APPLE II

pple's announcement last March of AppleTalk products for the Apple II family makes network the hot buzzword for 1988. Simply put, a network is a group of computers and peripherals connected together in such a way that every workstation can communicate with any other on the network. With a network in place, users can share such high-ticket items as laser printers and high-capacity hard-disk drives. They

can also exchange disk files with other computers on the network, even if those computers are of different types. Therefore, networks tend to in-

crease a group's efficiency and, of

course, its productivity.

Networks are useful for all small work groups, whether they are made up of students in a classroom or colleagues in a business. But there is a price to pay, and I'm not just talking about the cost of the hardware and software. Networks are notoriously difficult to set up and maintain, although I will agree that AppleTalk is simpler than most. In fact, most require a network administrator, an individual responsible for assigning user names and passwords, configuring the network, and troubleshooting when things go wrong. And when things do go wrong, tracking down the source is frequently difficult, given that the network puzzle has so many pieces. Nevertheless, the benefits of a network usually outweigh the liabilities.

Curiously, networks also cause problems for software developers. First, developers must tackle the issue of how to write a program that works properly when more than one network user tries

to run it at the same time. Then they have to worry about how to price the program to get a decent return on their investment. They just can't sell a program for a conventional price if every student in a classroom is permitted to run it over the network, for example.

The purpose of this issue of A + is to raise your network IQ. We introduce you to the major Apple II networks (AppleTalk, Omninet, VNET, ELAN, Classroom Network, and DNET) and explain how they work, how much they cost, what their best features are, and what features they're missing. We'll also explain the jargon peculiar to

networks, elaborate I expect the on software-licensing issues, and let number of you know what kind of network-Apple II compatible software **networks to** we can expect to see from publishers in **APOW** the near future.



It uses optical technology to read (but not write to) compact discs containing up to 550 megabytes of data; that data can represent text, sound, or video information. The future for CD-ROM technology seems bright, but I won't get too excited about it until I see more than the two or three CD titles now available for the Apple II.

So I'm on the prowl for Apple II CD developers-when I've got products in my hand, you'll be sure to hear about them here in the pages of A +. First


Exit Stage Left



CAT DOCTOR PLUSES

Dear A+: In the 'All-Stars" coverage of disk utilities in the December 1987 issue of A + I, I find that Gary Little did not give Glen Bredon's ProSel utilities enough credit compared to the other programs. Although I realize that the article was not trying to compare the different programs, I feel that some of the features that made ProSel first on the list were ignored in the article.

First, Bredon's Cat Doctor can be completely mouse-driven—the description made no reference to this feature, which alone makes the program ten times better than Copy II Plus for those of us with mice.

The second missed feature is that Cat Doctor allows users to sort files in a directory, using the open-apple and arrow keys. The latest version of Copy II Plus that I have lets you sort only alphabetically, not into any order as Cat Doctor does. Anyone trying to make a system file first in a directory listing, using Copy II Plus, has a lot of work to do, since you can only alphabetize the catalog. Cat Doctor allows you to move the file easily with the open-apple/arrowkey combination and can sort alphabetically by date (of either creation or modification), by file type, or alphabetically by file type.

Even though Cat Doctor can use a mouse, users without that luxury will find the program just as easy to use, since you also have the option of pressing a single character key to access a function. In other words, to copy files, you either use the mouse to select Copy, use the arrow keys to move the highlighted bar to the function, or simply press C to get that function to execute.

I realize this letter sounds more like a review than anything else, but I just wanted to point out some things that were ignored.

DB MASTER LEARNING

Dear A +: Thank you for highlighting DB Master version 5 as one of your All-Stars in the December A + and the new "Product All-Stars" listings. There are, however, a few comments I would like to make.

First, DB Master is not nearly as difficult to learn and use as Mr. High stated. Although he did mention that he was reviewing a prerelease version of the program, he failed to point out that he was

also using a prerelease instruction manual, which

also using a prerelease instruction manual, which had no tutorials. As page 1 of that manual states, "This is a pre-release version of both the program and the User's Guide.... The final version of the User's Guide will include additional sections, such as step-by-step tutorials and appendixes."

As with any program, having the tutorials is going to make the learning process much easier. To use High's analogy, imagine trying to learn how to fly an airplane using only the blueprints and the service manual!

I assume High's review also led to your statement in the "Product All-Stars" listing that DB Master is "not suitable for merely routine tasks." I couldn't disagree more, and I suspect that most of our users feel the same way.

He-TO-HGS UPGRADE

Dear A+: I am writing to complain about Apple's IIe-to-IIGs upgrade kit. I feel that it is extremely poor and misrepresented. First, it is overpriced. Apple says it has a suggested retail price of \$499, which is deceiving. Yes, it does cost only \$499 for the IIGs motherboard and base pan, but that price does not include installation charges (which are left up to individual dealers), a mouse, and a numeric keypad. The mouse you must buy for an additional \$100 be-



cause almost all IIGs software is mouse-driven. Although the numeric keypad is not essential, it is included with a new GS and makes numeric entry smoother. These additions bring the price of an upgrade kit up to at least \$599 plus installation charges.

Second, Apple tells us that the upgrade kit will make your IIe a fully functional IIGs when, in fact, it does not. At the same time Apple released the upgrade kit, it also released an internal cooling fan, which you cannot use with an upgraded IIe because it is too large to fit into the IIe's case. Also, some IIGS RAM cards that use a piggyback card cannot be used in an upgraded IIe. The IIGs has been out only a year and a half, and if there are already cards that don't work

with the upgraded IIe, I am sure there will be more to come.

I am not criticizing Apple for trying to give IIe owners a chance to upgrade, but what's the point, if it isn't totally compatible and is more expensive than buying a new IIGs and selling your old system? Since the upgrade kit should be released within a few months, I think other IIe owners should be informed of these factors.

The upgrade kit has, in fact, been available for more than a year. Our understanding is that Apple hasn't sold very many of them, for just the reasons you describe. Please see our February 1987 cover story for a fuller description of the economics of upgrading vs. buying a new IIGS. We favored the latter option.—Editors


PACKET-RADIO SPECIFICS

Dear A+: Regarding the packetradio article in the November 1987 issue of A +, I would like to know if any software is specifically designed to handle the communications requirements for packet-radio communications using an Apple IIe. Your article was a short general-interest story on the subject but lacked product references. I have done some research and found several programs designed for packet radio and Macintosh or IBM computers but no Apple IIe computers. I'd appreciate any help on this matter.

Author Gabe Wiener responds: Most packeteers use ordinary terminal software. A packet-radio TNC (Terminal Node Controller) connects to a computer in the same way that a serial modem does. Therefore, any terminal package capable of sending to a serial port is fine for packet radio. Unlike modems, all TNCs currently on the market do not use the same set of commands, and, as a result, little specialty software is developed exclusively for packet radio. Depending on the brand of TNC you are planning to use, some software may be available from the manufacturer. You might also be able to find some public-domain software for your TNC. The Ham Radio Forum on CompuServe (G HAMNET) will probably have such programs in its data libraries.

MODEM MGR SHOULD BE A STAR

Dear A+: I thoroughly enjoyed reading the December 1987 issue of A +, with its special All-Stars coverage. I believe the Apple community should be made aware of the finest software products that are available.

There was one program that should have made the telecommunications list in my opinion: Modem MGR by James H. Okubo. I am strictly a user and not a telecommunications-program expert; I would, however, like to inform you and your readers of the support I have received after purchasing this program.

At first, Modem MGR did not work with my Rixon modem. When I informed the author of this problem, he immediately called Case Communication and programmed the necessary information to resolve this compatibility problem. I considered this alone to be a first-class support effort.

Approximately four months later, I began a subscription to a commodity data-retrieval service. This service provided a special software package for downloading prices. Unfortunately, I ran into the same compatibility problem with my Rixon modem. I called the data-retrieval company for assistance, but no one there was able to resolve the problem.

As a last resort, I wrote to James Okubo for help. Within a week, I received the data-retrieval program back from Okubo, and it was now totally compatible with my modem. I got all this support free with the purchase of the original Modem MGR program.

I have never received this type of support from the so-called national software companies. You didn't include Modem MGR in your top 96, but if you'd had a special category for authors or companies that provided the best support, James H. Okubo would have to have been on top of that list.

SOFTWARE FOR LIFE

Plenty of IIGs owners are disgruntled. They've found that if they want to move up to software designed especially for the Gs's features, they must pay the full price for GS versions, even if they already own the IIe/ IIc release. If they've been a loyal customer and made the investment in an 8-bit version, why shouldn't they get a break on the 16-bit release? The answer depends on which software company you talk to. Electronic Arts has instituted a software-exchange program called Software for Life that lets you turn in the manual cover of your 8-bit EA program and then get the 16-bit version for half the retail price. EA isn't restricting you to any brand of computer, so you don't necessarily have to be going from the 8-bit IIe/IIc to the 16-bit Gs. You can also get the same bennies moving up from another 8-bitter such as the Commodore

64 or the Atari 800.

CLUB MECC

MECC (Minnesota Educational Computing Corporation) has introduced the MECC Home Software Club, which gives members discounts on MECC's line of educational software. What it is, how it works, and why you might need it

network-what it is, how to set it

Just over three years ago, in January 1985, Apple Computer, Inc. introduced the world to the Apple-Talk Personal Network, later renamed the AppleTalk Network System. At that time, AppleTalk was simply the means by which several Macintoshes, wired together like links in a chain, could share an expensive LaserWriter printer. AppleTalk became even more useful in January 1987, when Apple released a program called Apple-Share, which allowed Macintoshes to share files on a hard-disk drive connected to a specially configured Mac called a file server. Apple now sells products that permit MS-DOS computers to work with Apple-Talk-compatible printers and file servers as well.

Last March, Apple finally revealed that it would start selling a suite of hardware and software products this summer that would allow an enhanced 128K Apple IIe and a 512K IIGS to be part of an AppleTalk network. Apple has no way to network the IIc and II Plus, nor is it working on one.

The AppleTalk network is the most significant new "peripheral" Apple has released for the Apple II family in some time. In a nutshell, networking can do away with the costly duplication of peripherals in the classroom and in small-business work groups and will lead to the development of software that can help make networked groups become very productive. This article will focus on the AppleTalk


up, and how to decide if you're ready to take the plunge. You'll also find many other articles in this issue discussing networking issues and other network brands.

Setting Up an AppleTalk Net

AppleTalk is nothing more than a set of communications protocols, or rules, that devices on a network must utilize to send and receive packets of data through the netCard instead of Printer Port. The result is that serial port 1 becomes the AppleTalk port.

The Apple IIe has no built-in AppleTalk port, so you need to add one by plugging in a new Apple II Workstation Card (see figure 1). You should plug the card into slot 7 if you want to be able to boot automatically from the network when you turn on the IIe. An adapter box connects to the card and provides a serial port for a directly connected printer and an AppleTalk port that behaves much like the one on the Apple IIGS.

(The ROM on the Apple II Workstation Card contains all the software that defines the AppleTalk communications protocols; the AppleTalk ROM in the Apple IIGS does not. To load the missing AppleTalk routines into a IIGS, you must boot a new version of the Pro-






work medium. The most common AppleTalk medium is Apple's LocalTalk cable, although you can use other types of media as well (see "Buzzwords" on page 32 for definitions of AppleTalk terms).


Each device you want to connect to an AppleTalk network must have an AppleTalk port. Macintoshes, LaserWriters, and the Apple IIGS all have built-in AppleTalk ports. To activate the AppleTalk port on a GS, you use the Slots command on the Control Panel to change the slot 7 option to Built-in AppleTalk instead of Your Card. Then you change the slot 1 option to Your

run a ProDOS 8 application such as AppleWorks and use network services as well, you must first boot ProDOS 16 and then select the application from the ProDOS 16 Finder or Launcher.)

You can also buy AppleTalk-port interface cards for ImageWriter II printers and MS-DOS computers.

For each device you want to connect to the network, you need a LocalTalk Connector Kit. The kit includes a LocalTalk connection box with a short drop cable for connecting to the device's AppleTalk port (see figure 2). It also comes with a two-meter LocalTalk cable for joining the connection box to the next box in the chain of network de-

vices. You can connect up to 32 devices in this way to form a single AppleTalk network.

The AppleShare File Server

Apple's file-server software is called AppleShare (see figure 3). The new version, 2.0, now works with Apple II ProDOS as well as the Mac and MS-DOS operating systems. Keep in mind, however, that AppleShare runs only on a Macintosh, so an all-Apple-II AppleTalk network is not possible if you need access to a file server—you will need a Macintosh to run the server. (You may, however, have an all-Apple II network if you simply want to share network printers.)

AppleShare manages the disk volumes that are connected to the Mac (usually large hard disks) and makes them available to all computers on the network. Although files are stored in the Macintosh format, Apple II computers see them as ProDOS files, and MS-DOS computers see them as MS-DOS files. Thus, exchanging files with Macintosh and MS-DOS computers over the network is very easy. The server accomplishes this by using the Apple Filing Protocol (AFP) to manage files; the workstations run translators that convert native operating-system commands to the equivalent AFP commands.

AFP keeps track of two names for each file on a server volume. One is a Macintosh name, and the other is an MS-DOS name. An Apple II workstation running a conventional ProDOS application can use files on the server only if the Macintosh name is also a valid Pro-DOS name. (ProDOS naming rules are far more restrictive than Macintosh naming rules.) Therefore, non-Apple-II users on the network must give files and folders (subdirectories) valid ProDOS names if they want to give Apple II users access to them. Naming problems will eventually disappear as software developers learn how to adapt ProDOS applications to handle Macintosh-style names.


The Network Administrator

The person responsible for the smooth operation of the file server, the network administrator, defines groups of users and assigns names and passwords to network users so they can log onto AppleShare as registered users.


You don't have to log on with a name and a password, but you'll want to so you can control how other users may access the folders and files you've put onto the server. If you log on as a guest (i.e., without specifying a user name and password), you cannot restrict access at all.

The administrator also sets up

which program will run when an Apple II user tries to boot from the network instead of from a local drive. Booting from the network is possible if you've previously put the necessary ProDOS system files onto the server. Any 128K enhanced Apple IIe can auto-boot from the network; if you have a GS, you need at least 768K of memory.

Accessing the Server

Before you can use an Apple-Share disk volume from your Apple II workstation, you must run the Logon program on the ProDOS system disk. When Logon starts up, it scans the network for AFP file servers and displays a list of them on the screen. You then select the server you want to use, enter your user name and password (or specify guest access), and then select the server volumes you want to work with. (See figure 4.)

Thereafter, you can use the selected server volumes just as if they were on a disk directly connected to your II. You can create folders,

transfer programs and files to the server and back again, and so on.

Controlling Access to Folders

Although a file server is ideal for sharing files, you may want to prevent other users from seeing your files or changing them. Apple-Share maintains three access-control attributes for each folder on the server, and the owner of the folder can adjust them to specify just who has the right to perform the following types of operations (see figure 5):

See Folders. Permits users to see the names of any folders within the current one.

See Files. Permits users to see the names of files inside the folder, read files, and copy files.

Make Changes. Permits users to move, change, and delete files inside the folder and add new files.

You can set these attributes for each of three user categories:

Owner. The person who created the folder or who was assigned ownership of the folder.

Group. Any group (set of users) the system administrator has previously set up.

Everyone. Any user with access to the server.

When a user first creates a folder, it is private. In other words, only the owner has the See Folders, See Files, and Make Changes privileges. You can use the ProDOS system program called Access to change the access attributes for Owner, Group, and Everyone.

Accessing Network Printers

More than one printer can be present on an AppleTalk network—you may have a Laser-Writer for high-quality work and an ImageWriter II for draft work, for example. Thus, you must choose which printer you want to use before starting a print job, whether your file is on a IIe, IIGS, Macintosh, or IBM PC.

If you're printing from a IIe application program (which may be running on a GS in the Emulation mode), you choose a network

Figure 5: Changing access privileges. The Access program lets you adjust See Folders, See Files, and Make Changes attributes.




Figure 6: Choosing a printer. The Chooser.II program lets you select the network printer you want to use.

residents add 6% sales tax.

printer by running a utility program called Chooser.II (see figure 6). If you choose a LaserWriter, Chooser.II sends ImageWriter emulation software to it so that it will behave just like an ImageWriter. To print over the network, just specify slot 7 as the printer slot in your application program.

Third-party IIGS software that follows the standard desktop interface should have a Choose Printer option in the File menu, which you can use to choose a network printer. If you choose a LaserWriter, your program will call on the GS Print Manager to send PostScript commands to the LaserWriter over the network. PostScript is the pagedescription language the Laser-Writer uses to draw text and graphic images on a page.

The AppleShare Print Server software manages printing requests from workstations, saves printing jobs to disk if the printer is busy, and prints deferred jobs as soon as the printer is free. The net effect is that workstations aren't tied up while they're trying to print, even if someone else is using the printer.

When considering whether to set up an AppleTalk network for your group of Apple II computers, consider first the main benefits:

SUZZWOR

ACCESS PRIVILEGES.

Permission assigned to individual users or groups of users to view or make changes to certain folders on a server.

APPLESHARE. The file server software sold by Apple Computer. **APPLETALK.** The set of protocols and conventions comprising Apple's local-area network. CHOOSER. A program for selecting which printer you want to use on an AppleTalk network. **AFP.** AppleTalk Filing Protocol. A standard file-handling scheme used by an AppleShare file server. Workstations have translators to convert commands from the native operating-system format to AFP format. AFP lets you connect ProDOS, MS-DOS, and Macintosh workstations to the network. **DISK SERVER.** A computer that partitions a hard disk into several discrete volumes and lets network users access only their own volumes. Users can't open files on volumes assigned to other users. FILE SERVER. A computer on a network that manages access to files on a hard disk. Users can access other users' files, given the proper access privileges. **GROUP.** A collection of registered

users to which the network administrator assigns a name. GUEST. A user who logs onto an AppleShare file server without specifying a user name. Everyone has access to files and folders

guests create on the server. LOCALTALK. An AppleTalk cabling scheme from Apple involving shielded, twisted-pair cables.

NETWORK. A system of interconnected computers and peripherals.

NETWORK ADMINISTRATOR.

The person responsible for the operation of a network. The administrator sets up user and group lists and assigns passwords. **NODE.** Any device connected to a network, such as a workstation or printer.

PASSWORD. A secret combination of characters that is sometimes required to log onto a file server.

REGISTERED USER. A user who logs onto an AppleShare file server by specifying a valid user name and password.

SPOOLER. A program that manages printers on a network. It accepts print requests from workstations and forwards them to the printer when the printer is ready, thus freeing up the workstation to do other tasks even if the printer is in use.

VOLUME. Usually a single disk device. A disk server can create multiple logical volumes on a single drive, however.

WORKSTATION. A networked computer that can run application programs and also take advantage

of network services.

work-group efficiency and the ability to share expensive peripherals such as Apple's new CD-ROM drive or the LaserWriter printer. In other words, no more trotting disks down the hall to coworkers; no more waiting in line to work with a computer connected to a printer; and, for teachers, no more wasting time while you distribute program disks at the beginning of every class and collect them at the end.

You can also take advantage of useful software specifically designed for a network setting-electronic mail and multiuser database programs, for example. Apple will soon sell a teacher/student network-management program called Aristotle, which teachers can use to specify which programs on a file server the members of a particular class are permitted to use.

The network should also reduce your disk-drive budget-since Apple IIs can boot directly from the file server, you won't have to buy as many drives for your workstations, or any at all for that matter.

Although AppleShare is very slick, it is clearly not for everyone. Keep in mind that it works only with ProDOS-based software. If you are using some DOS 3.3-, Pascal-, or CP/M-based software, you won't be able to take full advantage of the network. Even some ProDOS programs may not work perfectly, but, in most cases, only minor changes will be necessary to make them "network aware."

And then there's the matter of price. First, each IIe requires a \$249 workstation card and perhaps a \$70 enhancement kit if you haven't yet enhanced your IIe. (Advice to everyone: Stop buying the IIe. The GS has always been more economical, and its built-in AppleTalk port makes it even more so if you're considering an AppleTalk network.) You also need a \$75 Local-Talk Connector Kit for each comperhaps some puter, extra LocalTalk cable (\$75 for a ten-meter extension), and—the real kicker-a Mac with at least a 20-megabyte hard-disk drive (\$3578 for a Mac Plus), AppleShare File Server software (\$799), and AppleShare Print Server software (\$299). We expect educational discounts will be available for all these products.

NETWORK

So there you have it. Whether to set up an AppleTalk network comes down to whether the benefits of AppleTalk outweigh the expense. Do consider alternatives, though, many of which we examine elsewhere in this issue in "The Corvus Alternative" and "Other Networks," and a comparison chart "Networks at a Glance."



Comparing Omninet with AppleTalk

Apple's entry into the Apple II network market is getting a lot of attention, but does Apple provide the best method for networking Apple II computers? Maybe, maybe not. In this article, we're going to take a good look at an old-timer in this market, Control Data/Corvus, and see how its network compares with Apple's.

Corvus is the pioneer that brought hard-disk drives to the Apple II world in 1979. In 1980 Corvus introduced its Constellation I network software. It used Corvus' disk multiplexer, a device that lets eight computers share a single hard disk. The following year, Corvus announced Omninet, a conventional network with a transmission rate of 1 Mbps (megabit per second). In 1984, Corvus came out with a network-management-software system called Constellation II, which greatly increased the capabilities Omninet. For the first time, for example, you could use the ProDOS operating system. Constellation III, introduced last summer, features a convenient pull-down-menu interface and extensive on-line help.

Earlier this year, Control Data Corporation teamed up with Corvus to market the Omninet. Control Data/Corvus estimates that there are more than 12,000 Apple II Omninet networks worldwide, which tie together more than 120,000 computers.

Omninet can handle Apple II, Macintosh, and MS-DOS computers together on the same network. It also allows for simultaneous use of the ProDOS, DOS 3.3, Pascal, CP/M, Macintosh, and MS-DOS operating systems, although moving files from one system to another is not that convenient. Each Omninet network can accommodate up to 63 computers and as many as 10 drives, with a total of one gigabyte of disk storage. Contrast this capacity with that of Apple's network, which can handle up to 32 devices and the ProDOS, Macintosh, and MS-DOS operating systems only.

Speed: That's the Ticket

Connecting multiple computers is a means for sharing expensive peripheral equipment, using a cen-

tral supply of application software, exchanging files and data, and sending electronic messages. A primary concern for any network user is that speed not be compromised. Ideally, network printers and hard-disk drives respond just as quickly as locally connected devices. Omninet shines in this area.

Omninet is significantly faster than a LocalTalk implementation of AppleTalk. Why? For one thing, its 1-Mbps raw data-transmission rate, the speed at which data moves through the network wires, is about four times the AppleTalk rate. The effective AppleTalk rate is even slower because Apple's network software takes quite a while to create a network data packet before actually sending it. Refer to "AppleTalk Cabling Schemes" in this issue for author Don Lancaster's comments on the effective transfer rate through an AppleTalk network.

Dollar for Dollar

Besides speed, expense is a consideration. The biggest-ticket item for AppleShare is the Macintosh you need to run the AppleShare File Server software. A Macintosh Plus with an Apple 20-megabyte SCSI hard-disk drive has a suggested retail price of \$3578. Since it is

dedicated to acting as the file server, you cannot use the Mac as a network workstation. The AppleShare File Server software is an additional \$799, and the AppleShare Print Server software is \$299. Each of the computers needs a \$75 LocalTalk Connector Kit, and any IIe computers also require the \$249 Apple II Workstation Card. So the total for a sample network connecting five Apple IIe computers comes to \$6371, a price that does not include the cost of the extra LocalTalk cable you will probably need.

Here's how a Corvus system adds up, in comparison. A Corvus 21-megabyte OmniDrive disk server (a stand-alone unit) has a suggested retail price of \$2795. To this figure add \$695 for the Constellation III network-management and diagnostic software (it includes operating systems, utilities, and printer-server software). The print server is a stand-alone IIe (\$829) with an Omninet Network Interface Card (\$249) and up to six standard printer-interface cards. Each Apple II workstation needs a \$249 Omninet Network Interface Card, a \$45 cable with a network box for each computer, and a \$65 print-spooler card. Thus, our sample network connecting five Apple He workstations comes to \$6453 for Omninet, or about the same as the cost of an AppleTalk network. Extra cable is relatively inexpensive (\$149 for 500 feet), however.

AppleTalk is less expensive if you're networking IIGS computers—they don't need the Apple II Workstation Card for AppleTalk, but they still need the Network Interface Card for Omninet.

Using Omninet


When you boot an Apple II on the Omninet network, the Corvus startup program asks you to enter your name and password. Once you've entered this information, the operating system the network administrator has assigned to you loads, and up to ten disk volumes become available. These volumes, which behave like separate disks, can be designated as read-only or read/write. You can get access to additional volumes during a session by removing and adding any of a maximum of 24 volumes. With ProDOS, the Corvus volumes, after the first two, appear as ProDOS volumes with "phantom" slot and drive assignments, and you can use them just like locally connected

At this point, you should begin

to see some of the design differences between the Omninet server and Apple's AppleShare server. On an AppleShare server, all users see the hard disk as the same big volume and can store files and create folders anywhere on the volume (subject to access restrictions). With Omninet, users gain access to specific private portions of the hard disk, which appear to be discrete disk volumes. That's why the Omninet server is called a disk server and AppleShare a file server.

Omninet has several problems, some minor, some not so minor. Updating the Omninet operating system or driver software is difficult unless you're content to wait for new updates to the Constellation disks from Control Data/Corvus. The operating system and driver software are stored in Pascal files, regardless of the operating system, meaning that their replacement or correction requires conversion to the Pascal format. You cannot just place a new version of the PRODOS file in the ProDOS boot volume.

Also, exchanging disk files with other users on the server is awkward, because files sit in their users' separate volumes, unless the administrator happens to allow two users access to the same volume. To exchange a file, you first have to send it to a special transfer area on the server; to complete the transfer, the recipient has to re-



trieve it from the transfer area.

Perhaps the most serious problem with the Omninet network at present is that you cannot use it with an Apple IIGS running in the Fast mode. This limitation makes running super-hi-res desktop applications painfully slow. Corvus is aware of this problem and is working on a solution.

Decisions, Decisions

You may prefer Omninet over AppleTalk because it's faster with Apple IIe's, and it does not require a Macintosh (meaning you won't have to master another computer). Also, it can handle all major Apple II operating systems, not just Pro-DOS. AppleTalk/AppleShare, on the other hand, is better for file and peripheral sharing and can be less expensive, particularly if you have a lot of IIGS computers.

Corvus technical support has a reputation for high-quality service. Apple's support is as yet untested, but we can surmise that Apple's dealers will support this product as well as they support the rest of the Apple line.

Even though the momentum of the Apple label could propel AppleTalk and AppleShare into the forefront, the performance and reliability of Omninet make it a worthy competitor.



NETWORK **COVER STORY** BY ROD WILLIAMS NETUCIAS and Corvers of the second se A quick rundown of other Apple II alternatives

Besides Apple and Corvus, three other companies are significant players in the Apple II network market. Here's a look at what they have to offer and what their strengths and weaknesses are. You'll see that LanTech offers a file server, whereas Velan and Major Educational Resources offer disk servers. The difference between the two types of servers is that a file server allows users to share all files on the server hard disk (which is what AppleShare does), whereas a disk server allows users to have private areas on a shared disk—the users can't share files directly.

LanTech specializes in Apple II networks for schools. Its current installed base is approximately 300 networks, which average 20-25 workstations each.

LanTech offers file/print/boot servers and workstation cards, which together form ELAN (Educational Local Area Network). The server is an Apple IIe running Lan-Tech's proprietary operating system, AROS; it connects to workstations with interface cards called Satellite Boards. Workstations that run ProDOS require an additional EXpander Board. The network can


have as many as 128 workstations and can be up to 1000 feet long.

To create a LanTech ELAN server, you first need a 128K Apple IIe with a 54-inch disk drive and monitor (\$1326). For it you need a Lan-Tech Satellite Board (\$189) and cable assembly (\$17), the LanTech AROS Operating System (\$400), a 20-megabyte LanTech hard-disk drive (\$1295), a hard-disk interface (\$100), and a Super Serial Card for each of up to four printers (\$139 each). The total server cost, including the IIe itself and four serial cards, is \$3883.

Each workstation requires a Sat-

ellite Board (\$189), a ten-foot cable assembly (\$17), and an EXpander Board for ProDOS (\$120), which totals \$326.

Thus, the cost for a five-workstation network comes to \$5513, not including the cost of the Apple IIe workstations. To see how this price compares to the cost for a similar AppleTalk or Omninet network, see the chart "Networks at a

Glance" on page 50. Like Apple and Corvus, LanTech offers educational discounts.

The file-server software features automatic file locking for both DOS 3.3 and ProDOS 8. (File locking prevents conflicts when more than one person tries to use a file at the same time.) The network cannot handle Pascal and CP/M. It can accommodate up to six disk drives


with volumes as large as 32 megabytes and uses a disk-caching scheme to improve the speed of disk access over the network.

Other than a menu-setup utility program, no classroom-management or automatic-lesson-collection software is provided by Lan-Tech, but the company is working with software publishers that provide such software.

ELAN's print service provides spooling (print-job queuing) for up to four printers, which you get by adding printer-interface cards to the IIe server. You can spool as many as eight documents. It works with dot-matrix printers such as the ImageWriter but not with the LaserWriter.

ELAN works with the Apple II Plus and the IIe (enhanced or not) but not with the IIc or the IIGS running ProDOS 16 applications.


ELAN is perhaps the most similar network to AppleShare/AppleTalk, in that it offers file, print, and boot service. One of LanTech's strengths is that it allows schools to use Apple IIe equipment they may

already have, which helps reduce the already relatively low cost, and it works with DOS 3.3 and ProDOS 8. (AppleShare works with Pro-DOS 8 and 16.) The network transfer rate is also faster than Apple-Talk.

Some weaknesses are its expensive cabling and connectors and the requirement of a second \$120 card in each workstation to run ProDOS. Although the file service is impressive for a product priced so low, the security and systemmanagement capabilities are simplistic. Print service is reasonable with four printers but needs more flexibility and expansion possibilities beyond spooling eight jobs. Technical support is limited to the central factory location and not available locally.

Velan VNET

Velan was founded in 1985 to develop classroom networking systems. Headquartered in California, it operates four regional sales offices. Velan now has more than 100 networks installed nationwide.

The company offers a combina-

tion disk/print/boot server based on an unusual animal for the typical K-12 classroom—an IBM PC/AT (or compatible).

NETWORK

The first thing you can say about Velan's network technology is that it is different. First, each workstation connects directly to a central server rather than to the next device in a chain of devices, in a so-called star configuration. Second, the network interface is simply a standard serial port. The network can include as many as 64 workstations, and the cabling can be up to 1000 feet long.

Velan sells its servers as upgrade packages for existing PC/AT computers but most often delivers them in complete bundles with an IBM PC/AT or compatible, a hard-disk drive, serial cards with 16 ports, server software, classroommanagement software, and menudriven student software. A 16-port, 20-megabyte server bundle costs \$5745.


Each Apple II or IBM PC work-

station requires a serial-interface card (\$85) and a cable assembly (about \$30). Thus, a five-workstation setup comes to \$6320. Educational discounts are available.

A special \$20 ROM is available for the Apple Super Serial Card that makes it usable as a VNET interface. Computers with built-in serial ports, such as the IIc and Macintosh, can be connected without interface cards, but you need special disks containing drivers.


Velan's file service is basically disk service with some file-locking capabilities. Disk service means that although files from different operating systems can coexist on the server's disk, they cannot be shared. Each user has access to a certain area of the disk and that area only.

The VSETUP utility allocates network resources such as harddisk space and printers on a classby-class basis.

VCLASS allows teachers to set up program-access menus for each class and even each student within each class. Students select programs from the menu without ever seeing a native operating system, pathname, or even program name.

COLLECT and DISTRIBUTE are utilities that let teachers collect homework or other documents to be combined, displayed, printed, or distributed to other students.

VCOMM is an electronic-mail and electronic-bulletin-board system that enables students and teachers to communicate with each other individually or in groups within a class or an entire school.


Velan's print service provides spooling for up to 8 printers on the 16-port system. It works with ImageWriter or other dot-matrix printers but not with the Laser-Writer.

A VNET workstation can be an Apple II Plus, IIe (enhanced or not), or even an Apple IIc via its built-in serial port. Macintosh and MS-DOS computers also work with this network, through their builtin serial ports. Apple IIe computers may be diskless workstations and boot either DOS 3.3 or ProDOS 8. IIGS computers cannot currently run ProDOS 16 programs on

VNET's main strengths are its classroom-management software, accommodation of workstations using different operating systems, and the ability to attach lots of printers. Also, network performance appears to remain relatively constant even as the number of workstations increases.

VNET, but will "soon" be able to.

One of the weaknesses of this system is that it is based on an IBM PC/AT, which is unfamiliar and perhaps unattractive to many K-12 teachers. Also, cabling for the star configuration is less convenient and more expensive than that of other setups. The added cost of the cables offsets much of the lower



cost of the network interface. Also, you can have only one hard-disk drive per server. The transfer rate is among the lowest of all the classroom networks, but it is difficult to compare, since each workstation has a dedicated cable through which to communicate.

Classroom Network and DNET

Major Educational Resources Corporation has approximately 400 network installations in the United States and offers a combination disk/print/boot server called a Digicard Master Controller (\$2495) for use with its Apple II-only Classroom Network. It can connect up to 28 Apple II computers, which can be about ten feet apart from each other. It also has a Shared Resource Controller (SRC), which gives you a hard-disk drive and allows the sharing of three printers. SRCs are available with hard disks with three capacities: 20 (\$2995), 43

NETWORK

(\$4995), and 70 megabytes (\$6995). An SRC allows you to set up DNET, a network for Apple II, Macintosh, and MS-DOS computers.

The technologies of DNET and the Classroom Network differ markedly from each other. The Classroom Network consists of interconnected external Network Interface Units that enable each workstation's disk controller to access the two floppy disks of the Master Controller. This network is the only one in this overview in which users share access to floppy, rather than hard, disks.

DNET is a more traditional multiple-access network that uses internal network-interface cards. The medium is twisted-pair cable with familiar modular phone-jack connectors. The network can be up to 4000 feet long. A DNET can in-

clude up to 32 nodes and provides access to the SRC hard disk.

Each workstation requires either a \$195 Network Interface Unit (for the Classroom Network) or a \$195 DNET interface card. Thus, a fiveworkstation configuration, not including the price of the workstations themselves, comes to \$3470 for a Classroom Network (two shared floppy-disk drives) or \$3970 for a DNET (a shared 20-megabyte hard-disk drive). Educational organizations typically receive a discount.

The Shared Resource Controller provides a rudimentary disk-serving capability. It can accommodate the widest variety of operating systems, including DOS 3.3, ProDOS 8 and 16, UCSD Pascal, CP/M for the Apple II, and the Macintosh and MS-DOS operating systems. It provides no file-locking capabilities, however. You can attach up to six

disk drives to the SRC.

Other than a menu-setup utility, no classroom-management or automatic-lesson-collection software comes with the system, but software from two other companies, Ideal Learning and SkillsBank, works with this network.

DNET's print service, with its built-in printer interfaces, provides spooling for up to three printers. The number of spooled documents is limited only by available disk space. The network works with ImageWriter and similar dot-matrix printers only.

The following computers can be workstations on this network: Apple II Plus, IIe (enhanced or not), and IIGS. MS-DOS computers can connect via a DNET interface card, and you can attach Macintoshes through their serial port. This product is, in some ways, the least sophisticated, but it runs the most operating systems and can include the most types of workstations. The floppy-based Classroom Network's "burst load" feature for simultaneous program loading by workstations is very fast.

Weaknesses include the lack of file locking. This system offers no backup capability and is the least sophisticated in terms of system management.



SOFTWARE SUES

NETWORK


Setting up a network can involve complex tasks, not the least of which is sorting through the software issues. To get the most out of your network, you might need to buy specialized network software, which is costlier than single-user software and comes with a different sort of license. Perhaps the biggest software issue, though, is upgrading. If you already have, say, five copies of AppleWorks in your computer lab, do you then fork over the full price for the network version, or do you get some kind of price break since you're an existing customer? The answer may not be readily apparent—it depends on the individual software vendor.

Why New Software?

Application software presents challenges on a network because single-user versions may not work properly in a network setting. Many single-user programs are copy-protected, so you won't have much luck getting them installed on the network's hard disk. Even unprotected programs can cause difficulties, because it's one thing to be able to install software on the network and another to get it to cooperate when several people are trying to use it at once. Network applications typically have intelligence that prevents users from working on the same files at the same time. (In classrooms, life can be further complicated by the need for curriculum-management software. See "Teachers' Toolbox" in this issue for details.)

Paying the Price

One reason network software costs more is because it's more so-



phisticated and harder for publishers to support than single-user versions. How much more does it cost? Typically, a network application package runs three to five times the price of a single-user version. (Of the 11 companies we interviewed for this article, the extremes were Temporal Acuity, which is charging $2\frac{1}{2}$ times the single-user price for its network software, and Claris, charging $6\frac{1}{2}$ times the single-user price of AppleWorks.)

The main reason, though, that vendors charge more for network versions is that more than one person uses the software. Publishers easily justify a 400% cost markup, assuming that you'll have as many as 10 or 15 or 20 users sharing the same program. (In fact, none of the companies we surveyed for this ar-

ticle place any limit on the number of users you can have—see below.)

Licensing of network software is generally pretty straightforward. We interviewed the 11 companies that Apple Computer told us were developing products for the Apple-Talk network, and most of them said they would simply sell network versions separately from the single-user versions. The network license allows purchasers to install the software on a single file server and lets an unlimited number of workstations access that software, as long as those workstations are connected to that file server, not gaining access through a bridge from another network.

A couple of companies, though, have a different approach to licensing. MECC, for instance, likes to deal with school districts rather than individual buyers and offers its customers "memberships" that entitle a district to make as many copies of a product as necessary, with the price based on the district's enrollment. Logo Computer Systems, Inc., prefers to work with individual schools and offers a site license for its LogoWriter for the AppleTalk network. In this case, the \$450 license agreement covers all the file servers in the school.

Upgrade Paths

The least-defined issue pertaining to networking software is upgrading. Most of the companies told us that they would offer some kind of upgrade path but didn't have the details ironed out by the time we went to press. Here are the ways that different companies say they'll handle it:

Here's the list of companies developing software for the AppleTalk network that Apple Computer, Inc., gave us at the beginning of February 1988. It includes specific titles that they are modifying for use with AppleTalk. Undoubtedly, many more companies have commenced AppleTalk development since then, but this list should give you an idea of the breadth of products that will soon be available in network versions.

•Sunburst says it will let customers of single-user versions trade up to the network release by paying an additional price of two times the single-user cost (all of Sunburst's networked products will cost three times the price of the individual version). Harbor Software will probably offer a similar plan, allowing customers to trade in single-user versions of MouseFiler and pay the difference between the

single-user price (\$69.95) and the network price (\$199.95). Stone Edge Technology says it's also considering the same type of arrangement, pricing the upgrade close to the difference between the price of the single-user and network versions of DB Master, Version 5. And Temporal Acuity says it's likely to take the same approach with its

music-education titles.

•MECC offers its membership customers the opportunity to simply buy the network "loader" at an additional cost, rather than swap for a whole new version. The expense, again, depends on the size of the school district.

•Scholastic Software says it "will offer an upgrade" but didn't have any details at press time. TML Systems and Claris Corporation say essentially the same thing, although Claris adds that it will have "a special policy for users who have multiple copies."

•Pinpoint says it will probably offer some kind of temporary promotion to move customers of its single-user products up to network versions.

•Logo Computer Systems, Inc., gives buyers of its single-user software a nine-month period during which they can upgrade to the network version for a discount. After that, they must pay the full price.


•A representative from Milliken says the company "hasn't really decided that issue." With Milliken it's not such a critical matter, though, because the program the company is releasing for the network (The First "R") is a new product even in the single-user version, so no huge installed base of users is concerned about upgrading.

The Bottom Line

As you can see, upgrading is the great gray area in software networking. Particularly confusing will be situations in which a user has lab packs or just multiple, single-user copies of a program and wants to swap them for a network version.

By the time this issue of A + appears, companies that are new to networks will have a better idea of what their policies will be, so we recommend that you check with them and press the issue. (Claris, for instance, suggests you call its upgrade number—[800] 544-8554—for details.) If the companies haven't decided, they'll need to do so soon to keep their customers satisfied. Your best bet is to ask a lot of questions before taking the network plunge.



LEARNING GURVE

The good news and the bad news

BY DAVID D. THORNBURG

he concept of networked computers in schools is not a new one. Low-cost networks and fileservers have been a topic of interest ever since computers started appearing in classrooms. Even though many companies have spent millions of dollars on the development of networks, networks have only recently become viable additions to the classroom.

As greater concentrapear in our schools, schools, networks will become tions of computers apmore commonplace. Thus, we should explore the complex issues surrounding the networking of computers now, before it is too late to make adjustments in the integration of local-area networks into the classroom.

Network technology is quite simple. All most schools need is a way for each computer to gain access to one central fileserver for the program retrieval and file storage. Because the communication goes from each computer to a central workstation and not among all the computers in the network, all you need is an interface card, a cabling system

to connect each computer to the main storage unit, and a simple modification to the disk-operating system that provides access to the fileserver.

Providing this type of network capability is not particularly difficult or expensive.

The Good News

The immediate advantages of educational networks and remote fileservers are almost too numerous to mention. For example, when you have an entire software library locked away on a sealed hard disk, the risk of physical damage to expensive programs is virtually eliminated. As we all know, many students bend disks, set them on

dent's work. I remember teaching a course a few years ago in which I collected 30 disks a week from my students. In some cases disk handling took longer than program evaluation! A remote fileserver solves this problem.

Disk-drive-repair costs drop significantly, since the hard disks in fileservers are completely sealed from dust and are generally quite


reliable. Note, however, that it is still essential, as with any disk system, to make backup copies of the fileserver at least once a week. Fortunately, you can automate this process. I mention this caveat because I had 13 million bytes of data fall into the trash last year because of a hard-disk problem—without any backup!

One subtle advantage to using a remote fileserver deserves special mention. Because fileservers are built around large (20-40-megabyte) disk drives, users can gain access to programs and databases that are too large to fit on the floppy disks their computers can accommodate.

The Canadian educational computer ICON (a diskless workstation), takes advantage

of its remote fileserver for a "writing" program that analyzes spelling and usage. This program is more than five megabytes long. Floppy disks are simply an inappropriate medium for programs of this level of complexity. Once educational networks become com-

dusty desktops, and perpetrate numerous other crimes against diskdom during their use of classroom computers.

Another advantage is that student-generated files are all collected in a single place, facilitating teacher evaluation of each stumonplace, software developers will feel free to create larger programs, since they will no longer be constrained by disk size.

ICON's writing program is undergoing an extension that will increase its size to several hundred megabytes. The program will be distributed on CD-ROM disks, each of which can hold 550 megabytes of information.

Educational fileservers will probably be enhanced to provide program libraries and reference material on CD-ROM and will use traditional hard-disk technology to record class-generated files and records. To see the impact that such a setup could have, consider that each CD-ROM's 550 megabytes equals about 250,000 typewritten pages of text. Audio CD players are available for a few hundred dollars that can handle six compact discs at a time, so similar players are likely evolve for CD-ROM. If so, each player could hold the equivalent of 1,500,000 pages of information, any word of which could be accessed within a few seconds. Now imagine that these disks contained the great works-Plato, Aristotle,

Lao Tzu, Shakespeare, the Bible, and so forth. A writer looking for a certain quote could find it quickly and could also browse through the surrounding material to see the context in which the quoted passage appeared. Reference material of this sort could be located in a central fileserver, where anyone who needed to see it could access it. **The Bad News**

The first piece of bad news (as any owner of a hard-disk drive already knows) is that no matter how much disk space you buy, it isn't enough. Parkinson's Law ("Expenditure rises to meet income") applies to disk storage as well as to anything else in life. I have a 20-megabyte drive on my computer that holds only "essential" stuff. Within a month of buying the drive, I had filled 13 megabytes of space, and I now am lucky if I have more than 2 megabytes free. If I went to a 40-megabyte drive, I'd

probably fill the disk in a month.

Disk failures on a network are generally catastrophic. Since the restoration of a 20-megabyte hard disk takes about an hour (assuming you remembered to make a back-up), a crash of the fileserver can essentially shut a school's computers down for the day.

A related issue: Who is going to maintain and control the network? Most schools haven't the resources to fund education properly, let alone fund equipment maintenance. You can't expect teachers to add "network czar" to their title without getting some release time to make sure everything is going properly. To get a glimpse of what can happen, talk to people who maintain an electronic bulletin board in their "spare time." It's not a pretty job!

The Complex News

Educators and administrators who think that a network will allow them to serve all their computers for the price of a single piece of software are in for a rude awakening. Software is usually sold like books—one copy per reader.

schools that buy one copy of a program and then make copies for distribution to many teachers. If the physical act of making a copy causes pangs of conscience in educators, this cue is absent once a program is installed on a fileserver. In principle, anyone connected to the fileserver has access to any program saved there. The opportunities for abuse are tremendous.

On the other hand, it is unfair for a vendor to base the price of its software on the total number of computers in a network if only a few of those computers use the program at any one time.

One solution to this dilemma is for software developers to establish a pricing policy that keeps track of multiple loadings. A program can be priced to run on any number of computers, from one on up to the network limit. For example, suppose a program comes with a fiveunit license. If all five copies of the program are in use and more users want the program, they will get a busy signal until someone else's copy is released. Multiple loadings are fairly easy to monitor, and a policy of this sort may work in the best interests of educators and developers alike. (For other approaches to multiple-use licensing, see "Teachers' Toolbox" and "Software Issues: Prices, Licensing, and Updates" elsewhere in this issue.)

My fear is that, unless we find some equitable way to meet the legitimate needs of schools and software developers, commercial software support for educational networks will be modest at best.

We should take the time now, while educational networks are still in their infancy, to resolve this issue in a way that will increase the power and capability of the computers in our classrooms.


If we meet these challenges fairly, we may never hear the grinding sound of an Apple II disk drive again!





Are you considering a network for your class or school? This issue of A + is packed with information about the network options from which you can choose. Whether you go with AppleTalk, Corvus, or one of the "other guys," you will

have to become familiar with the hardware, the network system software, and the management and installation of curriculum software on the file server.

Today, a lot of networkable software exists to meet most curricular-area needs as well as the productivity needs of teachers and administrators. The system software that comes with the network fileserver is a disk-management program that creates the medium for using software in the network. It lets registered users share programs, data files, hard-disk space, and printers—while they maintain private

directories or volumes of their own. Just how the registered users access and use network files is often up to the person handling the network-management software, usually a teacher or network administrator.

When you are making decisions regarding the purchase or installation of a network, take the time to look at *curriculum-management* software. This kind of software is much different than the systemmanagement software. In general, curriculum-management software is built around preexisting educa-

tional software programs and actually manages the delivery of lessons according to a sequence of learning objectives. This type of software also tracks student performance and performs record-keeping functions that are not available on networks running curriculum software solely within the system-management-software parameters.

You can't add just any networkable program to a curriculum-management system yourself. The addition of programs to the system is handled by the developer of the curriculum-management system. In most cases, you actually mail in your hard-disk drive for upgrades of the courseware. You can, however, install software programs on your network hard disk that do not work with the curriculum management.

er. You can install them yourself, and they work perfectly but independently of the managed software.

The three types of users in a curriculummanagement system are system managers, teachers, and students. Each group of users has a different area of access to the software. System managers and teachers have access to the curriculum-management options, but students do not. The management system organizes courseware into meaningful assignments: coordinates teachers, their classes, and corresponding assignments; enrolls students in classes and

tracks their progress; and, finally, organizes and prints detailed reports and summaries.

One-Stop Network Shopping

Those of you already familiar with networks may recognize the company names Computer Network Specialists (CNS) and Ideal Learning, Inc. Their software is fairly prevalent on installed Corvus networks. CNS and Ideal Learning provide a one-stop-shopping approach to LAN (local-area network) purchases for schools, in that they offer network hardware; system and curriculum-manage-



For those of you who are wondering what is available for Apple Computer's new network, both of these companies are working on AppleTalk products.

ClassWorks

CNS markets a curriculum-management package called Class-Works (formerly Master Curriculum Manager), a computer-aidedinstruction (CAI) software-management tool for Apple II networks. Currently, ClassWorks operates under DOS 3.3, which makes it practical for educational settings, since most Apple II educational software is DOS 3.3-based. ClassWorks manages curriculum packages from more than 20 different educational publishers, including Hartley, Milliken, Random House, DLM Teaching Resources, and Educational Activities. These K-12 software packages contain lessons that target specific math, reading, and language-arts skills. Speech output is available with the reading programs that contain a phonics component, but you'll need extra hardware, a Super-Talker from CNS.

ClassWorks is a flexible program with easy-to-follow documentation. Teachers and system managers can set and change default settings for individual students or for everyone using the system. For example, you can alter the sequence of lessons or adjust students' progress through the lessons according to your own mastery or review criteria. You can even set the system to a Pretest/Posttest mode that lets you perform diagnostics and evaluation.





The AppleTalk Network System works with a variety of cabling schemes. The most common one uses the LocalTalk cable and connectors Apple sells (see figure 1). In this article, I look at what's inside a LocalTalk connector and suggest alternative, money-saving cabling schemes you might want to use in your Apple II AppleTalk network. I'll also share my ideas on whether you should bypass AppleTalk altogether if all you need to do is communicate with a LaserWriter.

One of the ruder surprises that greets AppleTalk network users is that the LocalTalk cables for hooking up your Apple II to a Laser-Writer may cost as much as \$150. Yet this \$150 may be an unneeded expense for many people most of the time. In fact, you can connect a LaserWriter to AppleTalk by using nothing but three pieces of doorbell wire—at near-zero cost!

Two Myths Shattered

Here's a look at what's in Apple's magic cables and connectors, followed by five conventional and not-so-conventional alternatives to the stock LocalTalk cables and connectors. (A LocalTalk connector is a connection box with a short built-in cable that plugs into the computer.) But first I want to shatter two networking myths.

Myth #1 says that you must use the AppleTalk network to use a LaserWriter. This myth is totally, absolutely, and positively untrue. You can easily and rapidly communicate with a LaserWriter from any old serial port on any old personal Figure 1: A LocalTalk connector, showing the connection box and drop cable. computer at speeds up to 57,500 baud.

Myth #2 says that AppleTalk is faster than plain old 9600-baud serial communications. This myth falls by the wayside, though, assuming that you are using the current AppleTalk firmware with typical applications.

In theory, the AppleTalk baud rate is way up there at 230 kilobaud if you're using LocalTalk cable. Thus, you would somehow expect at least a 24:1 speed advantage over a 9600-baud serial connection. In

the real world, however, the AppleTalk firmware's handshaking and software overhead can sometimes gobble up this 24:1 speed advantage and then some. Thus, what really matters is the overall "click to clunk" time, not just the baud rate.

To prove this point, I took Meowwrr, a feline I'd designed with the Laser-Writer's PostScript page-description language, and printed him through LocalTalk and then through some serial ports. The results were surprising, to say

On a LaserWriter Plus with version 47 of Post-Script, the repeat copies of Meowwrrr took 90

the least (see figure 2).

Figure 2: Is **AppleTalk** any faster than the usual 9600baud serial communications? This PostScript file takes 90 seconds to print with AppleTalk, 70 seconds on a He at 9600 baud, 65 seconds on a IIGS at 9600 baud, and only 60 on a IIGS at 19,200 baud.

seconds to print under AppleTalk with LocalTalk cable. Compare this result with the times I got when I used a standard serial-interface cable: 70 seconds on a IIe at 9600 baud, 65 seconds on a IIGS at 9600 baud, and 60 seconds on a IIGS running at 19,200 baud.

If you go to very large files, particularly ones that involve Post-Script halftones or bit maps, then AppleTalk starts to show a modest NETWORK

speed advantage over 9600 baud.

Since today's AppleTalk often has no speed advantage whatsoever over standard serial communications, I certainly expect Apple to clean up its act sometime in the future and give us some faster networking code.

Today, though, far and away the fastest method for driving a LaserWriter is to use a IIGS at 57,500 baud, going out the game-paddle port by way of "bare metal" handcrafted machine-language code. I leave creating such a setup as an exercise for Apple II hardware hackers everywhere!

I don't mean to say you should never use AppleTalk. AppleTalk is well suited for networking over longer distances, where several different hosts and peripherals must share each other. You also need it to use an AppleShare file server. The usefulness of a LaserWriter diminishes dramatically if you cannot reach out and touch it from your workstation, though, and standard A-B serial switch boxes and serial communications can often be an inexpensive alternative to true networking.

So, your first and by far cheapest alternative to LocalTalk cables is simply to avoid using the Apple-Talk network in the first place.

Inside That Lump


Perhaps you really do need longdistance communication, with several hosts using a common printer and sharing a file server. In such a situation, AppleTalk is for you. Your goal now should be to minimize your cabling costs.

By now, you've probably seen that ominous-looking lump in the stock LocalTalk connectors. What is in that lump? What makes it so special?

Figure 3 bares all. Inside the lump is a 50-cent transformer, a couple of resistors and capacitors, and some connectors and switches. And that's it.

The transformer is there for safetv and noise isolation. It also creates a "balanced" high-frequency signaling system that is immune to external noise. In order to avoid any cable reflections, the transformer switches in a 100-ohm resistor if only a single output cable is in use.

Your second method of reducing AppleTalk cable costs is to build up clones of the figure-3 circuit on your own. Chances are you can use a Hong Kong audio-interstage transformer instead of that fancy toroidal job in the figure. If you do get into any serious home-brew cabling, be sure to check out the good folks at Redmond Cable. They



Alternatively, you can save a little money by buying compatible cables and connectors from thirdparty sources such as AESP, Inc., or Monster Cable Products, Inc.

Using Twisted Pair

In the long run, the only economically acceptable cable I recommend for local-area networks is the extra twisted-pair lines the telephone company installed when it hooked up your telephone.

Fortunately, AppleTalk works quite nicely over unused telephone lines, making all of those expensive LocalTalk cables unnecessary in many situations. So, the third approach to AppleTalk cabling involves substituting your extra phone lines or using ordinary twisted-pair wire. This scheme is the one the A+ editorial staff uses, by the way.





Using a Null Modem

You may simply want to use AppleTalk to connect one printer to a close-in host. If the distance is very short and everything is plugged into the same grounded outlet strip, you can substitute a standard null-modem cable for the Local-Talk connectors.

This fourth cable solution appears in figure 4, which shows schematics for three null-modem

cables. One of these cables goes from a DB9 to a DB9 connector, one goes mini circular 8 to mini circular 8, and the final one is a DB9-to-mini-circular-8 adapter combined with a null-modem cable.

These cables are available from a variety of sources. Besides Redmond Cable, you might check out the Micro Computer Cable Compa-


ny. Null-modem cables can cost as little as \$5.50 in single quantities.

Once more, though: Do not use a null-modem cable as a LocalTalk substitute unless (1) only one computer and a single peripheral are in use and (2) both are always plugged into the same grounded outlet.

Cheater Cords




Figure 5: You can build this LocalTalk "cheater cord" at almost no cost. It lets you connect two, three, or more stations to the network. But all stations absolutely MUST be plugged into the same grounded AC outlet, and operation beyond a few feet is not recommended.

Figure 5 shows my final solution to the AppleTalk cable problem: an

Figure 4: You can use a null-modem cable if there are only two users on the line and if both are plugged into the same grounded AC outlet strip. This figure shows three variations.

el-cheapo home-brew doorbellwire substitute I use that fakes the cable and connectors for two, three, or more AppleTalk talkers and listeners. This "cheater cord" automatically adapts DB9 to mini circular 8 or vice versa.

As with a null modem, this method offers no safety isolation, so every talker and listener on the net must always be plugged into the same grounded outlet strip. I definitely would not try going

more than a few feet with such a setup, but it's certainly cheap and does work well when your localarea network is truly local.

TWO PASCALS

When the Apple IIGS first came out, you had to be an assembly-language jockey to write programs for it. Fortunately for those of us who want to program that machine in a higher-level language, several other programming options are now available, including two excellent versions of Pascal.

Pascal, a highly structured language designed to promote good programming habits, sees frequent use as an instructional language in an academic environment.

The two versions of Pascal for the Apple IIGS—Orca Pascal and TML Pascal—are both *compilers*. A compiler takes the program you have written in Pascal, known as *source code*, and converts it to the only real code the Apple IIGS understands, *machine language*. This

The Orca Pascal and TML Pascal compilers conversion takes place as part of the programming process and results in a long development process but a fast-running program.

(By contrast, Applesoft BASIC and Gs BASIC are both *interpreted* languages. The translation of the source code for these languages, which takes place when the program runs, results in a noticeably slower-running program.)

Editing Environment


TML Pascal comes in two versions. One runs under the shell of the Apple Programmer's Workshop (APW) and uses the editor and linker that come with that system. You must buy APW (available for \$100 from the Apple Programmers' and Developers' Association) or the Orca/M GS system to run this version of TML Pascal. Orca/M

is a programming environment that is almost the same as APW.

The other version of TML Pascal (known as TML Integrated) doesn't require APW and comes with a built-in editor; it functions as a full-fledged Apple IIGS desktopstyle application. You use the mouse to make selections from the menu and enter the program text into one of several windows that can be open on the desktop. The compiler and linker are built into this system and are invoked when you select them from a menu. This version of TML Pascal is nearly, but not quite, the same as the APW version. One difference is that the APW version lets you link other files such as assembly-language code segments to your programs.

Orca Pascal, as of this writing (January 1988), comes in a version that runs either under APW, Orca/ M GS, or by itself in an environment that is much like APW. Orca has also announced a desktop version, much like the TML integrated version. I was able to review a betatest version of this latter program while writing this article. You should carefully check any statements I make here about features of the desktop Orca Pascal against the actual released version of the program.

The APW shell, under which Orca Pascal and the APW version of TML Pascal run, is a powerful development environment. It is also complex. If you are an experienced programmer who needs substantial power, you should consid-

er the APW versions of Orca or TML Pascal. Otherwise you should consider the integrated or desktop versions. I will not be reviewing the operating environments for the APW versions of the programs because they are the same.

The table above lists the system commands common to the desktop versions of both programs; despite these similarities, the two systems have significant differences.


TML Pascal allows you to compile a new desk accessory (NDA) and test it without placing it in the desk-accessory folder and rebooting the system. This capability saves you much time when you're developing and testing an NDA. TML Pascal also allows you to rename a file, launch another program without returning to the Finder, and get information such as the source-file size and the amount of free memory in your IIGS. These features are absent in Orca Pascal.

Orca Pascal has its own unique features, too. It comes with a set of debugging commands that permit you to track down errors in your programs. You can step through the code; use break points; and examine variables, the stack, and memory. If you have a fairly large or complex program, this feature will prove invaluable. (A debugger is also available for use with APW.)

Orca Pascal also has commands for formatting your source code: shifting blocks of code left or right on the screen, changing from the Overstrike to the Insert mode, and setting tabs by means of a ruler.

Orca Pascal allows you to select between an ImageWriter and a character-oriented printer. If you select a character-oriented printer, you must also specify the line length and number of lines per page. By contrast, TML Pascal is designed to send its output only to an ImageWriter printer. It has no Page Setup command, and, when you choose the Print command, printing starts immediately.

The two different approaches to the printing function represent different philosophies about who is likely to use the desktop system. Orca can accommodate almost all

users, at the price of requiring some additional actions of everyone. TML, on the other hand, accommodates the more typical users of the system without needing much, if any, extra action.

These two approaches also appear in the type of material that each desktop system handles. The Orca desktop system is supposed to be fully compatible with any APW language and source-code file. You can edit source code and compile, link, and run the programs-all from the desktop system. The Orca desktop system functions as a replacement for the APW editor and shell. (Technically, though, the desktop environment is called from the shell, and when you quit from the system, you return to the APW shell.)

The TML system is designed for one purpose, developing programs for the Apple IIGS in Pascal. The Pascal compiler is built into the system, and it automatically handles the linking of files when you select the Compile command.

Command Differences

The two programs, though, differ in more than just their design. Both programs have most of the commands you would expect in a Pascal compiler, but each also has certain commands that the other lacks. The table above lists all of the Pascal commands that the two pro-

grams have in common.

Orca Pascal is a complete superset of the Pascal standard specified by the International Standards Organization (ISO). In fact, you can issue a command to the compiler to flag as an error any use of an extension to the ISO standard.

If you are writing programs that are to be completely portable from one operating environment to another, you may find this ISO-compatibility feature significant. Of course, adherence to the ISO standard prevents you from using any of the IIGS tools, including the desktop system of windows and menus.

The first figure on the next page lists the commands that are available only in Orca Pascal, and the second figure lists the commands that are available only in TML Pascal. These lists are subject to much change, since the two programs are undergoing substantial revision and are each likely to incorporate the more useful features of the other.

The missing commands (marked in the tables with an asterisk) are not, for the most part, that significant. Indeed, you can create most of them by simply writing your own procedure or function. When you need certain other commands (marked in the tables with an @). you can create them by using Apple IIGS toolbox calls, either individually or in conjunction with other Pascal commands.

Compiler Differences


The two compilers each take Pascal source code and turn it into object code. The object code is then linked into applications or desk accessories by the linker. In the TML desktop system, the linking occurs automatically. With the Orca desktop system, you can specify that the linking occur without further intervention if you issue the proper compiler directives and set the desktop system appropriately.

The version of TML Pascal for APW (version 1.5) whose release is expected by the time this article is printed will have the ability to generate 65816 assembly-language source code as well as object code. Thus, if you are proficient in 65816 assembly language, you will be able to fine-tune some of the code the compiler generates.

The Orca compiler is an optimizing compiler; that is, it creates object code that functions in the most efficient manner. Optimization, though, takes time. Fortunately, you can tell the Orca compiler to postpone optimization during the development phase, waiting until you have the program working the way you want before you perform the optimization.

Other Features

The Orca Pascal disk comes with a samples disk that contains a working desktop program, an Othello game, several graphics programs, some text programs, and desk accessories. The samples disk



also contains the source code for the Pascal run-time library and for the toolbox interface files, as well as macros for use in the passing of parameters to assembly-language subroutines.

The TML program comes with several sample files on disk that demonstrate the various aspects of programming the IIGS, including graphics, desktop environment, text, and desk accessories. In addition, you can buy the TML Source Code Library, which contains examples of using nearly all the IIGS tool sets. TML Systems is currently considering packaging much of the Source Code Library material in a tutorial disk that will come with the main program.

The TML Speech Toolkit enables you to use synthesized sound in your Pascal program. The disk contains three new tool sets (male voice, female voice, and text-tophonetics parser), an interface file for use when calling the speech tools from your program, and several example programs showing the use of the speech tools. The speech the tools produce sounds synthesized and is thus significantly lower in quality than digitized speech. It also takes up significantly less memory space and is more versatile than digitized speech. The

speech tool sets were developed by First Byte, Inc., of Long Beach, California, developer of the Smooth-Talker program for the IIGS. If you intend to distribute software using the speech tool sets, you must get a license from First Byte.

Determining which of these four Pascal compilers is the best one and deciding which one to buy is not an easy matter. There is no clear-cut choice unless you need a compiler that is fully ISO-compatible, in which case you need one of the the Orca Pascal compilers.

If you will be programming in a combination of assembly language and Pascal, vou should consider either of the Orca Pascals or the APW version of TML Pascal. The desktop version of TML Pascal cannot handle that combination. On the other hand, if you are relatively new to programming and do not wish to contend with extra complexity and power, you should consider the desktop version of TML Pascal, the simplest to use of the four programs. The desktop version of Orca is a bit more complex, and the APW versions of both programs are the most sophisticated.

Cost is another consideration. The least expensive products that work by themselves are the desktop version of TML Pascal (\$125) and the APW version of Orca Pascal (\$125). As stand-alone products, each of these Pascals gives you a development environment and a Pascal compiler. It costs extra to get an assembler (\$100) for working with assembly language with Orca Pascal; you can't work in assembly language with the desktop TML Pascal. The cost of a combined assembly-language and Pascal environment is the same with either of the APW versions of the two products. The desktop version of Orca Pascal costs the most (\$150).

Fortunately the programs are all very good. In this case, you are unlikely to make a bad choice. You should carefully consider your needs and compare them against the features of each of the compilers. Then base your choice on a balance of which features of which program you need most.







Faster than a speeding disk drive

Now you can boot your Apple IIGS faster than a speeding hard-disk drive and be looking at the Finder in 20 seconds instead of 96 (or have AppleWorks ready to use in less than 10 seconds). This feat is possible with Checkmate Technology's MemorySaver board, which can best be thought of as an independently powered expansion bus for the memory-expansion slot on the Apple IIGS.

You can attach your existing memory card, plus another one from a different manufacturer, to the MemorySaver board (see figure 1 for a list of compatible RAM cards) and partition all or a portion of the RAM as a battery-backed-up RAM disk called /ROM. Once you've installed the /ROM volume, the information on it remains in place when the power is off.

All-in-One Package

The MemorySaver system comprises a MemorySaver board, wall transformer, battery holder for six rechargeable batteries, power connector, configuration software, program selector, and manual. Installation is simple and straightforward. Plug your memory card(s) into the MemorySaver, one on the front and the other on the back, and plug the MemorySaver into

the memory-expansion slot. (For certain cards, you may need the MemorySaver slot-extender option for an additional \$39.95.) Put the battery holder under the power supply, install the insulating paper between the case and the memory card, hook up the power connections, and you are finished. A word of caution: *Do not* forget to install the piece of insulating paper between the side of the GS case and

your memory card. If you don't install it, severe damage to your GS could result.

/ROM Size




Figure 2: Screen shot showing what files to load from the system disk onto the ROM-disk volume so you can use the Finder as your program selector

To set up your ROM disk, run the MemorySaver program that comes with the system. You can make the /ROM volume any size, up to the maximum GS memory limit of eight megabytes or

the amount of RAM available on your memory card(s). To determine the amount of memory to dedicate for the /ROM volume, you need to decide what files you want to

have available at startup. If you use a program selector such as MouseFiler or ProSel, you will want ProDOS and your selector program. If you want to use the Finder, you will need the files in figure 2. This configuration requires a 421K ROM disk, which leaves 859K for program execution on a machine with a one-megabyte memory card. This amount of free memory is more than adequate for all the current ProDOS 8 and ProDOS 16 system programs.

Once you've selected the size of /ROM, you select Install at the menu prompt. Your ROM disk will be ready to use as soon as you re-

boot. After you have restarted your GS, you can load the files you want into /ROM, use the Control Panel to set the startup slot to ROM Disk, and turn your machine off and on again to boot from /ROM. Once you've installed the ROM disk and loaded the files you want, the ROM disk operates like any other disk drive on your system, only faster. If you configure it as your boot drive, some interesting things happen. The system maps /ROM into slot 5, drive 1, and shoves any other 3.5-inch drives down the line (see figure 3).

Memory Management

All the IIGS memory is allocated by the Memory Manager tool set. The MemorySaver software partitions the available RAM on the expansion card(s) by telling the Memory Manager which banks of memory are in use, thus preventing the overwriting of information on the ROM disk. With two memory-expansion cards installed, the MemorySaver divides the memory on each card into two four-megabyte segments. It then determines the actual amount of memory installed on each card, maps that amount into the lower half of each four-megabyte bank, and informs the Memory Manager that the balance is in use, even though it is not

The manual gives a good explanation of how a ROM disk works and what precautions you should take during installation. Its photos and diagrams help with installation. The manual also contains a



BASIC program in figure 4. This program allows her to boot her games without going into the Control Panel to reset the startup slot and also lets me bypass the Finder. The memory overhead for ProDOS 8, Basic.System, and the BASIC program called Startup is 27K. I gave the system-disk application named ProDOS a new name, GO.16, so it would not conflict with ProDOS 8. Hopefully Apple will allow direct booting of slot-6 drives in a future release of the

I called Checkmate's toll-free number, got right through to a technician, and asked him several questions. The technician's answers were clear and to the point. I told him that my battery cable had come loose from the mounting plate. He said that the company had corrected that problem and that he would send a replacement. Five days later, I received it and sent the old one back.

Should You Buy One?

The MemorySaver is ideal for those who don't like wasting time while booting the GS. The alternative is to set up a big RAM disk and never

turn off your GS; in such a situation, however, you would lose everything in the event of a power failure and would be restricted to using one memory-expansion card only. The adaptability of the MemorySaver makes it a more attractive alternative.

The following suggestions should help you use your MemorySaver board to its fullest advantage.

1. Use only rechargeable batteries.

2. Do not forget to install the insulating paper between the side of the IIGS case and the back of your memory card.

3. Use only "CAS before RAS" memory chips on your memory cards. The MemorySaver package includes a list of acceptable chips.

4. Checkmate does not recommend the use of a RAM disk while a ROM disk is active. You can have conflicts between the memory dedicated to the ROM disk and the memory for the RAM disk. I have run into such a problem only when copying large amounts of data to the RAM disk. Small amounts, 5 to 10K, seem to work all right. The worst experiences I've had while copying large files were getting an I/O Error message and having files not copy onto the ROM disk.

5. When you're using two memory boards, dedicate all the memory on one board to serving as the ROM disk and leave the memory on the other card available for program

6. Be sure that you plug the wall transformer into a nonswitched wall outlet to prevent the loss of the ROM disk.

7. If you have a card in slot 7, be sure to get the MemorySaver Extender to prevent the memory card attached to the front side of the MemorySaver board from touching the card in slot 7.

8. You cannot use memory boards that use different-size chips. For example, if the back card uses 256K chips, the front card must also use 256K chips, rather than one-mega-

byte chips.

9. Fonts and desk accessories can

take up a lot of disk space.

10. To increase the speed of launching applications from the Finder, turn off the Save Finder Information Onto Disk option on the Preferences menu.



APPLEWORKS EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES MAKE THE GRADE

AppleWorks isn't just for homes and small businesses. It also is one of the best choices for schools in achieving computer literacy and classroom integration and serving as a teaching/administrative tool. In fact, the number of support products for educational applications of AppleWorks has recently exploded.

You, as a teacher, librarian, or administrator can surround yourself with a host of useful resources designed to help you get more mileage out of AppleWorks.

RESOURCE BOOKS

Books about AppleWorks for educators range from introductory to advanced and cover educators' as well as students' needs.

AppleWorks for Educators: A Beginner's Workbook

This manual by Linda Rathje is useful for conducting AppleWorks in-service workshops. Rathje has taken lessons she's developed over the years and combined them with relevant reprints from *The Computing Teacher*. The materials come with a data disk and, although they

are not comprehensive, offer a good start for teachers. (\$18; shipping, \$2.50; billing, \$2.50)

This well-organized and -conceived book/disk combination by Patti D. Nogales and Carol H. (The macros require you to have one of these programs and-with UltraMacros-AppleWorks version 2.0 as well.) The 33-page IEPWorks manual guides you through the intricacies of the system. FactWorks is a four-volume series of resource files. The files are more like almanac listings than providers of the in-depth "encyclopedia power" that their maker advertises. Topics include science, grammar, sports, geography, and history. (\$32.95 per volume)

HelpWorks

This 340-page resource is the most comprehensive tutorial/teaching aid I've seen, with 120+sample files and templates. The three-ring binder contains sections on all three AppleWorks components, in addition to disk management, spreadsheet design, and integration within AppleWorks. 

18 prescriptions for a healthy ImageWriter


Preventive Printer Maintenance

hat is your ImageWriter worth to you? This popular printer will last essentially the life of your Apple, provided you take reasonable care of it. Since it costs around \$500, you can ill afford to treat it badly.

An ink buildup on the print head can produce smeared characters, and it may contribute to jamming of the print-head pins (about a \$100 repair job). The foil print shield can tear and scratch the platen, which can require a \$75 repair job. Also, a ribbon that is wound too tightly can cause the drive mechanisms in the ribbon-frame assembly to break, adding another \$20 replacement bill. Unless you can replace a platen or circuit board yourself, you have to consider the labor charges that quickly accrue.

This article presents 18 simple ways to assure you will get optimal use of your printer while avoiding repairs. But first, make sure your ImageWriter and Apple are positioned on a firm table or desk, close to a wall socket, in a secure area.

cuits. The cables use a metal wraparound shield to reduce the effects of radio-frequency interference, but on days of thunderstorm activity or power disturbances, don't give your printer the \$500 test. Although most protectors cannot overcome a major power surge, they help moderate the minor fluxes, so they are worth having.

3. Ban food and drinks in the work area.

You've heard it a million times before, but the number 1 taboo for the Apple office is setting your coffee and morning Danish beside your keyboard or printer. If by the slightest chance a few drops of coffee or crumbs of jelly doughnut fell inside, they could cause a short circuit (along with some rather high repair bills).

4. Keep the work area dusted and the printer covered.

No matter how neat a work area may be, dust always seems to accumulate. Dust particles are everywhere, but covering the printer (and computer) during long periods of disuse reduces the exposure of your equipment. Dust the work area about once a week.



Dust covers vary widely in materials and price, from tailor-made leather with gold trim to an ordinary bed sheet.

5. Watch the paper flow.

When using track-fed paper, avoid letting the output pile on top of the printer. To avoid jamming, don't cram a large quantity of paper under the printer intake. Printer stands work nicely, or try keeping the box of paper on the floor and allowing the printed output to flow off the table into a stack.

6. Use paper of the proper weight.

Avoid using paper that is less than 16 pounds (unless you add a couple sheets), because the impact of the print-head pins can damage the platen. Using paper a little heavier than 24 pounds presents no problem, as long as you adjust the thickness gauge accordingly.

7. Use a good ribbon.

As the ribbon wears, further impact by the print head may cause the fibers of the cloth to unravel and jam the head. Using a re-inked ribbon is fine, but the greater the usage, the greater the chances of its becoming frayed.

8. Properly align the paper, envelopes, and labels.



The ImageWriter can handle a wide variety of materials, but if you don't correctly position them in the paper feed, they can get jammed. For multiple forms, envelopes, and labels, adjust the thickness gauge to assure enough space for the print head to move back and forth properly.

You can usually force out selfstick labels that get caught, by feeding in several sheets of paper (turn the platen knob by hand).

9. Run the printer self-test, and don't change the DIP switches.

The self-test shows the printer output, which should be crystal clear and readable. If not, check the ribbon for wear and proper alignment before contacting your Apple

The DIP switches come preset, so unless you have a particular need, don't change them (or first consult your dealer).

10. Place a foam pad under the printer.

If you place a ½-inch foam pad under the printer, it becomes much quieter and experiences less vibration of its semifragile inside.

11. Periodically dust the inside of the printer.

With all of its moving parts, a printer is more susceptible to dust damage than a computer is. Use a slightly moistened soft rag with water or alcohol to remove the bits of paper and dust that accumulate inside, at least once a month. A can of compressed air (available at most camera shops for about \$5) also works nicely.

The carrier rod should also remain free of dust, and a drop or two of a light high-quality oil helps keep the rod lubricated.


12. Regularly clean the outside.

Damp-rag the outside of the printer to remove dust as often as once a week. Clean any stains on the printer by using a mild liquid dish soap—never use cleansers or solvents.

13. Clean the print head.

Periodically, you should clean the print head to remove ink buildups, which also reduces the chances of jamming. Cleaning ribbons are available that remove ink residue; they're especially handy when you're swapping color ribbons, to prevent darker ink from getting onto the cloth of lightercolored ribbons.

You can remove the print head by carefully bending back the pointed white tab and pulling up. Be patient—it's a snug fit. Once you've removed it, use alcohol on a cloth and lightly rub it over the pins until the red square appears. Take great care when replacing the print head, so as not to bend the metal tabs.



Aside from using a cleaning ribbon or removing the print head, using a little alcohol on a thin rag can also remove remnant ink. Just dampen the edge of the cloth and pass it back and forth in front of the print head.

14. Clean the paper guide and print shield.

Ink can also accumulate on the paper guide, which can cause smudge marks. Just unscrew the guide, take an alcohol-dampened cotton swab, and lightly brush the inside. If you remove the print head first, you can completely free the plastic guide.

The foil print shield may lose its stick and can get caught on the paper, resulting in a severely scratched platen. If it starts to come loose, remove it.


15. Keep the platen clean.

You can clean the platen with a cloth dampened with alcohol, which helps remove any ink stains and dirt. Don't print directly on the platen, or you'll get an uneven print surface.

16. Inspect and clean the ribbon-frame assembly.

Regularly inspect and clean the ribbon-frame assembly, which holds the cartridge in place—bits of paper and dust gather there also. When you turn on the printer, watch the centering of the ribbon, since the assembly can get out of alignment. Just notify your dealer if it needs adjusting.

The drive mechanisms on the frame assembly can break if you are using a tightly wound ribbon (often caused by too much cloth inside the cartridge). Simply pull some out, cut off the excess cloth, and rejoin the ends with a couple drops of super glue (or just throw away that cartridge).



17. Pack the printer when moving it.

If you're moving your printer beyond the confines of your home or office, then carefully pack it in the original box and place the styrofoam pads around it. Also insert the carrier-rod tubes to prevent the print head from moving during transport. If neither the original box nor the carrier-rod tubes are available, place socks or soft cloth inside to prevent the print head from moving and wrap the printer with a blanket before placing it in-

side a sturdy box. Also place the printer inside a plastic bag (such as a trash bag) and tape the box (especially for long journeys).

18. Consider buying Apple Care.

If your printer and computer are a key part of your livelihood, or if you would rather not risk the expenses of possible repairs, then get a service contract from your Apple dealer. Apple Care for the Image-Writer—an insurance policy against any wear, defects, or problems that may arise—costs about \$5 a month.

Don't Forget the TLC

The ImageWriter is too expensive to let simple disregard ruin it. It was designed to last for years without lubrication or servicing, and it can provide an almost endless supply of high-quality output from your Apple.

The Graphics Studio and its eccentric user interface

ometimes a program's release follows such a blast of prerelease gossip, "beta leaks," and hullabaloo that you can't help but know it's there. DeluxePaint II for the IIGS was such a program. And then sometimes a program appears out of nowhere-Accolade's The Graphics Studio, another paint program for the Apple IIGS, is an example.

IIGS owners already have a paint program-Paintworks Plus, 816/ Paint, or DeluxePaint II-they would have to have a pretty good reason to switch to The Graphics Studio.

We can think of a couple of good reasons for switching to a new program: It's either so easy to use that it puts the competition to shame, or it's got so many features that you can't do without it.

Of the competition in the GS paint category, DeluxePaint II dominates on the feature count, and Paintworks Plus wins on the easeof-use count. So what about this new kid on the block? Let's start with ease of use.

The part of a coupter program that you work with is called the user interface. Does it have a command-line prompt, or do you select commands from a menu? Does the whole screen scroll or only part of it? Which keys do you press to accomplish a function? These issues, and many others, are user-interface questions.

The real controversy over the


user interface started with the Macintosh. The early Apple software for the Mac (the Finder, MacPaint, MacWrite, MacDraw, and so on) set the standard: mouse, windows, pull-down menus, icons, and so on. An important factor in rating Mac software is now whether or not it "follows the interface," because a consistent interface is so important to Mac users.

a desktop interface on the Apple IIGS. Programs such as MultiScribe, Paintworks Plus, and Draw Plusand, indeed, most of the newer productivity software-have embraced this interface. The desktop interface has proven easy to use, and standardizing it has a distinct advantage: Once you've learned how to use one piece of software, learning to use another one is

much easier.

Besides the "look and feel" Apple itself has fostered, there's another kind of standard interface: The popularity of a certain product in the market can make that product's features a de facto standard. In this case, the program that many others have imitated is MacPaint, which has inspired the

Since most Apple PROGRAM MARCHES TO OWN DRUMMER



The success of the Macintosh led Apple to create a Human Interface Group to codify and refine the components of the "desktop interface," and the increased power of the Apple IIGS led to adoption of the desktop interface as the standard for graphics programs on the Apple II. Programmers finally got the system software to easily create

icons, patterns, and general screen layout of both Macintosh and GS paint products.

Therefore, we come to an Apple IIGS paint program with a certain set of expectations. We expect tool palettes with icons for brushes as well as line and polygon tools, a marquee (or edit box), a lasso, a spray can, a paint bucket (for fills),

a hand (for scrolling), a magnifying glass (for zoom editing), and a text tool. We expect a color/pattern palette. We expect a standard menu bar at the top of the screen. We know the menu and the tool and color palettes will obscure part of our drawing so that we have to scroll to paint on the full page.

Of the IIGS paint programs on the market, Paintworks Plus wins the interface test hands down. If you know the interface, it takes ten minutes at best to become comfort-

able with Paintworks Plus. 816/ Paint and DeluxePaint II add their own twists to the interface.

The question is whether the user interface should become a criterion for judging software. More definitively stated: Should a program be subject to criticism because it doesn't follow the Apple desktop interface? What if some programmers feel they can do it better? Interface

The Graphics Studio deviates from the desktop-interface guidelines in several ways, although on cursory examination it looks as though it adheres to them. There is a menu bar at the top of the screen, but it disappears when you are not near the top of the screen. When you are painting or selecting from the tool options, it shows the current tool or function. (You can turn this feature off so that the normal menus show all the time.)

When you access a pull-down menu and click on your selection, the menu does not go away; it stays there. Accolade claims that a "staydown" menu lets you make multiple selections from the same menu without having to pull it down more than once. We agree, but the Apple guidelines say that multiple choices such as these should be available in dialog boxes, not

On the subject of dialog boxes, The Graphics Studio's dialog boxes are clearly hand-honed. Instead of using the standard file-dialog box boxes for Save and Load, the programmers obviously did their own thing rather than depend on Apple's tools. We really don't care how they created their dialog boxes, but the boxes should act the same as those created with the GS tool sets. They don't. When you are typing a filename, you cannot use the arrow keys to edit the name, and your pointer disappears, rendering the mouse useless. We can manage without editing, but how do you cancel the operation without a pointer? Answer: Use the Delete key to erase all that you may have typed; then press Return. Your pointer will reappear. Isn't Apple's way easier? Just move the pointer to the Cancel button and press the mouse button.

Instead of placing all the tools on the screen as other programs do, The Graphics Studio uses "popup" menus. When you select the rectangle tool, for example, and hold down the mouse button, a new menu unfolds with six more options, such as filled rectangle and rounded rectangle. Ideally, this



approach should make the screen display less confusing, but we found it disorienting because we couldn't see all the tools and options. Furthermore, unlike the pull-down menus at the top of the screen, the pop-up menus for the tools don't remain on the screenthey disappear when you select a function. This disappearing act makes sense, since you can select only one tool at a time, but it does do a bit of damage to one of the prime rules of the Apple desktop interface: consistency.

Here's another bothersome quirk in this program: The copy/ edit functions in most paint programs require you to select the edit box and then choose Copy, Flip, Horizontal, Cut, and so on. Apple's interface guidelines require a noun before a verb: First you select an area, and then you decide what to do with it. In The Graphics Studio, you must decide what to do before you select an area, and each edit function requires a different tool.

The final blow of the Accolade interface is that it does not allow access to any desk accessories, classic or new. The apple menu at the far left of the menu bar contains only About . . ., and Control/openapple/Esc is locked out. OK, guys-we just got this great scrapbook from StyleWare, and we can't use it in The Graphics Studio. Score a minus 10 for the interface.

Tools and Functions

The Graphics Studio features a good collection of tools and functions, somewhere between Deluxe-Paint II's dazzling array and the basic set of Paintworks Plus. The program lacks 3-D effects, a lasso, gradient fills, and antialiasing (smoothing). The implementation of the existing tools is as eccentric as the interface.

In The Graphics Studio, your working icon is always a large, outlined cross hair (rather than a pencil, paint bucket, or spray can). The cross hair lets you position your tool, but it disappears as you're working. Thus, as you are painting, you don't see anything but the paint stroke, which makes it hard to pinpoint your location on the screen. All the competing IIGS paint programs use an inverse brush to let you see where your brush is while you are painting.

The Graphics Studio's Zoom

Our enthusiasm for The Graphics Studio's Zoom mode is mitigated by a paucity of tools.

mode, though, approaches greatness. The top half of your screen shows the actual-size image, and the bottom half shows the enlarged area. Instead of scrolling the zoomed area with the hand or

scroll bars, you look at a rectangle on the actual-size image that shows the zoomed-in area; to scroll you move the rectangle. Our enthusiasm for the Zoom mode is mitigated by a paucity of tools, however. Only a pencil and fill are available in the Zoom mode. You find the Zoom mode under the freehandtool icon—yet another example of a user interface designed by the Mad Hatter.

Color, or palette, editing is unique. The top half of the screen

shows your image, so you can see the effects of palette edits immediately. If you're not sure which color you used for a particular area, all you have to do is move the cursor up to your image and click on the color you want, and it will appear in the Edit box. In addition to the now traditional RGB slider controls, The Graphics Studio offers a color-editing box. Here, one value (red, green, or blue) is constant. The editing box contains a small square. As you move the square, the other two values change. For example, if you make red constant, moving the small square in the color-editing box changes the green and blue values. Just keep moving the square around, and you'll get 256 different colors from which to

The Graphics Studio offers color cycling along the lines of 816/ Paint; that is, it cycles through different palettes rather than within a single palette as does DeluxePaint II. The implementation of the color-cycling edit box is confusing. In 816/Paint you can see all the available palettes, but in The Graphics Studio you can see only one palette

at a time. You must use a scroll bar to move through the different palettes and use buttons to add palettes to and subtract them from the


Preferred Patterns

The Graphics Studio's pattern editing is more to our liking. You can make any area of the screen a pattern. A pattern editor allows you to fine-tune the pattern, create an entirely new one, swap a pattern (only 6 patterns are available in the pattern palette, but the program keeps tabs on 18 of them), or load one from a picture or a pattern file. You can also save your patterns

We could go on; every tool has its idiosyncrasies. All in all, we give the tool selection an 8 out of 10, but the implementation of these tools drops the score considerably, and such tools in an eccentric environment make a program hard to use. Hold off on this one until Accolade cleans up its act.

HELLCATS OF THE PACIFIC

The Grumman Hellcat was one of the great fighter planes of the War in the Pacific. Between 1942 and 1945, 12,272 of these sturdy aircraft were built for the U.S. Navy, the Marines, and the British Royal Navy. Armed with six 50-caliber machine guns and as much as a ton of bombs, it was equally effective against enemy aircraft and ground targets.

Wings of Fury by Steve Waldo, an action/arcade game, recreates the challenge and excitement of piloting a Hellcat. It is no flight simulator—the joystick controls are quite

simple, the gauges and indicators are nothing like those of the real aircraft, and your airspace is a scrolling two-dimensional screen, with a small window that shows the view from your cockpit. The fast, colorful animation and special effects are up to the very high standards that Apple II gamers have come to expect from Brøderbund. Some of the tactics and elements of mission planning are realistic, but the designer has taken a few liberties with history. You can select bombs, rockets, or torpedoes before you take off. The Hellcat, however, never carried torpedoes; that was a job for slow, steady, and specialized bombers.


A good arcade game is quick to learn, visually intense, and full of new challenges as you improve your skill. Wings of Fury gets high marks on all three counts. In the first ten games I played, my score climbed from a pathetic 150 points to a respectable 925. You earn points for knocking out enemy targets. The game

has seven levels of difficulty, but until you get the knack of making carrier landings, you should stay at the beginners' rank ("midshipman"). As in real life, a carrier landing in Wings of Fury is one of the most difficult piloting skills. A little too high and you overshoot the deck. A little too low and you crash into the ship. Crash landings are superbly animated your plane skids across the deck, spins around, belches smoke, and then bursts into flames.

Air-to-air tactics are extremely challenging. The enemy planes are fast, maneuverable, and quite "intelligent." I haven't been able to line up a good shot against one yet, but I'm still trying, which is some indication of the staying power of this game.

You have three aircraft to complete a mission. The game is over when all three have crashed or been shot down. If you can manage a safe landing on your carrier, you can have your plane rearmed and refueled for another flight. You receive an additional plane every time you earn a promotion in rank.

The game handles the effects of altitude cleverly. At low altitude, you have a detailed view of a small area that scrolls past very swiftly. At high altitude, the view changes to a wide-angle field that moves more





slowly. At low altitude, your bombing and strafing are more accurate, but you are also more vulnerable to antiaircraft fire.

Although the sound effects are nothing special, the graphics deserve a color monitor. Your carrier rocks gently on the waves, its flag streaming in the wind. Your landing-signal officer waves a pair of little flags. When your tail hook hits the arresting wire, you see the wire reeling out, and when you taxi onto the deck elevator, you see your plane descend into the hangar deck. When you hit an enemy gun position, little animated figures run out, and you can get extra points for strafing them.

The game takes up both sides of a 51/4-inch disk. A self-running demonstration on side A gives prospective players a good idea of the action. A 16-page users' guide provides minimal instructions. A few more notes on tactics and a little more historical background would improve the documentation.

Nevertheless, Wings of Fury is an engaging entertainment for anyone interested in World War II aerial combat, and a remarkable example of what can be done with 128K on an Apple II.

wilderness pests. Rafts and climbing gear cost plenty.

So do magic spells, which you'll need to get past the castle guards—or to the bottom of the dungeon, with its ferocious collection of monsters: gnasher turtles, nerve streakers, and the awful Knuckles.

Why bother? Because the Compendium must be destroyed. You had it once, but some bandits stole it ("it was bound to happen," the game assures you). The Compendium contains the combined magic of many evil wizards, and only the "four jewels" can thwart it.

Your quest begins in the Galactic Museum. Return there often for gold, weapons, clues, and transportation to faraway places. If the curator is pleased with your progress, he'll raise you a level—but he's not easy to please.

The animation is remarkable, especially in the museum and the dungeon. The mazes are three-dimensional; passageways actually move closer or further away as you take each (resounding) footstep. Dungeon monsters loom and attack from all sides, sometimes in layers. Zap one of the monsters with a "kill flash" or try to rob one of the museum exhibits, and you'll be treated to extra fireworks.

In the wilderness, towns, and castle, the graphics become twodimensional, but movement, with arrow keys and multiple-choice commands, is still fast and realistic. When you get tired of bashing monsters, you can play one of the "action games": blackjack, flip-flop, or point-and-shoot practice at one of the training schools.

Legacy of the Ancients isn't a tricky game, just a hard one. It requires careful notes and patient strategy. The designers, Chuck and John Dougherty, have combined their specialties (psychology and computer science) to produce a mapmakers' paradise.

The copy-protected game comes on two double-sided 5¼-inch disks (you need a blank disk to save character information). Joysticks are optional, but a color monitor helps, especially in the wilderness (where, in monochrome, it's hard to tell mountains from swamp).

The game is part maze, part fantasy, and part pinball. You may be frustrated when your third attempt to storm the castle falls flat, but the changes in visual style and pace are wonderful compensation.

RULE, BRITÁNNIA!

Congratulations! You are the fortunate recipient of a ten-day, all-inclusive trip to London. What sights you'll see, what adventures you'll have! But your luck being what it is, you did not receive vour return ticket before you left. "Don't worry!" you were told back in the U.S. "Don't worry!" says the English travel agent who meets you in Victoria Station after you take the train from the airport to the British capital. Rather than giving you your bloody ticket immediately, however, the agent decides to play a game: If over the next few days you can discover the identity of a famous British person, then and only then will the agent hand over your return ticket.

Instead of summoning a bobby or contacting the American embassy, you go along with the plan. After all, this isn't real life—it's the premise of a fun but flawed travelsimulation/trivia-gamewith-graphics called Ticket to London.

Now this famous person you're supposed to identify can be a man or a woman, real or fictional, from the present or from the past. You have to solve the puzzle by gathering clues as you explore downtown London.

Here's one set of clues from a game I playedlet's see how you do with them. First clue: "She

was born in Switzerland in 1760.'

Do you know yet? Hang in there. I'll give you another clue in just a

Upon your leaving Victoria Station, the game displays a map of London's West End, highlighting 20 places of interest. Your first task is to find your hotel among four possibilities. You'll probably waste some time picking a wrong hotel or two-you don't get any help in figuring out which one has your reservation. ("Why?" I asked myself. Even in a game with a premise as absurd as this one, there's no reason for this needless hassle.)

Second clue: "She learned the trade from her uncle."

Among the places of interest on the map are many sites you've probably heard about: Buckingham Palace (where the Queen stays when she's in town), Covent Garden (where the opening scene of My Fair Lady takes place), and the British Museum.

You will also become familiar with some landmarks you may not already know of, such as Fortnum & Mason (a high-class store), Portobello Road (an open-air market), and the Tate Gallery (an art museum). You also must visit banks and money-changing locations where you can exchange your American greenbacks for British pounds, at the prevailing exchange rate of course-

it fluctuates daily.

Now here's your third clue: "She gave flowermodelling lessons to the sister of Louis XVI." Any ideas yet? I'm sure you've already ruled out both Margaret Thatcher and Princess Di.

As you travel about town, some of the people you encounter will quiz you on British trivia, four questions per encounter, in multiple-choice format. If you don't know the answer, you can attempt to pick the correct response by guessing, but if you don't get it after two tries, the questioner moves along to the next query without telling you which of the answers was right. I fault this part of the game the most. The game's rich database is designed to give you new information every time you play, but its presentation prevents you from learning much that you don't already know, despite the claim on the game's packaging.

Fourth clue: "She came to England in 1802."

Ticket to London is essentially a trivia game, and as with other trivia games, the more knowledge you possess before playing, the more successful you'll be. For example, one of the clues tells you to buy a ticket for "Henry Purcell's opera." Since Covent Garden is on the map and because the documentation tells you that Covent Garden is the place to see opera or ballet, you head in that direction. But once you get there, if you don't know that the name of Henry Purcell's opera is Dido and Aeneas, you won't get another identity clue.

Which brings us to the fifth and, for the time being, final clue (the game can give you up to ten): "She modelled heads of people during the Reign of Terror."

Aha! That one made it simple, right? Who else could it be but "Madame Tussaud," who made death masks of Louis XVI and Marie Antoinette immediately after they were beheaded and whose wax museum is one of London's most popular tourist attractions.

So if this sort of Anglophilic guessing game appeals to you, you might have fun with Ticket to London, but as much as I liked parts of it, I just don't think that its potential has been completely realized.

A personal note: Although the game makes no claim for its usefulness in such a situation, I played it many times just before my first trip to London to familiarize myself with the layout of the city and to get myself in a British frame of mind.

them scratching their heads when the program freezes up.

> DAVID L. VIDMAR Britt, MN

A. There is no simple PEEK you can perform to check the status of a printer. Since most printer-interface cards can now handle Apple's firmware protocol, however, you can solve your problem by calling a standard status subroutine. Doing so from Applesoft is a bit tricky, but you can do it by calling an assembly-language subroutine like the one in figure 1.

The low-order byte of the status subroutine is stored at location \$C110 in the peripheral-card ROM area (assuming a slot-1 printer). The high-order byte is always \$C1. To see if the printer is ready to accept output, call the subroutine by loading X with \$C1, Y with \$10, and A with 0. When the subroutine ends, the carry flag is clear if the printer is not ready. Before calling the status subroutine, initialize the printer by calling the standard firmware's initialization subroutine (see figure 1).

For more information on the standard firmware protocol, refer to Chapter 11 of my book Inside the Apple IIe (Prentice Hall Press, 1985).

CLOCK CARD NEEDS ProDOS UPDATE

Q. I have an Apple IIe and a ProDOScompatible clock card in slot 7. The clock worked flawlessly until January 1 of this year, when the year started coming up as 1982. Can you tell me what's going on?

> LARRY WARNEMUENDE MALI, WEST AFRICA

A. There's nothing wrong with your clock card. The clock driver in older versions of ProDOS is capable of properly handling dates for the years 1982 to 1987 only. The latest version of ProDOS, version 1.4, fixes this problem and gets you to 1988. Your solution, then, is to obtain the latest version of ProDOS from an Apple dealer and transfer it to all your boot disks.




