Restore (undo) command, and it includes other unusual commands such as Attach, which fills the blank space to the right of the cursor by bringing up the contents of the next line, and Divide, which splits the current line at the cursor and places the text to the right in the next line below.

Nevertheless, the word-processing program is straightforward and easy to use, if not as powerful as some others. You can move the cursor by character, line, or screen or to the beginning or end of the file, and you can delete text in the same increments. You set tabs by pressing the solid-apple and Tab keys, and you find text strings by pressing either apple key and F (although you can search forward only from the cursor position).

As for output, the text editor can control a variety of printer options, including Pica and Elite fonts; condensed or expanded print; single and double spacing; letter or draft print quality; and justified, centered, or left-justified text. Nine to Five letters and database reports can print

on any of 16 different printers.

Nine to Five would not be a good choice if you were looking for the most powerful word-processing program on the block, but it is a nearly ideal tool for salespeople and others who build collections of facts and then want to get at those facts quickly and easily in reports and form letters. This program not only focuses on two applications, but it also focuses those applications on a specific, yet fairly common work style in an effective way.




checker, and database program that loads into your Apple's memory all at once. It is really two programs, Letter Perfect (the word-processing/ spelling-checker module) and Data Perfect (the database manager), that use a common set of commands and are accessible from the same main menu. Along with an unprotected program disk, you get a dictionary disk that must be in a disk drive when you spell-check a document. The ring-bound manual has separate sections for Letter Perfect and Data Perfect, each with its own index, and there are also a master index for the entire manual and a quick-reference card.


The Letter Perfect word-processing program does most of the things you would expect from a stand-alone product. You can move the cursor or delete text by character, word, line, paragraph, screen, or from the cursor to the beginning or end of the file. Files can be only as long as available memory (about 30 pages), but you can link files together for continuous printing. Also, you can append files on disk to the file currently in memory.

As for formatting, there is good news and bad news. You can create lines as wide as 256 characters, and you can center, justify, left-justify, and right-justify text. The program also gives you boldface, underlined,

Once you enter text on the screen and begin editing it, though, the display doesn't automatically reformat itself to accommodate changes you make. Instead, you must rejustify the file before you can see how your changes will affect the document's appearance.

Also, Letter Perfect makes no use of the open-apple key for commands. Instead, it uses the Control and Escape keys, along with a series of screen prompts, when commands are nested. This approach results in some Command-key combinations that aren't very easy to remember.

The spelling checker in Letter Perfect counts the words in a document and displays suspect words in context on the screen. You can then ignore the suspect word or edit it, and you can ask the program to display alternate spellings of the suspect word. You can't add new words to the dictionary, however, so the program continues to suspect the same proper names or technical terms every time.

The database manager in Letter Perfect is quite flexible, although it isn't as easy to use as it might be. Unlike word-processing files, database files can be as large as the amount of available disk space allows. You can also merge data from a disk file into the currently open database file. As with Nine to Five, the disk-based database files are sorted and searched more slowly than if the entire database were contained in memory, since the computer must wait for disk access with large files.

A database can have a maximum of 32 fields per file, and each record can contain up to 511 characters. You can define field types as text, numbers, dates, or formulas (for calculated fields). When you enter data into a numeric field, Data Perfect provides a built-in calculator that takes a formula you enter and produces a value from it in that field.

The manual demonstrates the reporting abilities and file structure of the database manager with several examples, including a teacher's grade report (in which student scores are averaged and ranked); an accounts-receivable file (in which current purchases are added to a running balance); an address file; a customer contact file; and a person-



nel file. You can create a variety of office-management systems with this program.

The mail-merge feature in the database module lets you extract data and insert it into form letters. To do so, you create a database report and print it to a file on disk. Then, you merge that file with a form-letter document in the word-processing program. You mark data for insertion by typing the number of the field in the database file from which you want the data to come.

Simply Perfect has been around for a few years, which probably accounts for its not being easier to use than it is, but it is still a powerful combination for people who work with words. You get two highly functional programs on one disk with a unified set of commands, and you don't need a souped-up Apple to run them.

INTEGRATING STAND-ALONE **PRODUCTS**

If you don't want an integrated program right now but you want to have the possibility of integration in the future, you can buy one of the programs from a family of modular products, such as the PFS: File, Report, and Write series or the Personal Choice series. These families contain separate programs for each application, each of which comes in an individual package with its own manual. Because the modules are from the same company and are designed to work together, you can import and export data files between them. You can integrate a report from PFS:File into a document you've created with PFS:Write, for example.

In the end, many people opt for integrated programs because they combine two or more applications' power under a unified set of commands and greatly simplify the sharing of data between applications. The chart on pages 52-53 shows a variety of integrated and modular packages for different needs. Please consult the chart for product information on the software this article has covered.

ReportWorks and ThinkWorks add data formatting and outlining

MEGAHAUS augments APPLEWORKS

ppleWorks has seen its share of add-on products over the past year. It now has at least five mail-merge programs for the word-processing module, five spelling checkers, two graphics programs, six font/printer-improvement utilities, three desk-accessory packages, four or five desktop program selectors, a whole slew of desktop-enhancement programs, two macro programs, gobs of predesigned templates (see "AppleWorks Templates" by Charles Rubin in the November 1986 issue of A +)—and, frankly, more books than anyone could possibly read.

Add-on products serve at least two purposes: They overcome limitations in AppleWorks and/or add extra powers that enhance the program, and they let AppleWorks users tailor a system to their personal needs. With the proper combination of extra hardware and add-on software, an AppleWorks system can rival powerful integrated systems on other personal computers.

Two particular add-on programs are one of a kind, and they're both from Megahaus Corporation of San Diego, California. ReportWorks is a powerful and complex reporting program that reads AppleWorks spreadsheet and database files and compiles the information into custom-designed reports. ThinkWorks is an outline generator. Although outline generators are nothing new, this one is the only one that's exclusively for AppleWorks.

Megahaus made its appearance in the AppleWorks add-on market with MegaWorks, a spelling checker/ mail-merge product.

MegaWorks was the first mailmerge program for AppleWorks and, as usually happens to firsts, has been outclassed by some of its more recent competitors. Suffice it to say that Megahaus has been involved with AppleWorks for quite some time.

REPORTWORKS

Some AppleWorks users might find ReportWorks the most impor-

tant AppleWorks add-on available. Not only does it add power to AppleWorks' reporting capabilities, but it can also overcome some of the program's most serious limitations.

ReportWorks lets you selectively extract information from spreadsheets for individual reports. You can create fullpage forms and can also use spreadsheets like databases, increasing the number of categories in each record. But be warned: ReportWorks is not for casual AppleWorks users. Because of its many features and capabilities, it takes time and practice to learn and use. If you find yourself pushing the limits of AppleWorks, however, read on.

ReportWorks really begins when you design your AppleWorks files. Knowing ReportWorks before you even set up your AppleWorks database and spreadsheet files can be an advantage. For example, since ReportWorks can combine information from several files into the same report—including mixtures of data-

base and spreadsheet files—you can design your AppleWorks system with several separate files, instead of one. Knowing that ReportWorks reads information selectively from the spreadsheet module may prompt you to enter information into a spreadsheet file, when you would otherwise settle for the reporting capabilities of the database module (although it has few mathematical capacities).

fter setting up your Apple-Works files, you can begin designing your report exactly as Lyou want it to print, using the ReportWorks design screen. You can position text and fields on the screen with open-apple commands. The arrow keys let you move and reposition each element of the report. When setting up a report in the AppleWorks database module, you first decide if you want a "tablesstyle" or a "labels-style" report. Tables, in AppleWorks' terminology, present each record on a single line; category names become headings for the columns (see figure 1).

Labels, by AppleWorks' definition, can display records in several lines (i.e., form style). If you want to print a small form, such as a Rolodex card, you have to use the labels-style report because tables-style reports do not allow you to do any free-form formatting.

ReportWorks, on the other hand, does not distinguish between tables and labels, nor does it have to. On the design screen, you decide how many lines are reserved for each record. ReportWorks calls each record in the report an entry. By expanding or shrinking the "entry area," you can determine the number of lines reserved for each record.

For example, you might make entries 1 line long (as in a table), 5 lines long (as in a label), or 60 lines long (as in a full-page form). After establishing the entry area, you can insert fields where you want them to appear in the report. The open-apple-F command inserts a field, and the open-apple-arrows control that field's length.

You can type any text into the report that you like. If you place it in the entry area, this text will appear on every entry in the report, which is especially handy for creating fullpage forms. Using the arrow keys, you can adjust the position of all text and fields on the screen. Your final report design might look like the one in figure 2.

If you want, you can set up information for headers and footers in a special section of the design screen. Headers and footers can contain headings that you type, as well as fields. You can also enter information for title and summary pages.

Filling in the Fields

Once you get the hang of the ReportWorks design commands, the layout of a report comes fairly easily—it's almost fun—but the hard part is yet to come. Now you must tell ReportWorks where to find the information that goes into this nice report layout. ReportWorks fills in the fields of a report in two basic ways: by looking into an Apple-Works file and extracting information or by calculating fields elsewhere in the report.

Then ReportWorks calculates information, the report fields become much like cells in a spreadsheet. Using pre-established commands and functions, you can add the values in other fields, average the values of many fields, and create conditional statements ("if" statements). ReportWorks has more than 35 special functions for mathematical calculations, in addition to the usual addition, subtraction, multiplication, and so on. Some of the functions in ReportWorks give you calculating power you never had within the AppleWorks spreadsheet module, including the ability to evaluate text strings in formulas, rounding functions, date and time math functions, pagination functions, and several functions for converting from text to numbers and back. Also, ReportWorks has more mathematical and Boolean operators than the AppleWorks spreadsheet module does.

When ReportWorks extracts information from AppleWorks, each field in the report can come from a different AppleWorks file. You can link up to nine database and/or spreadsheet files this way. For example, you might extract names and addresses from your Mailing List file and billing information for each customer from your Invoice file. When preparing a report from a spreadsheet, you can select specific rows that ReportWorks will search for the desired information, and specific columns within those rows.

To do so, you must set up each field in the report—a host of "field definitions" awaits your command. Each field you place on a page must have a name and a type. Types include Text, Numbers, Dates, Times, and Any (Any lets you enter any kind of information). You also need to specify, for each field, which



AppleWorks file to search and what category in that file to extract, as well as how to enter the information into this report. If you link several files together, the setup is even more complicated.

The manual explains each step of this process, but ReportWorks is the kind of program that could use a book to describe its functions. Expect to spend several hours experimenting with its features. A good knowledge of the AppleWorks database and spreadsheet modules will give you a head start.

Once the report is fully designed, you're ready to begin filling it in. You can create a report that uses all the records in the files you've established, or you can set up reporting criteria (called view criteria) to select specific records for the report. These view criteria are more powerful than AppleWorks' record-selection rules for databases and are also more difficult to use.

onstruction of actual reports is where ReportWorks has limitations; it's slow. Reports can take quite some time to compile, and the more file lookups and mathematical computations in the report, the longer it takes. Large and complex reports can be worth the wait, though, especially if they're something you can't do in AppleWorks.

ReportWorks is a valuable tool for users who run into AppleWorks' limitations and who want to set up sophisticated systems for business. Remember, ReportWorks takes some time to learn. ReportWorks templates can be as complex as AppleWorks spreadsheet templates. Finally, if you're not creating large from large databases, reports ReportWorks may be more trouble than it's worth. Each report requires extensive setup and takes time to compile. The larger the database, the more this time investment pays off. **THINKWORKS**

ThinkWorks is an outline processor that works with AppleWorks. Outline processing was first made popular by Living Videotext, Inc., creator of ThinkTank (see the review of its successor, More, in this issue). ThinkTank was said actually to help you think by providing tools to help organize your thoughts. Outline processing lets you type lists and outlines on the screen and then go back and rearrange the lists, add

more information, swap items, renumber, and more.

Outline processors are a lot like word-processing programs, except they're not really made to manipulate large paragraphs of information; they're meant for lists. Outline processors automatically label elements of an outline in a hierarchical scheme, with subheadings automatically indented under main headings. Moving and rearranging elements of an outline is much different than moving paragraphs, because of the numbering system that must change to accommodate changes in sequence. Finally, outline processors let you view certain levels of outlines and keep other levels hidden. You can take an outline like this one:

- I. Preface
- II. Chapter One: Introduction

A. Overview

- B. Learning the System
- III. Chapter Two: Getting Started

A. Overview

B. How to Begin

C. Summary

- IV. Chapter Three: Conclusion and view it like this:
 - I. Preface
 - II. Chapter One: Introduction
 - III. Chapter Two: Getting Started
 - IV. Chapter Three: Conclusion

The more detailed information is still there for future reference; it's just hidden. Outline processors are fairly simple, and ThinkWorks is no exception. Some features that set ThinkWorks apart from the others of its kind include its use of standard alphanumeric numbering:

- I. Roman Numeral One
- II. Roman Numeral Two
 - A. Uppercase Letter
 - 1. Arabic Numeral One

a) Lowercase Letter

ThinkWorks allows up to nine levels of headings. A heading can be a single line or paragraph of up to ten lines. Commands for moving information appear in a list on the screen.

The Move command lets you move sections of an outline to other areas, and you can decide how you want to adjust the numbering scheme after the information moves. You can keep all heading levels the same as they were before the move (e.g., uppercase letters remain uppercase letters after moving), or you can indent the information one level (e.g., uppercase letters become Arabic numerals after moving).

Another handy feature of Think-Works is its ability to transfer information between outlines, which is especially useful for breaking up large outlines into smaller pieces. You can merge one outline (or portions of it) into any location of another outline. The Zoom command hides and displays various levels of the outline. The program has nine zoom levels-one for each of the outline levels.


hinkWorks has two options for printing an outline: You can print to a printer or to an AppleWorks word-processing file. Outlines printed to word-processing files can be read intact into the AppleWorks word-processing module-handy if you like using outlines as guides for writing.

ThinkWorks is a well-made outline processor that works with AppleWorks in that it can write to AppleWorks-compatible files. The ThinkWorks program, on the other hand, cannot read AppleWorks files.

If you're in the habit of making lists and outlines, ThinkWorks may be the program you've been looking for.







The Print Shop, the first Apple program to offer a simplistic approach to "printing," is still going strong.

The program consists of the following modes: Greeting Card, Sign, Letterhead, Banner, Screen Magic, and Graphic Editor. The first four modes don't require explanation. Screen Magic lets you freeze dynamic kaleidoscopic patterns and print them, with or without superimposed text (see figure 2). It also lets you print out any standard hi-res graphics image in perfect proportion. The Graphic Editor lets you create original Print Shop-compatible pictures or modify existing ones.

Anyone who can turn on an Apple computer and read menus can use The Print Shop. After selecting a mode from the main menu, you follow step-by-step instructions to create your document.

First, using the keyboard, a joystick, or a KoalaPad, you choose and place the graphic elements. They in-



clude borders (you get nine to choose from); illustrations (from a library of 60 pictures, symbols, and abstract patterns in three sizes); and type. You have a selection of eight typefaces in two sizes each and three type formats: solid, outline, and three-dimensional. The last thing you do is type in your text, which is automatically left-justified, right-justified, or centered, as you direct. Then you print.

The Print Shop Companion

The Print Shop Companion adds to your printing repertoire by letting you create and print weekly or monthly calendars. The program, compatible with The Print Shop, includes 50 new borders, a border editor, 12 new fonts, a font editor, and an enhanced graphics editor that lets you capture art from other publishers' game and graphics programs for use in The Print Shop. Two bonuses that are especially appealing to children are part of the program: Tile Magic creates kaleidoscopic pictures, and Creature Maker lets you combine the heads, bodies, and legs of different creatures. The manual is full of wonderful ideas for using Print Shop and Companion.

The original Print Shop had two serious flaws. One was that you couldn't see your document before printing it. If, for example, your selected text was too large for your graphic, you didn't find out until it was printed, so you wasted lots of time and paper. The second problem was the lack of a Save option. If you designed a card and wanted to print it later, you had to recreate it from scratch. Happily, an upgrade of Print Shop is now available.

Now you can preview your creation before printing it, as well as save it to disk. Most exciting, the new Print Shop lets you print in color (see figure 3). If you have a printer with multicolor output, you can select different colors for your border, graphics, text, and background.

The new Print Shop includes a utility program that allows you to upgrade your original Print Shop Companion disk, but the Preview option does not work with the Calendar mode. If you own the original

PrintMaster

PrintMaster brought The Print Shop's capablities to other computer systems before it came out with a version for Apple computers.

This program, almost identical to The Print Shop in operation as well as options, lets you create greeting cards, stationery, signs, banners, and calendars. The graphic elements include borders (11), illustrations (122), and typefaces (8). PrintMaster was the first to include Preview and Save options.

PrintMaster has its problems. For one thing, you cannot back-step and edit your designs as you can with

The Print Shop. Also, PrintMaster is considerably slower than The Print Shop. I was annoyed that every time you boot the program, it asks you to calibrate your joystick. Another difficulty involves the program's error trapping. Sometimes when your data disk or the wrong side of the master disk is in drive 1, the program flashes a message instructing you to swap disks, but the drive keeps spinning. You're forced to remove a disk from an active disk drive and insert another into it, which can be harmful to the data.

Neither of these programs allows a great deal of flexibility. When you design cards, signs, and so on, you must use one of the layouts the software offers. You can't combine different pictures in one document. The typefaces are so bold that you are limited to only a few characters on a line. Depending on the face and size of the type you choose, you may find that only five or six words fit on a page.

Output from one of these programs is similar to that of the other, so stylized that it is immediately recognizable as a Print Shop or Print-Master creation. Nevertheless, these programs are fun, useful, and easy to

use.

Summing Up

The Print Shop and PrintMaster are so similar that it's difficult to recommend one over the other.

PrintMaster's advantages over the original Print Shop were its Preview and Save options, but the new Print Shop includes these functions. Now PrintMaster's main distinction is that you can use uppercase and lowercase and combine different fonts in one design (see figure 1).

The graphic elements, pictures, borders, and type differ between the programs, and I cannot say that one is preferable to the other. Both pub-

lishers have come out with diskettes of additional pictures, fonts, and borders for use with their programs—you can use the graphics for either of these programs with the other. An example of such an adjunct diskette is the new Holiday Edition diskette in Brøderbund Software's Graphics Library series for use with The Print Shop. Its graphics, typefaces, and borders include images and symbols for more than 15 holidays (see figure 4).

If cost is a consideration, you'll want PrintMaster (see figure 5). The single package includes the ability to make calendars as well as greeting cards, stationery, signs, and banners (to get calendars in the Print Shop format, you need The Print Shop Companion), and you get more graphic elements on the disk. If you're willing to spend more money, I'd recommend the Print Shop/Print Shop Companion combination, which gives you many more



USING THE APPLE IIGS TOOLBOX

In last month's issue (pages 77–85), we took a first look at the programmers' toolbox of the Apple IIGS. Now we'll discuss the link between your program and the tools. We'll be talking in generic terms because the specifics of incorporating tool sets into programs vary slightly from language to language. Fortunately, the concepts are similar, especially among the languages in the Apple IIGS Programmers' Workshop.

A IIGS language usually comes with two sets of toolbox-related files. One set is source code, the oth-

er object code.


The source-code files contain many predefined variables and data structures carrying readily identifiable names that you can begin using in your own source code. They will save you from declaring the same toolbox variables over and over in each application. Moreover, you are assured that they are done correctly.

You can use these predefined variables in your source-code listing, provided you instruct the compiler to incorporate the external source files into your source code at compile time. To do so, you place instructions for the compiler (compiler directives) at the top of your source-code listing to include or use as many of those source files as you need. The files are typically grouped according to tool set, making it easy to specify those files to be merged into your program.

The object-code files that come with the language contain the actual routines that make toolbox calls possible in your program—something the core compiler does not furnish.

Therefore, the linker links your program's object code with as many tool-set object modules as you direct in the command to start the linker. The result will be a load file that makes the appropriate calls to the Tool Locator each time a tool is requested as the program runs.

The Include or Use instructions are simply assembler or compiler directives. They do not represent the calls to the toolbox routines while the program runs. You place actual calls to the toolbox throughout the program as needed.

CALLING A TOOL FUNCTION

Apple has documented the toolbox calls in full detail in a two-volume set called *Apple IIGS Toolbox Reference*. A call to a toolbox routine, as listed in these references, looks like any statement that might be a part of a programming-language vocabulary. Here are some examples of tool calls you might make

to the Window Manager:

NewWindow SetWTitle CloseWindow SelectWindow DisposeWindow

Most of these statements are in plain language, although occasionally a tool call is abbreviated. SetWTitle, for example, is short for "Set Window Title." Notice, however, that all tool calls are single words. This restriction is for the convenience of the compiler, since compilers find single-word commands easier to recognize than those consisting of multiple words.

Most languages try to adhere to the vocabulary of tool calls defined in Apple's reference material, but that's not always the case. In fact, you may encounter languages, particularly assembly languages, that have different ways of making tool calls. Instead of using the tool-call vocabulary as is, the assembler may require you to precede the call with an underscore characer, like this:

_NewWindow

The underscore is for the convenience of the assembler: It recognizes any word beginning with an underline as being a toolbox call. You may also find languages that use slightly different words for some toolbox calls. When this happens, the new vocabulary words are similar enough for you to make an immediate connection between the new words and the ones defined in Apple's documentation.

Jumping to the Toolbox

In case you're wondering what happens inside the computer when

you make a toolbox call, here is a synopsis of the procedure.

Typically, your program will be following a list of instructions that you write (although converted into machine language). The instruction pointer will be wildly directing the microprocessor to follow instructions from your program loaded in the perhaps tens of thousands of RAM addresses. When the microprocessor encounters a toolbox call, the instruction pointer jumps to the address of the toolbox routine (perhaps in ROM). As soon as the toolbox routine is complete, the instruction pointer returns to its jumping-off spot in RAM and continues working its way through your program instructions (see figure 1).

If you've had experience programming in any language, you will recognize this methodology as that of a simple subroutine from your main program. In this case, however, you don't have to write the subroutines, since they have already been designed and optimized for you. Nor do they take up any disk space in your finished program file.

PASSING PARAMETERS

Toolbox calls are occasionally self-contained, action-oriented functions. An example is one called HidePen. When you issue this tool call, it unilaterally turns off the drawing pen on the screen. When you issue that statement, the tool simply does its action and returns control back to the program—the tool has nothing to report back to

the program. The vast majority of toolbox routines fall into one of three categories, however:

- 1. they require input
- 2. they generate output
- 3. they require input and generate output

Let's look at an example from each category, using calls that affect the display of text in a window.

To change the font of a block of selected text, the program has to call the SetFont toolbox routine (in QuickDraw II). Of course, just calling SetFont tells the computer nothing, since somehow we need to convey the particular font we wish to set. That information is considered input to a toolbox call. The way information is passed to the toolbox varies with the language in which you're programming, as we'll see later. For now, suffice it to say that this tool requires submission of a handle to the information in memory that contains the characteristics of the font we want to use.

The opposite occurs when our

program needs to know what the current font is. To obtain that information, the program uses the Get-Font tool call (also in QuickDraw II). In this case, we have no input for the tool, because it assumes we want to know the current font. When the tool routine has finished, however, the tool will need to give us information, its output. Again, the way this output reaches our program depends on the language in use, as we'll see.

The third category consists of tool calls that require input before running and produce output when they're finished. An example of such a call is StringWidth. This call needs to know the location in memory of the text string that the tool is to measure. When the tool has measured the desired string, the result is then produced in the form of an integer that corresponds to the number of picture elements, or pixels, on the screen the string occupies.

As you begin to program for the IIGS, you'll quickly see that most of the tools fall into the types that involve input, output, or both. Relatively few tools are freestanding functions.

PARAMETERS AND THE STACK

The best way to illustrate the way parameters pass to and from toolbox routines is to examine what happens to the stack during a toolbox call. Only assembly-language programmers will have to bother with direct stack manipulations. High-levellanguage programmers will have the impression of using other means of passing parameters; in reality, the load file generated by a high-level compiler and linker uses stack mechanics, just as assembly-language programmers do. Everyone, therefore, can benefit from this explanation.


Input Parameters




Figure 2: Pushing a handle onto the stack

When we called SetFont, above, we had to pass the handle to the font we wanted as the current font. To do this procedure with the stack, an assembly-language program starts by pushing the handle onto the stack (see figure 2).

Since the stack gets smaller and the contents of the stack pointer (SP) decrement when an item is pushed onto the stack, the illustration makes perfect sense.

Once the parameter is on the stack, the program can call the toolbox routine. When the routine runs,





it automatically looks to the stack for the information it needs—a handle in this case—and pops it from the stack without any intervention from the assembly-language program (see figure 3). Once the routine is finished, control of the program returns to the assembly instructions, and the stack returns to its previous status.

Many toolbox calls require that more than one parameter be pushed onto the stack before being called. Parameters, such as a sequence of pointers and table arrays, can be of unequal length. When a toolbox call expects multiple parameters, those parameters must have been pushed onto the stack in the proper order so that the tool will pop them in the right order. For example, if you push first an integer and then a pointer onto the stack, the tool must expect to pop a pointer and then an integer from the stack—the reverse of the order in which they were pushed onto the stack. If the tool expects a two-byte integer and instead pulls half of a four-byte pointer, then the tool will surely fail and cause a system error. The Apple IIGS Toolbox Reference manuals detail the order of multiple parameters for each toolbox call. Observe parameter order religiously.

Output Parameters

but emit output, we have an entirely different methodology for the stack. Just as a tool knows how to quietly pop an input parameter from the stack, so too does it know how to push an output parameter onto the stack-sort of. The qualification is that the program must specifically request that space be set aside on the stack for the output that is to come from the toolbox call.

For example, if our program is about to call the GetFont tool, which sends as its output the handle to the current font, we must make room for that handle on the stack before calling the tool.




Figure 4: Preparing the stack for output

In this case, we must make room for four bytes of data, since the handle coming back will be four bytes long (see figure 4). The empty space usually consists of zeros. The importance of this procedure is that the stack pointer must decrement so that For tools that don't require input | the tool won't overwrite important stack data with the output. If a tool is to output multiple parameters, then you must reserve enough space for them all on the stack.

When a tool supplies output as its result, it is said to return a particular kind of data. For example, in good programmers' jargon, GetFont "returns" a handle to the current font. Get used to hearing return as a way of identifying a tool's output.

Input and Output

Stack manipulation for a tool that takes input parameters as well as returning output parameters is only slightly more complicated, in that it combines the actions of the two individual actions. To demonstrate, we'll use the StringWidth tool call described earlier. An assembly-language programmer has to plan the actions of the tool before calling it. Since the tool will return an integer representing the pixel width of a text string, the stack must have enough empty space available for an integer that the tool will push. Of course, the pushing happens after the tool has popped the pointer to the text string from the stack. In other words, the order in which the assembler program must push the space and pointer is (1) the space for the output and (2) the pointer to the text string (see figure 5).

Then the assembler program can call the StringWidth tool. The tool-




Figure 3: The tool pops the handle from the stack.




Figure 5: Pushing a space and a parameter onto the stack





Figure 6: This toolbox routine leaves only its output on the stack.

box routine automatically pops the string pointer from the stack and writes the resulting pixel-width integer into the space remaining for it on the stack (see figure 6).

Again, by preparing the stack prior to a tool call, an assembly-language programmer (or a high-levellanguage program under direction of the compiler) is able to lay in any number of blank spaces and input parameters for complex tools that have multiple input and output parameters.

High-Level Parameters

Although a high-level compiled language usually doesn't bother with stack manipulation, you will still have to furnish input parameters and know how to obtain output parameters after IIGS toolbox calls. Pascal and C are remarkably similar to each other in working with toolbox routines that accept and return parameters. Therefore, we'll generalize here a bit to give you an overview of the mechanics of handling parameters in these lan-

Both languages have a syntax that lets programmers assign the value returned by the tool to a variable name. You attach input parameters to the toolbox call by placing them in parentheses immediately following the call in the program listing. Except for minor variations in punctuation, the following listing shows how the StringWidth toolbox call might look inside a high-level-language listing. The call measures the width of a text string whose location in memory has been identified earlier in the program as a pointer called txt:

width = StringWidth(txt);

Behind the scenes, the language places the pointer (named txt) on the

stack, calls the StringWidth routine, and places the width integer on the stack. The language goes one step further by assigning the value of the width integer to the variable called width. Once the language has run this program function, it can use the variable name width in calculations such as determining the center point of the text string so that the text can be centered in the window before display of the string.

Toolbox calls that do not return output are often called procedures in a high-level language. Tool calls that return output are called functions. Both procedures and functions can pass input parameters, but only functions get output parameters in return. Your language manual should demonstrate ways of nesting procedures and functions to help reduce the number of lines of source code your programs require. For example, if your program has only one instance in which you need the value StringWidth returned for use as an input parameter in a different toolbox call, you can skip the step of defining the width variable. Instead, you can use the String-Width(txt) function, itself, as an input parameter. Its returned value (the width) will be passed directly to the other call.

THE APPLE IIGS VS. THE COMPETITION

The new Apple IIGS is almost like a candidate for public office with a famous last name—the name and organization behind it guarantee a certain level of attention, but in the end the machine itself will have to compete on its own merits.


And compete is what it will have to do. Apple's newest machine joins several other quite respectable desktop computers already looking for favor in the school and advanced home markets. Along with Apple's own Macintosh, there's Commodore's Amiga, Atari's ST series, and PC-compatibles from companies such as Tandy (Radio Shack).

Each machine, of course, has its particular strengths and weaknesses (see the chart that accompanies this article) and will appeal more to certain buyers than to others. For the IIGs to survive and prosper, however, it will have to please enough of the people enough of the time.

The biggest advantage that the IIGS has going for it, naturally, is that it is an Apple II. Being a member of an already successful line of computers gives the nascent IIGS a base of software, an established dealer network, a known and stable support organization, and a community of users and developers who already like working with this series of machines.

In comparison, the Amiga and the Atari ST both represent sharp departures from their producers' previous offerings, and even the Macintosh was originally created outside of the existing Apple organization. As a result, those machines all took quite a while to define their markets and ac-

cumulate software, and all have suffered from several zigzags in their marketing.

For personal-computer users, stability is important not only because it protects our investment and ensures that we can find parts and repair, but also because it attracts software developers. The more stable a computer appears to be, the more willing developers will be to spend the time and effort to create powerful and nifty software for it. The IIGS and its producer, developers know, are not likely to vanish in the immediate future.

The II and the Mac

The second big advantage the IIGS provides is that it blends what Apple has learned from the Apple II series with its experience with the Macintosh. Like the other II-series computers (other than the IIc), it is an open-ended, expandable machine. Like the Mac, it has a user-oriented pictorial interface.

Actually, both the lessons of the slot-oriented Apple II, II Plus, and IIe and the comprehensive design of the IIc affected the design of the new machine. The seven main slots on the IIGS accept ordinary II-series boards. The provision of that kind of backward hardware compatibility certainly is a welcome approach.

From the IIc side of the family, the IIGS includes two built-in serial ports and a new disk-drive interface. Both can serve as alternatives to cards that provide those functions, freeing up slots for other functions and bringing the cost of the basic system down. You can't use the new built-in serial ports with unmodified existing communications programs, though, because the IIGS uses a serial controller chip that you'll find in the Macintosh but that's new to the Apple II.

From the Macintosh, the IIGS inherits a software approach that includes the obvious mouse-and-windows user interface, plus an internal toolbox that other programs can call on to provide a user interface similar to that of the Macintosh. The presence of the toolbox will serve as a strong incentive for developers to provide their programs with a consistent look and feel, which in turn will make it easier for users to learn different programs.

The Mac design is also where the IIGS gets its serial chip. Apple brought the Zilog SCC chip of the Mac over to the new machine because that chip allows the IIGS to work with AppleTalk. A IIGS, just like a Macintosh, needs only some inexpensive software, cabling, and a

junction box in order to link up with the LaserWriter and other Apple-Talk-equipped computers and peripherals.

Personal computers from other companies have also learned from the success of prior Apple machines. The IBM PC probably owes its slotted design to the Apple II, and much of the original PC software was based on prior packages for Apple machines.

The visual style of the Macintosh has also influenced competing machines. The Amiga has its Intuition visual user interface, the Atari and some PC-compatibles have GEM, and programs for dozens of other machines use a mouse-and-windows approach. Even though Apple didn't the mouse-and-windows invent method but picked it up from the Xerox Star computer, most personal computers that use this approach seem to owe more to the Mac than they do to any other prior machine. Chip Controversy

The choice of processor chip of the IIGS may prove to be controversial. The 65C816 chip, with its combination of virtually perfect emulation of the 8-bit 6502 processor of previous Apple II computers and a new 16-bit mode, does provide several advantages over the 6502, but some developers wish that Apple had taken a slightly different approach.

On the plus side, having the 6502 mode and the electrical similarity to the 6502 even in the 16-bit mode is what made it practical for Apple to design a new, more powerful machine that also ran previous software and worked with existing hardware.

The 65C816 can also run 6502 code at a faster rate than the 6502 can—in the IIGS about 2.5 times as fast as an Apple IIc or IIe can, in fact. So even programs that have not been rewritten will show a performance increase. That factor is important mainly for the prior generation of software, however, since most developers of school and home software that are preparing new products for the IIGS say they'll be taking advantage of the 16-bit mode.

The new chip does indeed address much more memory than does the 6502 (up to eight megabytes on the IIGS), which facilitates development of more powerful software. Paradoxically, it also enables programmers to write software that is

easier to use—the more convenient the software the more complex the program code needs to be.

Some programmers (and the 65C816's designers) also claim that in the 16-bit mode this chip is particularly fast and efficient compared to other chips, but programmers are notorious for their highly polarized and inexplicable devotion to their own personal choice of chips. The chip does perform certain operations in fewer cycles than either the 6502 or even the 68000 on the Macintosh, Atari, and Amiga do, but other operations run much more slowly than analogous ones on other advanced chips.

The 65C816 is a new chip, which means a potential for bugs or at least unexpected effects in certain applications. New chips always bring a mixture of increased power and increased uncertainty.

Because the 65C816 is a new chip, programmers have needed to specially create all the software-development tools that they need for writing software for the Apple IIGS. Although Apple generally wins praise from developers for the overall quality of its support, the company took longer than predicted to produce development tools for the IIGS, so third-party software developers had to start with minimal aids or create their own.

Along with the organizational delays, programmers also had to add the extra mental-preparation time for using a new chip. Programmers who were familiar with the 6502 and the 68000 had to learn a new chip architecture, a new way of thinking, and a new set of chip strengths and weaknesses. The lack of early availability of any high-level language exacerbated this problem.

Even for assembly-language programmers, who were able to adapt

existing routines fairly quickly, using a new chip meant that they couldn't simply recycle stock routines developed for other machines. The 68000-based Atari and Amiga, in contrast, have often benefited from existing software because developers for those machines could reuse routines for the 68000 chip that originally were written for the Macintosh. Likewise, PC-compatibles for the home and school markets can draw on a legion of tools created for business applications.

Enhancing the Video


With the video capability of the new machine, on the other hand, Apple has struck a path closer to the standard practice of the industry. The IIGS offers a maximum resolution of 640 horizontal by 200 vertical pixels, with up to 16 colors available on each line.

A 640×200 color screen brings the Apple up to the capabilities of the Atari, Amiga (the Amiga also has a 640×400 color mode, but that mode is rarely used because it requires a very expensive monitor with special long-persistence phosphors), and the stock PC with a Color Graphics Adapter. For text, the 640×200 screen allows a full 25 lines of 80 characters, based on an 8×8 -character cell.

The use of a 640×200 screen also hints at Apple's plans for flat screens. Already, 640 × 200 flat-panel displays are available from other manufacturers. Apple is known to be interested in flat-screen technology for the Mac and is also committed to greater sharing of peripherals across its product lines, so a flat screen for the Mac might also work with the II series. An even higher resolution might work best for the Mac, since it already offers a vertical resolution of more than 200 lines. A 640 × 400 screen could serve both machines well, however.

The color palette on the new IIGS extends to 4096 possibilities (all the combinations of 16 levels of 3 primary colors), which puts it at the top end of the range for machines in this class—the Atari ST has 512, the Amiga 4096, and the stock PC or compatible 16. As with the ST and the Amiga, the IIGS can access only a limited number of those colors at a time.

In the IIGs's new video modes, each pixel is represented by 2 to 4 bits of memory that give each dot



one of 4 or 16 possible values. These screen bit values then serve as pointers to a color palette, which in turn holds selected tints and hues from the 4096 possible color values.


The new video design is also a regularized approach that lets the computer set any bit to any color, rather than to the "artifact" color of the 8-bit Apple II computers that restricted certain pixel positions to certain color possibilities. Since the price of memory has decreased, the IIGS designers could afford to use several bits of memory for every pixel position. That extra memory means a lot less effort on the programming end to get color right and a lot better color on the viewing end because the quality of the video image isn't limited by color-placement idiosyncrasies.

Comparing the IIGs's video to that of other machines, we see that the Atari likewise has 4 colors per line available at 640×400 , with 16 similarly available at 320×200 . The Amiga can give you a full 16 colors on each 640×200 line and can go to 32 at 320×200 . IBM PCs and compatibles with stock video can produce only one color without dropping down in resolution.

The IIGS produces an analog video signal, rather than digital output. Analog RGB is the type you find in high-quality home video-component systems and videotape playback and is more readily available and less expensive than the digital RGB video the IBM PC uses. The analog monitors also respond better to the large IIGS color range.

For the IIGS, color fidelity is particularly important because of its anticipated role as an educational machine. Although simple, bright colors may be quite acceptable for action games or word-oriented productivity tools, more realistic color and images can be central to the effective presentation of many types of tutorial material.

On the less sparkling side of the ledger, the IIGS lacks some video features that game writers and players would probably have asked for. As with the prior designs from Apple, the IIGS video is purely bit-mapped memory. It lacks special graphics chips and coprocessors. The CPU chip itself has to do all the intelligent video work, which is particularly difficult for a chip that's running at only 1 or 2.5 MHz and



complicates the writing of fast graphics programs.

The IIGS also lacks hardware dedicated to writing "sprites" and "playfields," which can simplify the programming of some types of games. In contrast, the Amiga, which specializes in on-screen graphics, has dual playfields and eight hardware sprites.

Sound to Shout About

Although the color-output capability of the IIGS is good but hardly unique, the sound is a decided step up from what other popular machines currently provide. The IIGS includes a fairly complete music-synthesizer chip from Ensoniq that goes far beyond the minimal audio output of prior Apple products.

The Ensoniq sound chip brings to the IIGS 15 separate voices of sound, each of which you can independently control or blend together. Each voice is controlled by two oscillators, so you can vary both volume and pitch.

That enhanced sound capability lets you add movie-quality music to adventure games or a full melodic range to a theme song. It can also furnish realistic sound for educational applications.

Initially, we'll see mostly snippets of these complex sounds in IIGS programs, because sound still takes up a good deal of memory. Even though the Ensoniq chip rates its own 64K of dedicated memory in the IIGS design, it can run through as much as 10K of memory a second—a standard IIGS with 265K of memory won't be much for lengthy performances.

You can, of course, load a IIGS with up to eight megabytes of memory, which gives you more than a minute of high-quality audio and even more if you compress the data before you store it in memory. I suspect, though, that Apple is also looking forward to better ways to store sounds, especially CD-ROM optical

disks that store 600 megabytes each.

One question is whether Apple or other vendors will assume that IIGS owners have a stereo card in their computer. Even though the IIGS can produce stereo output, only a single channel currently comes through the case to an external connector. The other channel, available inside the IIGS case, requires an added card.

The Atari ST series also has a sound chip, although one that Apple partisans will call considerably less powerful. Providing 3 voices instead of the 15 on the IIGS, the Atari sound chip runs independently and therefore doesn't tie up the processor, as the Apple chip does. Whereas the IIGS must alternate between musical applications and other tasks, the Atari can do both at once.

On the Amiga and the Mac, sound is mostly a function of software. The Amiga includes four digital-to-analog converters (DACs) that run together to produce two stereo channels, the Mac's single DAC producing a monophonic result. The PC uses a simple counter chip, meant mostly for producing a beep on its internal speaker.

The Atari ST series has MIDI (Musical Instrument Digital Interface) connections built in instead of requiring an extra board to provide this link for hooking up MIDI instruments. MIDI boards should be forthcoming for the IIGS, but they will require an extra purchase.

The Keyboard's Wired

With the IIGS, Apple introduces a new connection scheme for use between the central processor and input devices such as the keyboard, mouse, and joysticks. This Apple Desktop Bus is mechanically convenient—the IIGS has a detachable keyboard, and the mouse can go on either the left or right side—and it also provides a logical way of connecting a multitude of possible input devices to the computer.


This scheme creates the obvious advantage of configurability. Just about everyone agrees these days that a detachable keyboard is a plus, and third-party developers are already working on alternative keyboards, mice, and other devices to supplement the standard input complement.

For classroom use, you'll even be able to hook up multiple keyboards to a single IIGS machine, with the software able to distinguish which





Keyboard preferences among users are as personal and inexplicable as choice of language or CPU chip among developers. Many people will like the IIGS keyboard, and some will not. It sports 80 keys in an office-typewriter layout, plus a 10-

key numeric pad.

By contrast, none of the other competing machines have a generalpurpose method of connecting input devices, although all accept a range of input devices. The Atari ST has a built-in (nondetachable) keyboard, and the PC and many compatibles need an extra adapter card to let you use joysticks or other supplementary input devices.

Taking the Sum

In the end, even the most fierce IIGS partisans at Apple will probably admit that in most ways this machine is neither a breakthrough product nor even in all ways the best of the current state of the art. On the other hand, it should do well for the reasons that the Apple II family has traditionally succeeded in the past.

The IIGS represents accessibility rather than new capability, and a continuation and extension of an enviable record in the past. By providing a smooth upgrade path from previous II-series machines, the IIGS rewards our loyalty and builds on what both we and Apple have learned up to now.

In the computer industry, those who ignore history don't stay around long enough to worry about repeating it. The IIGS shows that Apple has been studying the past as well as thinking of the future. In the months to come, we'll all see how the rest of us grade that homework.

The Learning **E**Curve

COMPUTERS AND CREATIVITY, PART I

The educational potential of combining art and mathematics

The educational application of personal computers generally involves either specialized programs that teach or test certain concepts, or "tool" programs such as word-processing software. Although these uses of computers are perfectly legitimate, one area I think deserves increasing emphasis is the use of computers for the development of creative expression.

Many of us have used graphics programs that let us draw pretty pictures on the display screen and then let us print them out. Classroom use of such products is often restricted to "free-time" activities or to illustration of themes or poems. In the latter case, the artwork is supplemental to the primary task, the creation of a written piece. We are at the point, however, where creative and artistic applications of computers can help bring art back into school curricula.

All human cultures have art—it is an essential part of our being. I believe that computers can and should be used to help us develop an appreciation for and an understanding of art as a creative process. Furthermore, I believe that we can integrate art with other parts of the curriculum in ways that benefit everyone, not just the "artistically inclined."

The Trojan Horse of Art

A popular phrase these days refers to the Trojan horse. Apple, for instance, presents desktop publishing as the Trojan horse that will carry the Mac into the mainstream of the Fortune 500 companies. In edu-




Figure 1: Low-resolution picture for A=0, B=0, S=20, and N=2, resulting from the equation x2+y2

cation, say some, LogoWriter is a word-processing program that will act as a Trojan horse to bring Logo into all classrooms.

From my perspective, computerbased materials can serve as the Trojan horse that restores education in the fine arts to all our schools.

My reason for this belief is that computers allow the creation of complex and beautiful pictures through the use of fairly simple mathematical functions that students should be learning about anyway. Once high-quality graphics programs are in use (e.g., in the study of mathematics), crossing the boundary to the fine arts, where these same programs can be appreciated purely from an aesthetic or design perspective, is only a short step. More and more high-quality graph-

ics products are becoming available for the Apple II series. Next month, I will describe two commercial packages (Creativity Unlimited from Sunburst Communications and Fantavision from Brøderbund).

This month, I want to share a simple program that any Apple II user can enjoy, a program you are free to type in and experiment with yourself. You may find yourself lost for hours exploring the rich wealth of patterns that can emerge from this program, a cross-disciplinary tool for exploring the mathematics of art as well as the art of mathematics.

Textile Designs

The cover story of the September 1986 issue of *Scientific American* was the "Computer Recreations" column, written by A. K. Dewdney. His topic that month was "wallpaper for

the mind," a description of a set of mathematical algorithms for creating lovely graphic images on computer displays. The first algorithm he described was developed by John E. Connett of the University of Minnesota. His patterns were generated from the following rule: Take the formula x2 + y2 and look at a grid of points on the screen. At each point (x,y), compute the formula, truncate it to an integer, and then place a dot at the point if the result is an even number. The simplicity of this rule hides the fact that it generates extremely complex and pretty results.

To explore this technique myself, I created some Applesoft BASIC programs that build patterns on the computer screen. (Yes, I actually write programs in Applesoft!) Here is the starting program:




You create different pictures by entering different values for the starting parameters. The program draws a picture of the region centered on the values of A and B. 





restrict the picture to black and white, I chose to take advantage of the 16 colors in the Apple II low-resolution-graphics mode. The color is set in line 160. This line calculates the remainder of Z when it is divided by the number of colors (N). For example, if N is 16, then the remainder value will be a number between 0 and 15. Each of these numbers corresponds to a different color. Figure 1 shows the pattern that results when A=0, B=0, S=20, and N=2.

Different values of S result in patterns other than the interlocked circles. I have spent many hours creating pictures with this simple program, trying (in vain) to predict what I would get in advance.

Simple Changes

By making a few simple changes to the program, you can explore many other patterns or explore existing ones in greater detail. For example, if line 140 is replaced by

140 Z = 10 * SIN (X * X) + 10 * SIN (Y * Y)

the design in figure 2 appears for A=0, B=0, S=10, and N=16.

Colored patterns this program generates are particularly striking on the Apple IIGS with an RGB monitor. The patterns remind me of Madras prints on textiles.

The Hi-Res Alternative

Whereas the low-res screen provides a lot of colors, the hi-res screen provides more detail. The only changes you need to make to use this screen are the following:

You should also change line 70 to reduce your color choices from 16 to 4.

Figure 3 shows the kind of pattern you get with this program when A=0, B=0, S=10, and N=2.

High-resolution patterns take a lot longer to calculate than low-resolution ones, so you may want to modify the program to generate and automatically save an entire collection of pictures that you can then load and look at after letting the computer work all night. from BASIC. For example, suppose you want to generate a set of pictures, each of which has the same starting points and colors but a different scale. In order to modify the high-resolution version of the program to generate ten pictures with values of S ranging from 10 to 100, delete lines 50 and 60 and add these lines of code:

85 FOR S = 10 TO 100 STEP 10 192 PRINT "BSAVE PICT"; S; ", A\$2000, L\$2000" 194 NEXT S

Be sure your disk has 170 free blocks to hold your pictures!

When you run the program, it asks you for the starting positions and the number of colors you want. Then the computer starts generating and saving the pictures automatically. Depending on the function you choose for line 140, this process can take anywhere from several hours to a day.

Once the program is finished, you will see that your disk now has a lot of files named PICT10, PICT20, etc. To see any of these pictures, enter the following from your keyboard:

BLOAD PICT10, A\$2000

The picture PICT10 will appear before your eyes in a few seconds.

Opportunities for Learning

Granted that the patterns this program creates are pretty to look at, but how are they to fit into an educational activity?

Let's explore this question from the perspective of a math teacher. Two major opportunities leap to mind for the use of this program.

The first has to do with modular arithmetic. The color at each point is determined by a modulo (remainder) calculation in line 160, which means that all points of the same color (on the low-resolution screen) have the same remainder value. Linkages of dots with the same color create contours.

Contours appear in other disciplines, such as cartography. This program thus provides educators with an opportunity to connect the concept of mathematical contours to altitude contours in geological maps, for instance.


ery is to play with different mathematical functions in line 140. You can use any generalized function of x and y. To generate interesting patterns, the function might need scaling to make sure it produces values large enough to allow plotting of several colors.

Artistic Exploration

A topic for exploration in the classroom is to try to decide ahead of time which kinds of functions are likely to be interesting and which are not.

By starting with low-resolution images, you can try ideas out in a few minutes. Several teams of students can spend a class period experimenting with different mathematical functions and then share their results with the entire class. This highly experimental approach to mathematical discovery is far more interesting than many other classroom activities and is also how real mathematicians work. In this manner, you can use the program as an artistic vehicle for the exploration of mathematics.

THE SIGNALS OF THE SEASON—1986


A holiday gift, BBS wonders, and a New Year's resolution

As we log off of 1986 and look forward to the carrier signal of 1987, telecommunications grows ever larger and ever more competitive. Modem prices are falling, and new telecommunications programs such as CommWorks (PBI Software), Point-to-Point (Pinpoint Publishing), and others make connecting to an on-line service easier and faster. Fellow modem mavens already know what I mean, but for those of you who have yet to experience the on-line world, I can only ask, "What are you waiting for, Christmas?"

Meanwhile, back in Norwalk, Connecticut, the elves at the marketresearch firm International Resource Development (IRD) have released their "Electronic Mail Report," which provides a ten-year forecast for the electronic-mail market. IRD presents a rosy picture, claiming 1986 revenues of \$340 million will increase fivefold to almost \$2 billion by 1996. Among the other predictions: IBM will not offer an Email service (it does own a big chunk of MCI, of course); voice messaging systems will see significant growth; and more E-mail systems will interconnect.

A Gift from Mnematics Videotex

Mnematics Videotex is not a household name, but it does epitomize the small-company legend of building a following through technical prowess and innovation. Mnematics operates an on-line service with all the offerings you might ex-



pect: E-mail, special-interest groups (SIGs) covering a variety of topics, interactive on-line chatting, electronic shopping, multiplayer games, news, weather, and other consumeroriented services.

The service has been on-line since January 1983 and offers a good selection of SIGs—science, gardening, sports, literature, science fiction, movies, puzzles, cats, Apple II, and Macintosh—even though many of them are not as active as one would hope.

Likewise, you will not find a vast selection of games, multiplayer or otherwise, on Mnematics. The big draw right now is a multiplayer role-playing game called The Dulcimer Crystal, which seems like a takeoff on the *Star Wars* saga. After all, what else can you call a game that pits Princess Lexia Zenobia against the vile Emperor Darhtmal Veebner? Toss in Obeah rebels, "lazer" cannons, mutations, mysterious crystals, and Brigand shadowfighters, and you get what I mean.

What really sets Mnematics apart, however, is its E-mail service. While CompuServe and MCI trumpet their achievement of sending messages between the two systems, Mnematics does a bit of one-upmanship. While logged onto Mnematics, you can send E-mail to fellow Mnematics subscribers, CompuServe subscribers, MCI Mail subscribers, and subscribers to The Source. If you're so inclined, you can add Telex subscribers to the list too. That covers

just about everybody. In fact, Mnematics is so good that National Public Radio chose the company over The Source for its E-mail service.

Subscribers in England will especially like the tie-in through the IPSS (International Packet Switching Stream). This British version of Tymnet allows overseas subscribers to connect at the same price as domestic subscribers.

Mnematics admits that U.S. subscribers may not benefit from that arrangement as much as the Europeans, but if you have a hankering to order a British Rail Pass or peruse British databases, Mnematics may be for you. Perhaps the biggest advantage is the ability to chat on-line with someone in Britain-something I did one Sunday morning. The exchange of small talk and ideas can be an eye-opener.

The biggest weak spot is the documentation. The three-ring binder is nice, but the system information could have been better organized and presented more effectively and completely.

So what do these telecommunications capabilities cost? Exactly \$39.95 to set up an account and \$4.50 an hour (no minimum charges) through the Tymnet system.

The subtitle of this month's column mentions a holiday gift: Through December 31, 1986, any A + reader who circles the Mnema-







Most text adventuring remains tethered to the puzzle concept, but two first-rate new games may point toward new territory.

ADVENTURE ADVANCES

Text adventures and adventurers certainly have become sophisticated lately. The Open Mailbox command that once seemed so mind-boggling has been superseded by statements like "Pick up the screwdriver and stomach pump. Drop the used spatula. Tie the paper dolls to the Winnebago and order a side of fries."

Even so, text adventuring remains tethered to the puzzle concept-



save the universe/solve the mystery/kill the vampire/find the treasure.

Two first-rate new text adventures add spice and intrigue to the genre, however, and tentatively point toward new territory.

NAUGHTY BUT TOO NICE

Journalistic eyes shifted lasciviously last June when Infocom announced Leather Goddesses of Phobos, an "adult" adventure for the Apple II line and the Macintosh. Suddenly, those hours spent in front of juvenilia such as Grandpa Pac-Man and Cosmic Cow Catcher seemed worthwhile. The new game, by Steve "Hitchhiker's Guide" Meretzky, promised three levels of naughtiness and plenty of the kind of software titillation that a lonely computer reviewer could dig a word-processing program into.

For those expecting a nasty time, Leather Goddesses' Lewd, Suggestive, and Tame levels turn out to be more like Smirking, Nudging, and Dozing. For players who don't require prurient fulfillment from a computer game, though, Leather Goddesses has a lot of tantalizing Meretzky wit.

Leather Goddesses is less a sex adventure than a takeoff on those terrible old movie serials of the 30s, the kind with tin-can robots and football space helmets: Green space

creatures appear at a bar in Sandusky, Ohio (seems like a long way to go for a beer), and whisk you away to one of the moons of Mars. When you regain consciousness, you spend time wandering through landscapes and mazes to find the items that will defeat the Leather Goddesses' imminent invasion of Earth.

Sound familiar? Mazes, items, landscapes? Yup, Leather Goddesses is



the stuff of mainstream text adventuring with a 3-D comic book, scratchand-sniff card, and dramatic situations from some of Hollywood's worst thrown in just for the heck of it.

Although it's based on stinko flicks, Leather Goddesses is no nominee for a Golden Turkey Award. Meretsky enlivens his adventure conventions with verbal style; e.g., "The place: Upper Sandusky, Ohio. The time: 1936. The beer: at a nickel a mug, you don't

ask for brand names. All you know is that your fifth one tasted as bad as the first."

Leather Goddesses includes both male and female versions so players of both sexes can enjoy its innuendo. It's a nice touch that allows women adventurers, too often neglected in male-oriented games, to participate in the appropriate fantasy.

And then there're the three levels that protect innocent players from the bleep words. Players can switch between levels. When you choose Lewd, the computer asks your age. If you don't have the right answer, Leather Goddesses notes, Sorry, you must be at least 18 to enter LEWD mode. I guess none of you 13-year-olds are going to lie about that, huh? Who could fib to a computer?

The game contains little for mom and dad to worry about, though. In the Suggestive and Lewd modes, Leather Goddesses gets into a little salty language, but nothing you wouldn't hear standing outside my computer-room window during a heated round of Marble Madness. (The neighbors are starting to complain.)

WHO AM I?

So, just when I've saved the human race from intergalactic destruction, I wake up naked in a strange place.

Campbell Award-winning science-fiction author Thomas M. Disch sets up his new Electronic Arts adventure, Amnesia, with a familiar situation: You wake up in a hotel in New York City. You don't

While we're at the mov-

ies, give a squawk for Howard the Duck: Adventure on Volcano Island, an adventure based on last summer's Lucasfilms quacker. And from Activision's GameStar subsidiary comes

Championship Baseball, another joystick twister with split-screen action and strategic team drafting.

Been computing so much you're cutting out paper dolls? How about cutting out a helicopter with Brøderbund Software's The Toy Shop? Print out customized templates; do a little pasting onto cardboard; and cut and assemble your own cars, planes, and balloonpowered "steam" engines. It's The Print Shop by way of Santa's elves.

Fight it out on the elves' home turf when Electronic Arts lays out the snowy battlefield in the Apple II version of Arctic Fox, a tank-combat simulation in the frozen North. Invite your friends over to party and then wipe them out with EA's Make Your Own Murder Party, a computerized mystery generator that prints out rap sheets and personalities in order


to make your next gettogether an Agatha Christie whodunnit. Also, Dan "Mule" Bunten and Ozark Softscape return with **Robot Rascals**, a multiplayer computerized scavenger hunt.

The adventure pioneers at Sierra On-Line forge the way again with Space Quest for the new Apple IIGS (and the rest of the Apple II series), an animated arcade/adventure game in the tradition of King's Quest and The Black Cauldron.

For text-adventure fans, **The Pawn** is available for the Apple II from Firebird. This role-playing fantasy boasts one of the best parsers in the business.

"Hey, dad, can I destroy life as we know it tonight?" "Sorry, son, before you detonate nuclear weaponry in **Theater Europe**, you'll have to call an 800 number to get the code word." This contemporary NATO vs. Warsaw Pact conflict doesn't let computer generals take nuclear holocaust lightly, at least not without a phone call to IntelliCreations.

For more nuclear war, check out Balance of Power, programmer Chris Crawford's peace game of international politics, now converted for the Apple II line by Mindscape. For combat of a less-sophisticated sort, tighten up on a half-nelson in Mindscape's Bop 'n' Wrestle, a tongue-incheek and knee-inkidney simulation of the grunt-and-flop world of professional wrestling.

TURN ON, TUNE IN, BOOT UP

Dear Tim,

I just wanted to drop you a line, Tim. It's about Mind Mirror. Headware you call it, IA (intelligence appliance), and something about mental fitness. You toss out words such as psychometric, Macro-Thoughts, and Microscope. I read the words, but I figured, "What's to worry?" and plunged into the game without detouring too far into Jargonland.

is Mind Mirror? What's it all about?"

I looked very thoughtful and answered, "It's a little like Alter Ego and a little like Mind Prober." Then I shook my head and said, "But different." That drove them crazy, you see, because I hadn't really told them anything. (The truth is, I was still trying to decide myself.)

Tim, you say that individuals can use Mind Mirror alone to play mind games or to understand their thoughts better

(Auto-Play). Also, you say that people can play the game in groups, perhaps learning more about each other in the process (Inter-Play).

Well, if you want to know what I think, Mind Mirror's best quality is you, Tim. I'm not sure what I learned about myself, or anything else for that matter—but I'm getting ahead of myself.

I tried all different levels of play: Beginner, Intermediate, Master, and even Professional. At first the additional coaching of the Beginner mode was helpful, but later I was able to bypass that assistance.

I tried both Mind Play and Mind Tools. Mind



Play was amusing. For instance I used the adjective rating system to rate my favorite singers against each other. I also rated religious figures and even computer software. In Mind Tools, I rated my housemate in her many moods and myself in several of my manifestations. By the way, tapping the space bar to change between Plain Talk and Shrink Rap (psychological terminology) is a good idea. For instance, I might not have understood a word such as cute as signifying eager to please.

The program began to show promise when, after completing my ratings, I displayed my first set of Mind Maps. You suggest a similarity to the human eye, the inner circle of the map being the retina. I like that analogy. Human qualities (such as

energetic or irritable) encircle each of the four Mind Maps, and each map shows a lot of information quickly—not only what human qualities you selected from the ratings, but also how much of each quality. You also see a different number to represent each rated subject, making visual comparisons possible. Very interesting.

OK. But, Tim, the Life Simulations are where you really begin to shine. As in Alter Ego, you take the rated subject into life, but Mind Mirror starts even further back, all the way at conception. I laughed at their trials and tribulations—being both sperm and egg—while trying to make decisions consistent with the rated



subject's personality. At first, I kept checking with the Mind Maps to see if my results were in the win circle.

Eventually I played games at skill levels that had less and less feedback and smaller win circles. I went all the way up to the Wizard level, where I couldn't get any feedback at all and there was no

win circle.

The Life Simulations are full of Learyesque humor and an almost predictable unpredictability, but it's the personal touch, the sense of Tim Leary, that makes this game most fun. I mean, I was able to play each of the four Realms consistently with the personality of the rated subject. I was even able to obtain the passkeys to enter the final phase of Social Interaction and navigate my way through PTA parties, church groups, socialite parties, and other social venues, and finally through my home zone to win the game.

at legal moves (perfect as a tutorial aid for inexperienced players); and a clear, well-written manual that contains only one small glitch—it neglects to tell you to use the cursor key when you are changing any of the program's parameters.

Probably the most useful feature for novices as well as veteran chess players is the program's printing capabilities. After any given move, the program can print the board or a record of previous moves. It also allows for continuous printing during game play, providing hard copy of moves and technical information.

Colossus Chess can examine 300 positions per second, according to the documentation. Its opening book contains approximately 3000 positions, and the program can "look ahead" up to six moves. At its highest level of play, the program approaches Grand Master Tournament level. Nothing that can occur in a game of chess has been omitted: Colossus Chess handles underpromotions, the 50-move rule, draws by repetition, and difficult mating combinations as easily as it does standard mates, castling, and en-passant captures.

Colossus Chess IV's wide range of options lets you tailor the game to your tastes, execution is quick and efficient (the level of play influences the speed), and the mechanics of play are topnotch. If the program has a drawback, it is only that its assumption of prior knowledge of chess makes it unsuitable for rank beginners. For anyone who knows enough to move pawn to queen-4 on his first move, however, Colossus Chess IV may well be the best of its kind currently available.







There is a corrupt bureaucracy, complete with a bestial enforcement wing. The rest of the detritus is a motley crowd called the Breakers that makes the cast of Road Warrior look like yuppies. And those are the nice ones.

You have to deal with



these characters in order to complete your quest. Your only resource is your mind, a sometimes sorry consolation indeed when you are confronted with a dim-witted Gak or any of the other lethal opponents you will encounter in your travails.

There is method to this madness. The authors of this epic have deliberately set out to create a comic-book universe that incorporates elements from everything from "Buck Rogers" to Buckaroo Banzai, from cyberpunk to social consciousness

and beyond. They handle all this diversity in a noholds-barred, tongue-incheek fashion that rolls along at a hilarious rate. Even the 1200-word parser (the portion of the program that interprets English and drives the command structure) seems to have an attitude problem when it comes to chiding you about your grammar and

spelling.


I have never been so impressed by a software program in my life. MacGolf combines brilliant research with superb animation and excellent program design. That assessment may sound a little extreme, but believe me, it's not. I currently have a crowd of programmers clustered around my Mac playing MacGolf. They've been playing for six hours now, and frankly I'm getting tired of being sent out for pizza and

It's easy to see the attraction. MacGolf is involved, intricate, and very realistic. Even my mother, who is allergic to computers, was favorably impressed by this program-no mean feat. She was quite the golfer in her time and knows the game far better than I do. She particularly liked the fact that the whole game was mouse-driven, and once I explained the control panel to her, she was swatting 'em down the fairway like a real champ. When she left, she was muttering something about buying a Mac so she could play golf without throwing out her back.

So enough of the shameless testimonials. Here's what MacGolf is about: You (regrettably a male figure, whether you fit the description or not) stand at the tee and address the ball. Slide bars and buttons allow you to adjust variables such as swing power, posture, attitude of the club's attack on the ball, and direction. An overview of the fairway is on the left, and wind direction and strength show up in the control panel (the wind changes with every turn of play). You set everything the way you want it, click on the View button, and then click on Swing. Your figure takes its stance and with a most satisfying "swooshwhack" sends your ball off. Its progress appears on the overview. Odds are that the next sound vou hear will either be a splash or an "oops."

Once you get the feel of the game, you will probably find yourself in a sand trap or in the rough (long grass). Good luck. Swing power varies dramatically, and obstacles are not easy to overcome, although you might find it amusing to note that, try as you might, you cannot hit a tree. Nor can you be





clopped on the head by somebody else's wayward ball. Eventually you will make it to the putting green. Here your control conditions change again, and so do some of the basic laws of physics. The wind indicator now shows the lay of the land; if you hit the ball too hard, it will roll over the hole. Maybe Newton was wrong-but if you play MacGolf, you will no doubt find it in your heart to forgive him.

Speaking of forgiving, forgive me. Two more programmers just showed up, and MacGolf allows only four players per game (unless you're playing in teams). They're getting restless, so I'm going to get that pizza. And you should get MacGolf. Just remember to keep it to yourself. Or hire a bouncer.

MacGolf comes complete with two golf courses and a variety of skill levels. Practical Computer Applications says more courses will be available in the future.

PLAY BALL!

I can see why they call it HardBall! Its superb graphics and minimal manual led me to expect an easy time, but as soon as the computer pitcher had fanned my first batter for three strikes, I knew I was in trouble. I lost my first game of HardBall!-26 to zip. I got determined. I wasn't going to go down as easily next time. I watched the pitcher during his windup; watched the shadow of the ball to help gauge its trajectory; kept my eyes open for curves, sliders, and screwballs—and, just like the Mighty Casey, I struck out again.

HardBall! is a one- or two-player baseball game from Accolade. I've seen quite a few baseball simulations over the years, and this one might be the most enjoyable. It doesn't have a lot of teams—only two, and they're completely fictional, at that—and there are times when you might like more control of the players, but the pluses far outweigh the minuses.

For starters, HardBall! has fantastic graphics. In the pitching/batting sequence, the figures are four or five inches high and fully animated. You see the pitcher in 3-D perspective from just behind the mound (and slightly to the right). At the bottom of the screen is an inset that shows the whole diamond and any base runners. You can watch the full windup and delivery by the pitcher, and the ball and its shadow sail toward the batter at an unpredictable speed, and the batter swings . . .

You begin the game by choosing whether to play against the computer or

against a human opponent. You also decide whether or not to have designated hitters and determine the visiting and home teams. In a two-player game, the defense (fielding team) uses the joystick, and the batter/base-running side uses the keyboard.

Each pitcher on your roster has a set of four pitches in his arsenal, from a selection that includes fastballs, curves, sliders, sinkers, off-speed pitches, or change-ups. There is also a pitch called the fastball!—a real smoker. You use the joystick to pick one of the pitcher's four pitches, and then you pick whether to send it over the plate, high, low, inside, outside, or with any possible combination of these options (high and inside, low and outside, and so on). The batter can then take the pitch or swing; swings can be straight on, high, low, inside, or outside. The batter can also choose to bunt, and you can instruct a man on base to steal. In case of a steal attempt, the catcher automatically throws to the appro-

throws to the appropriate base. I didn't see any steal attempts succeed.

When (and if) the batter hits the ball, the scene changes to the Fielding mode. You see half the field at a time, and the closest fielder to the ball, whom you control with the joystick, is automatically ready for action. You can dive for grounders or catch line drives, popups, and long flies. You can also try to pick off runners after you catch a fly ball. You throw to any base by pulling the joystick in the appropriate direction.


Meanwhile, the batter will run to first automatically, but once you instruct him to take the next base, he's committed. Any man on base who is forced by other runners will advance automatically, but you have to instruct any unforced runners. More than once I've watched my man on second base stay put while the batter singled to right field. If I had told him to, he could have gone to third, or even scored.

You might think that seeing only part of the screen at a time would be a disadvantage and that the switch from one view to another would be confusing. Surprisingly, the scheme works excellently. It happens so quickly that you usually have time to adjust and gain control of the appropriate man. The advantage is that the figures are larger than they could be if they were all on the screen at once.

Pitching is an art, not just of speed and accuracy, but also of timing and



strategy. Your most successful innings will be those in which you throw a mix of pitches. For instance, an inside fastball followed by a slider right over the plate often fools a computer batter who is



looking for another fastball. One fact of baseball life is that pitchers tire. As the pitcher loses his stuff, the batters will begin to hit almost all his pitches. You take a big chance if you try to keep one pitcher through a whole game.

Other managerial decisions include exchanging player positions or substituting players in other positions; setting infield and outfield alignments; and even intentionally walking a batter. On the other hand, the pitcher can't pick off a runner, fielders never seem to commit errors, and you can't argue with the ump.

HardBall! has a pretty stiff learning curve, in particular when you're learning to hit the ball—a batting-practice mode might help. But you won't soon grow bored with the game. This game offers some real challenge, and you'll surely cheer when you finally beat the computer.

CRUISING IN PLACE

I say, dear readers, what started out as a jolly relaxing endeavor transformed into a marathon odyssey of the most somniferous proportions. Indisputably, perusing the box containing Murder on the Mississippi, a joystick-driven, murdermystery adventure game from Activision, tickled my fancy. What could be more exciting than matching wits with a murderer while aboard a riverboat on the Mississippi River—especially in the company of the renowned sleuth Sir Charles Foxworth?

Well, would you believe watching cars rust in Liverpool? How about waiting for a headache to go away in the middle of Heathrow Airport? Perhaps telephoning the BBC and being put on hold? With or without Muzak, it doesn't matter.

The whole problem revolves around the interface. This chap, Adam Bellin, who created the program in the first place, deserves a pat on the back for thinking up a more or less innovative approach that involves a joystick in place of a parser structure. You move Sir

Charles and his faithful manservant Regis Phelps across the screen with the joystick and then pick from a menu whenever you want to do something or question somebody. It's a jolly, jolly good idea. In the second place, however, Bellin deserves a swift kick for the way he put this system into practice.

See here, mate, I don't


expect Sir Charles to be a British version of Speedy Gonzalez, but considering the way he moves, he should be called Sir Jerry Atric. Getting through a door is an excruciatingly painful object lesson in monotony. Walking from the top deck to the boiler room is an exercise in boredom. It's enough to make you take up snail drag racing for a hobby. In case you need to be told again, moving around is slow, slower, slowest-and that is on the faster setting.

That is not to say the plodline, I mean plotline, isn't enticing. By jove, Rob Swigert weaves an interesting enough tale, with an assortment of eight suspects, a variety of clues, and apparently contradictory testimony. Your task is to sort the fact from fiction and nab the murderer.

Indeed, questioning the suspects is one of the highlights of the game. The characters start to flesh out, the story begins to take on substance, and the resulting interaction between you and the program imbues your quest with a sense of purpose. Murder on the Mississippi even lets you take notes on the screen in scripted letters. You can share these notes with the suspects in your efforts to catch the murderer.

Again, the ideas are wonderful, but the execution leaves you waiting around like one of Henry VIII's wives in the Tower of London. It is not if the system chops off your involvement, but when. I suppose this torpor could be called suspense, but suspense should emerge from the story, not from the amount of time you spend guiding Sir Charles across the screen.

So, if you have a lot of time on your hands, a deep desire to play a murder-mystery adventure



game set on riverboat, and an incredibly stiff upper lip, then sound a tally ho and pick up Murder on the Mississippi. For the majority of us who want to spend more time playing than waiting around, however, this is one boat slower than the one that goes to China. Murder on the Mississippi holds some good ideas, but they remain in dry dock awaiting repair.



WORDS WORTH A MILLION

Can you write a wordgeneration program for this month's puzzle?

You can play mathematical games with words by using a simple substitution code. Assign a numerical value to each letter of the alphabet, starting with 1 for Z, 2 for Y, and working backward to 26 for A. You can then come up with a value for any word in the English language by multiplying the values of each of its letters. For example, the word hello is worth 1,128,600, obtained by multipying 19 \times 22 \times 15 \times 15 \times 12. Is there an English word equal to exactly 1,000,000? If not which comes closest? Only words found in The Random House Dictionary of the English Language (unabridged edition) can be used—no capitalized words, none with hyphens or other embedded punctuation, nor those designated as foreign. Come up with a program that generates words rather than testing them.

Send a complete program that solves the puzzle. If you send a disk, also include hard copy. Your program must be short, elegant, and self-documenting. The best solution wins a one-year subscription (or extension) to A + and a Certificate of Excellence in Programming and will be published here. Send all entries, which must be received by December 8, 1986, to Computer Calisthenics, Box 2329, Stanford, CA 94305. All entries become the property of the author. The winner will be selected by the author, whose decision is final. The winning program will be announced in A + March 1987.



Answer to July's Puzzle

July's puzzle sent the "coincidental" mathematician back to buy four items of four different prices from the absentminded clerk, who entered them on a desk calculator, pressing the multiplication key instead of the addition key and coming up this time with \$6.75, the product being the same as the total would have been had he been adding. We asked what those prices were, whether they were unique, and how quickly a computer program could produce them. Another way to state this problem is: What four numbers add to 675 and multiply to 675000000?

One way to solve this sort of puzzle is by examination, doing most of the work by hand before putting the partial results into a program. This was the approach several entrants took. They determined, for example, that the prime factors of 675000000 were 5, 5, 5, 5, 5, 5, 5, 5, 3, 3, 3, 2, 2, 2, 2, 2, and 2.

They also determined that no single item could be made up of more than three 5s, because four 5s multiplied out to 625, making it impossible to spread the remaining factors among three other items and still have all four add up to 675.

There are but three 3s, so three items cannot each have one 3 as a factor, because then the sum would not be divisible by 3 (but 675 is di-

visible by 3).

Since 675 is odd, either one of the terms contains no 2s (that is, multiplies out to an odd number), or three of them contain none. If three contain none, the fourth must contain all the 2s (multiplying out to 64), and (from the earlier conclusion) the number must contain one factor of 5, and nothing else—thus it must be 320. If so, at least one of the other items must contain three 5s and nothing else. (It can't have a 3, because that would make it 475, which, added to 320, is too big, and we've used all the 2s.) The other two terms must then be 5, 5 and 5, 5 in combination with the 3s. From this conclusion, you can extrapolate that no item can contain all the 2s.

You can draw further conclusions

July's winner is a short, sweet program from St. Cloud, Minnesota.

by examination. Given the fairly strict limitations on what factors can constitute each item, a program examining only those factors quickly comes up with the solution to this problem.

Duy-Minh Nhieu of Montreal gets an honorable mention for this approach, his 40-line BASIC program, 13 lines of which are remarks, executing in less than two seconds. He demonstrated that we are not talking about one set of answers, but two: \$2.25, \$2.00, \$1.50, \$1.00, and \$2.50, \$1.80, \$1.25, \$1.20.

The trouble with this method, however, is that, having gone this far in preliminary reasoning, you might as well go the rest of the way and work out the answers by examination—and that wasn't the point. We want the *computer* to do the work.

R.H. Windschitl, of St. Cloud, Minnesota, wins the prize, for a short, sweet program that runs a bit slower than Nhieu's but doesn't require partial results from manual examination.

Other entrants submitted programs in Pascal and C that, although they produced correct solutions, took longer to execute. Since the source files for these programs were considerably longer than Windschitl's and because they came from compilers (which ought to run considerably faster than the equivalent BASIC algorithm) rather than interpreters, I think Windschitl deserves the prize.

Here is what his program does (offering "apologies" to Jeffrey Zar-kin):

He assumes that, for any set of positive numbers, the geometric mean (the *n*th root of the product) is less than or equal to the arithmetic mean (the sum divided by *n*, where *n* is the number of numbers). You can demonstrate the validity of that assumption by trying several sets of

numbers in this short program (in which n is 4):

10 INPUT A,B,C,D

20 S=A+B+C+D

30 P=A*B*C*D

40 PRINT "Geometric mean of product

(";P;")=";P^(1/4)

(";S;")=";S/4

Given the sum of a set, you can place an upper limit on the product; likewise given the product, you can place a lower limit on the sum. The function FN R(Q) determines the maximum possible product of all four items, when the cost of one of the items equals Q, and compares it to the total.

If the actual product exceeds the theoretical maximum, obviously the corresponding cost cannot be part of any solution. Using the value T/4 gives the highest possible maximum product and serves as an anchor point for seeking the upper and lower limits in a binary search.

Lines 100–148 thus calculate the range within which all unit costs must lie.

Line 150 catalogs the costs in the valid range that also divide into the scaled total. (All costs must fit here, since their prime factors do.)

Line 160 forces the first cost to be odd since, the total being odd, at least one cost must be odd.

Since 64 divides into the scaled total, at least one other cost is a multiple of 4, and line 170 forces the second cost to fit that constraint.

Line 180 cancels the two just-determined costs from the two equations, arriving at Y+Z=S and Y*Z=P. Substituting, we get (S-Z)*Z=P; thus, $Z^2-S*Z+P=0$.

Line 190 solves for the two remaining costs, eliminating negative money.

Line 200 sets Z equal to the larger of the two, while eliminating fractional pennies.

Line 210 determines the remaining cost as S–Z, ensuring that it is positive.

Line 220 prints the results.

Then Living Videotext released ThinkTank, the program didn't really fit into any existing software category. Sure, it was an outliner ("What's an outliner?" most people asked), but it was more. The ads said "idea processor"; reviewers tried phrases such as "hierarchical organizer"—all true, but no label really described it adequately.

Living Videotext has done it again with More. This new program is supposed to be more than an outliner, more than just an enhanced ThinkTank—the buzzwords this time are phrases such as "power outlining," "outline charting," and "desktop presentation."

Evolution of an Outliner

The core of More is ThinkTank 512, without some of that program's limitations and drawbacks. You can change fonts, sizes, and styles for headline levels; you can use standard editing techniques in headlines; standard window scrolling is the default mode; word-processing

features in document windows are more powerful; sorting is no longer agonizingly slow; and you can have multiple windows open—up to six at a time, depending on the size of the outlines and the memory of your Mac. You can save More outlines in formats that are directly readable by other programs such as Word and Jazz, you can save any part of an outline as a separate document, and you can append any outline on a disk to the outline you're working on.




Figure 1: The leader character for each headline can indicate several different characteristics. Headline levels can have different styles, but font changes affect the entire document.

On the outlining level, More does more than address ThinkTank 512's shortcomings. It has a wealth of features for, well, power outlining (see figure 1). Features such as

• Templates. Any time you find yourself using the same group of headlines over and over—perhaps This Week followed by subheads for each of the days—you can add it to the Template menu. Selecting a template from the menu automatically puts all its headlines and subordinate information into the outline. When you install a template into the


menu, it becomes a part of More, so it's there the next time you open the program.

• Hoisting. If you select a headline and "hoist" it, all of a sudden you'll be working in a new outline that begins with the hoisted headline. This technique is helpful for doing a lot of work on an initially minor headline that's buried someplace on the umpteenth level.

• Promoting and Demoting. You can promote the subheads of a selected headline to the same level as that of the headline—all the items subordinate to those subheads also shift a level. Alternatively, you can demote a list of same-level headlines so they all become subordinate to the one at the top of the list.

• Cloning. The program lets you make active copies of selected headlines and their subordinate topics. If you make any changes to the original or a cloned copy, all the clones are affected.

• Mark and Gather. You can select any headlines you want, no matter





where they are in the outline or how far apart they are. Once you've "marked" them (the leader characters turn into > signs), you can gather them together. You can gather the originals, copies, or clones and put them wherever you want them.

• Calculate. Any numbers in a group of subheads can be summed, with the total appearing in the head-line over them. The numbers don't have to be alone in the subhead, so the program can handle statements such as gos ... \$22 in an expense list.

• Search Options. More's searchand-replace options are amazingly flexible. You can search with single and multicharacter wild cards, you can specify numeric or alphabetic ranges in the search string, and you can even replace the found string with the contents of the Clipboard.

Each of these features alone is powerful, but together they are incredibly versatile. For instance, More can do a Mark and Gather operation that searches for any headPresent your outlines in tree or bullet form with More, a powerful program that is loaded with options.

line with a dollar sign in it, clone the headlines under the heading Total Expenses, and perform the calculation for the total. Then you can hoist the expense headline and have the program search and replace to add .00 to every figure that has a whole-dollar amount. That's a lot of information reorganizing with only a few keystrokes.

Tree Charts

More's two major new features both provide alternative ways of presenting information in outlines (see figure 2).

Tree charts put your headlines

into boxes joined by lines that show their relationships. The chart design gives you lots of freedom, and it's all simple to do.

You construct tree charts in the Tree Chart window by using the icons along its side (see figure 3). With these icons you can select the shape of the boxes, the type of branch, and the thickness for both. You can add shadows to the boxes, choose justifications for the text in the boxes, and zoom in and out for partial and full views (the full view may span multiple pages).

he overall arrangement of the tree is adjustable too. You can have vertical or horizontal alignments, and you can start with the root and branch out or vice

The Tree Size window lets you change the size of the boxes and the distance between them. As with so much else in More, you have a choice of methods: type in the sizes you want or manipulate the sample box directly. The Tree Options com-

mand lets you choose the pattern the box is made from or filled with, and you can also use it to turn the background grid and window rulers on and off.

You can print tree charts right from More, but they can also be saved as editable MacDraw documents. And, interestingly enough, the program lets you copy and paste them into a document window so they'll show up in a bullet chart.

Bullet Charts

More's second special charting feature creates slidelike presentations of your outline information; unlike tree charts, bullet charts can display document windows attached to each headline.

Bullet charts can be designed strictly for printing—whether by an

ImageWriter or LaserWriter or for transparencies depends on you—but you can also set them up as part of presentations that use the Mac itself as the slide projector.




Figure 4: You can combine many different styles of components in a bullet chart by using the control bar. Bullet charts can be presented in slide-show fashion, automatically or manually, and can contain as little or as much of your outline as you want.

A bullet chart can contain as much or as little of your outline as you want. To design the chart, you use a control bar on the bullet-chart screen. You can design the frame, choose from different fonts and styles for the text,

adjust spacing and overall size, and define the labeling for the subheads in the chart (see figure 4).

If you're using a Mac to give a presentation, you can get rid of the control bar and the menu bar. You can leave the Mac on automatic or control the display of slides yourself. Because graphics pasted into document windows can be part of a bullet-chart presentation, your slide show doesn't have to be merely a series of bulleted text items. Also, because you can control the looks of the screen even when the controls themselves are invisible, your display design can change as you make the presentation-key phrases, for instance, can turn bold or italic when you want to emphasize them.

More Needs a Little More

It's hard to do More justice in an article this size; it needs a book to delve into all its features and their possible uses, although the manual does an admirable job of that. The program isn't perfect, though. It has three surprising omissions, one of which is potentially dangerous.

More's major shortcoming is its


lack of an Undo command. Not so big a problem, you say? Well, when you can use Clear to get rid of something and it goes into oblivion instead of onto the Clipboard, and that something could be a head-line with a dozen attendant.


attendant subheadlines and text windows, you're talking major problem.

The other obviously missing features are a Delete command to erase outlines from disks (a minor annoyance) and true numeric sorting (a medium-size headache if you're working with numbers).

Printing Problems

More's nearly perfect user interface starts to break down when it comes to printing your outline. You have a lot of options, so you must make a lot of menu selections before you're ready to print. You start with Headlines and then Documents from the Format menu to set parameters for those items; next you need Print Options from the same menu to set headline labels, spacing, and so on; and still in the Format win-

dow, you choose Header/Footer. (Color Print and Table of Contents are also available on the Format menu.) Moving over to the File menu, you need Page Setup and, finally, Print—and, in the Print dialog box you've got check boxes for things such as whether or not you want the table of contents, index, or

headers/footers printed. There's certainly too much information for only one or two dialog boxes, but a better arrangement than the current one must be possible.

When you're getting ready to print, you notice another frustrating limitation. Headers and footers can include only the document (or headline) name, the date, and the page number. You can't place the header where you want it in the margin, either vertically or horizontally, and

you can't even select the order in which the allowed items appear. As I said, the program's convenience comes apart as soon as you start the printing process.

Some other, more minor, items also need attention. Exporting an outline to Word, for instance, leaves you with new-line breaks instead of paragraph markers for every paragraph; you have to use the global-replace method to put the paragraph markers in. You'll probably forgive More's imperfections, however, because the program has two or three extras for every one of its half dozen or so oversights.

A Few More Things

Here's a brief rundown of some of More's extra features:

- Time and date stamping put the current time or date in the outline when you select the command from the menu or use the keyboard command. The formats for the time and date are adjustable.
- You can print in color (with the ImageWriter II), defining headlines of a certain level to be a certain color.
- You can dial a phone number by selecting it in the outline and issuing the Dial command.
- You can create an appointment outline by pulling out the calendar,

ore's user interface comes closer to ultimate Macness than anything I've seen. It's easy and intuitive and usually provides at least three ways of doing the same thing—by keyboard, menu, or mouse click, wherever your hand (or mouse) happens to be at the time. This is particularly important in a program that has such a wealth of features.

More boasts several nice touches that should be standard to all Mac software, features that at least ought to be present, even if the methods of using them vary.

- When you're opening a document—and a large More document can take a while, since it's all held in RAM—you get a visual indication (the document icon, gradually filling with black) of how much of the total is already loaded at any time, and you can cancel the loading process.
- Another filling icon appears when you're saving a document, although you cannot interrupt this process.
- When you're printing, a printer icon gradually fills to show how much of the printing is done so far and how much is left—the program has Pause and Cancel options.
- A Save All command in the File menu comes in handy when you have more than one document open. (Print All would be a nice addition.)

As more programs take advantage of Macs with new ROMs and more than 512K of RAM, we should see more of them incorporating More's window-handling techniques. They include

- A Zoom box in the title bar of every window, just like the ones in the Finder (when you're using the new ROMs).
- A Window menu that not only lists the open windows but also assigns them \(\mathbb{H}\)-key equivalents for easy window shuffling.
- Tiling commands that quickly arrange multiple windows so that nothing is overlapping—you can select horizontal tiling; vertical tiling; or general tiling, which puts four windows into the four quadrants of the screen. Other window arrangements include overlapping and stacked piles.

dragging across the dates you want, and entering the appointment-slot length you want (half hour, hour, and so on.) More turns your selections into outline form.

• You can switch between the ThinkTank-type "hot borders" and the standard scrolling windows.


 Certain menu commands simplify management of multiple windows (see "Setting Some New Standards," which accompanies this article).

This is the first time I've felt that a price tag of \$295 was reasonable for any piece of software. Major software products don't often live up to their prerelease rumors and manufacturer's advertising hype; impress the more-jaded users in the Macintosh community (e.g., reviewers, editors, and software manufacturers); and receive a warm welcome from business users for its immediate utility in a variety of situations.

More has done that, and more. +

WHERE'S THE BREAK KEY?

Q. The manual for my on-line information service tells me to press the Break key to cancel an operation. Which key is this on my Apple IIe's keyboard?

Pamela Lehmann Sydney, Australia

A. Before I answer your question, I should point out that a Break key does not generate an ASCII character code when you press it. Nor does it affect the code that enters when you press a character key, as the Shift, Caps Lock, and Control modifier keys do. What a Break key does is affect the output level of the serial-interface line to which your modem connects; in particular, it holds the line in a low state for about 234 milliseconds to generate what is called a break signal.

Most commercial information services and some bulletin boards react to a break signal by canceling whatever operation may be in progress, such as the listing of a document file. The effect is much like pressing Control-C to interrupt the running of an Applesoft program on your IIe. The information service often interprets a long break signal, three or four seconds in duration, as a Hang Up command.

You usually find Break keys only on the keyboards of dedicated communications terminals—no Apple keyboard has them. Most Apple communications programs, however, let you send a break signal by entering a control character or by pressing a key while holding down the open-apple key.

APPLEWORKS CUSTOM-PRINTER TRICK

Q. I am using AppleWorks on my Apple Ile with a Grappler+ parallel card and a Texas Instruments Model 8j55 printer. The printer works fine, except that I cannot print superscripts or subscripts. My



printer command for a "reverse one-half linefeed" is Escape ^, and the caret happens to be the command in AppleWorks that lets the program know that I am finished entering my printer code. When I try to enter the code, all I end up with is Escape and nothing following it. Is there a way to change my AppleWorks program so I can enter Escape ^ as a printer-control command (and something other than the caret as a way of finishing the code)?

Jeff Hunn North Manchester, IN

A. You cannot change the Apple-Works program to let you enter something other than a caret as the Exit command for printer-control codes. There is a solution to the problem, though, and all Apple-Works users will find it handy for sending printer codes from the word-processing module.

When you add a custom printer in the AppleWorks printer setup, choose the Printer Codes option. Simply press the Escape key when you are asked to type the exact control characters for Boldface Begin.

That's it—just the Escape key (which is what you were getting all

along). Now reboot AppleWorks. When you are ready to issue an Escape code from the word-processing module, simply invoke Boldface Begin from the Print Options menu (open-apple-O) or by typing Control-B.

Setting Boldface Begin sends your Escape code to the printer. Of course, Escape, by itself, does nothing, but AppleWorks also sends the character immediately following the Escape code to the printer. If you want to send Escape-Q, just make sure that the *Q* immediately follows the Boldface Begin mark (which is a caret). Your document will look like this:

... afterward, Mr. Jones was noted to have taken Q six bottles out the door.

The caret designates Boldface Begin. Believe it or not, the Q does not print in your document but goes to the printer as part of the Escape code. The printer receives Escape-Q. You can send any Escape code this way—even Escape ^ or codes that require more than one parameter, such as Escape K5, which switches





Prodos ON THE APPLE III

Q. Is it possible to run Apple II ProDOS-based software on an Apple III?

Jari Louhelainen Helsinki, Finland

A. When I first received this letter, the answer was no: When you run an Apple III in the Apple II emulation mode, the memory ProDOS occupies is not available—Applesoft uses it instead. Since the release of the III Plus IIe Card by Titan Technologies (310 West Ann Street, Ann Arbor, MI 48104; [313] 662-8542) in early 1986, however, it has been possible to run ProDOS and to emulate a IIe as well. The III Plus IIe Card occupies two of the II's four expansion slots (see "Apple III Alter Ego," A+, July 1986, pages 42-46).

Note that the III's native operating system, SOS, uses disk-directory and file structures identical to those ProDOS uses. Thus, one operating system can easily access data files the other has created. In fact, if you have the proper boot files on a diskette, you can boot a SOS- or ProDOS-formatted diskette on either the Apple II or Apple III.






